1. INTRODUCTION

1.1. General Description

a) DINÂMIA'CET-IUL's Scientific Identity

DINÂMIA'CET - IUL (D'C), Centre for Socioeconomic and Territorial Studies is an ISCTE-IUL interdisciplinary research unit in social and human sciences, which combines fundamental and applied research on relevant economic, social and cultural topics.

We perform advanced international and comparative research, framed by a sustainable development approach, while pledging to increase knowledge about dynamics and changes of Portuguese society.

We seek to contribute to the understanding of the contemporary world and to the design of the future through the analysis of contexts, actors and consequences of change, encompassing a particular focus on public policy and institutional frameworks, on an analytical and a normative level.

D'C-IUL mobilizes an array of theoretical and methodological resources guided by a common core issue. What is at stake is to capture the nature of the dynamics underlying socioeconomic and territorial change, their genesis in the inter-play between collective public and private actors operating in different domains (e.g. markets, territorial communities, public spaces), as well as their impact, notably in spatial terms (landscape, morphology, etc.).

Researchers at D'C-IUL pay particular attention to individual action (choices, expectations, creative insights, emotions, etc.) and to institutional endeavours stemming from states as well as sub-, inter- and supranational bodies to moderate, boost or restrain such action.

Research focused on the evaluation of the consequences of such institutional regulation is also based on a reflexive analysis of our own domain of activity - scientific research, its relationships with its context and the changes it goes through, in line with D'C-IUL 's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers.

b) Organization and activities

DINÂMIA'CET-IUL gathers researchers from a wide range of academic backgrounds (economics, sociology, law, architecture, regional and urban planning, anthropology, geography, management, quantitative methods, etc.). It is organized in three *research groups*:

- (i) **Innovation and Labour (IL);**
- (ii) **Cities and Territories (CT);**
- (iii) **Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC).**

Each of the research groups has specific research programmes, drawing upon medium-term thematic lines of analysis, which reflect their particular scientific identity. Information about the specific scientific identity of each of these groups, as well as about their main goals and achievements, can be found in part 3 of this report.

It seeks to drive its activities and to reinforce its consistency through cross-sectional integrating thematic lines (ITL) set to boost synergies between the three groups:

- (i) Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies
- (ii) Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies
- (iii) Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies

Activities taking place at D'C combine research with service provision to the community, and advanced training (masters and PhD programmes). The Centre is invested in the articulation between teaching and research, according to international higher education standards. It nurtures the transfer of scientific knowledge through seminars, conferences and publications. It also promotes internal debate and collegial co-operation in order to favour theoretical and methodological cross-fertilization between its different projects, and to foster collective learning and capacity for organizational adaptation and innovation. Its members share the belief that public universities should produce knowledge that may underpin the public debate, namely the debate about public policy design and implementation. D'C publishes an online journal, CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios, and a Working Paper series, both peer-reviewed. It also participates in publishing *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* and the journal *Passagens*, in collaboration with the Architecture PhD programme. These activities are supported by a close-knit network of partnerships with other national and international research units, public agencies and civil society players.

c) Additional information

DINÂMIA'CET-IUL is funded and evaluated by Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia (FCT), the Portuguese Research Council (classification: very good).

The Unit's technical staff comprises now four full-time members, as well as a Science and Technology Management Grantee, but this is clearly insufficient for the needs identified, particularly after the exit of the person responsible for financial project management in November 2017. For now, the 4 full-time members are: a R&D Project officer; a Directorate's assistant, also responsible for the support to the members and to the organization of meetings; a website and communication officer; and a S&T management officer supporting the journal publication, managing the data about D'C activities and the preparation of targeted initiatives to promote the dissemination of scientific production indicators. In November 2018, a Science and Technology Management Grantee joined the team to aid Project management.

The Unit is negotiating with ISCTE-IUL's central structure, for more than one year now, the possibility of upgrade its permanent technical human resources structure to six members, with the functional distribution exhibited in Figure 2, but it was not possible to reach an agreement yet.

1.2. General Objectives established in 2018

In D'C Action Plan for 2018, three complementary sets of objectives were established:

1. The main scientific objectives pursued by the Unit
2. The main mid-term operative goals that are linked to the Unit's strategic programme
3. Specific goals established for 2018

These objectives are presented in the three following subsections and the degree of their fulfillment is discussed in the next section (1.3).

1.2.1. Main scientific objectives pursued by the Unit

The research unit's scientific goals were those inherent to the mission and the collective scientific identity of its research programmes that are described in section 1.1.1. The scientific objectives pursued by each Research Group, which are specified along Thematic Lines, which correspond to mid-term research streamlines that can comprise several research programmes (materialized in different research projects, collective and individual), are presented in detail in part 3 of this report.

3.2. Reflexivity, Communication, and Social Responsibility of Science

The research priorities defined in most of these research lines in 2018 were in line with the specific cross cutting research goals which have been identified in the D'C Strategic Plan of Activities for 2018-2022:

- a) Understand the main dynamics governing the fundamental changes in sustainability transitions, in particular, in the urban development domain, spatial planning, cities' metabolism, forms of inhabiting, mobility and energetic efficiencies, the transition of the energy system (in particular, renewable energies) and of the food system.
- b) Understand the current changes in metropolitan spaces - in particular in the Lisbon case, challenged by intense recomposition, gentrification and touristification processes - and the social, economic, political, cultural and environmental dynamics behind these changes and the responses to them.
- c) Understand the drivers of job creation and job quality - at the levels of firms and of individuals - with a particular emphasis on the impact of digitalization, the changes of collective bargaining systems in Europe, how the EU countries address nowadays the issue of youth unemployment, and how different Vocational Education and Training systems can contribute to different patterns of unemployment, in order to better grasp inclusive and skill enhancing reforms.
- d) Understand how European citizens have been exercising their political and social rights in the wake of the economic crisis, and what kind of economic policies and regulative frameworks may mitigate the impact of the financialization process of the past decades, and may support an environmentally and socially sustainable development trajectory.
- e) Investigate to what extent risk regulation experiences in the environmental and related domains can provide critical backdrop for pondering the limitations as well as the opportunities of novel risk-based regulatory aiming at safeguarding intangible values such as privacy.
- f) Assess the prospects for new approaches, intertwining research, experimentation and practical implementation, mobilizing innovative multidisciplinary theoretical and methodological frameworks, and gathering researchers, policy makers, practitioners and civil society in university-industry-public administration-civil society collaborations.

- g) Take advantage, in the analysis of current societal dynamics, of the reflexive survey of the scientific domain itself, to which D'C, its members and the disciplines they practice, belong; by specific research, as well as by taking the ongoing academic activity as a field for participant observation, while enhancing the validity of this exercise's results by comparison with other domains (e.g. non-academic jobs, journalism, legal professions), and by international comparison.

1.2.2. Main mid-term operative goals linked to the Unit's strategic programme

These were a set of pragmatic objectives that are linked to the development of the research centre and its expected activity in this period (most of them in continuity of the goals from precedent years, and in line with the Strategic Plan of Activities for 2018-2022), which include:

- a) Increase in publications, particularly (but not exclusively) in indexed peer-reviewed journals and books with international dissemination;
- b) Growing dissemination of research results in academic events, both national and internationally;
- c) Reaching broader audiences and overall society, both by improving communication of research results to non-academic audiences and by the active involvement of stakeholders and civil society in the projects' communication design;
- d) Strengthening the relation between research and advanced training
- e) Development of research networks and improvement of the Unit's role as a platform for hosting visitors and supporting initiatives of internationalization;
- f) Consolidation of transversal work and collaborative practices which have been promoted in recent years in the unit, among researchers and between research groups, in particular by strengthening the organizational structure of the Integrating Thematic Lines,
- g) Improvement in the requirements for individual research development plans in the Unit and enhancement of its attractiveness to young high-potential researchers;

- h) Increase in research projects contracts, assuming the need to explore diversification of research funding opportunities, reducing the dependence on specific funding bodies (particularly FCT); and
- i) Consolidation and strengthening of the technical support staff working at the research unit, improving specialized professionalization and enhancing skills at the several domains required to a growing research unit (projects management, financial management, science & technology management, communication, edition, etc.).

1.2.3. Some more immediate and specific goals established for 2018

Finally, there was also a set of interim and short-term objectives which were set up in the last Action Plan to be put into practice during 2018, including:

- a) First measures of implementation of the strategic plan for 2018-2012, which has been the result of a strategic reflection process started in 2016 about the scientific identity of the Unit, including the putting into practice of mechanisms that enable permanent self-monitoring of the Unit's activity.
- b) The preparation and carrying out of the institutional assessment of the research unit under the ongoing FCT evaluation process.
- c) Negotiation with the central structure of ISCTE-IUL of funding conditions which enable D'C to get financial liquidity in the short-term, in particular to get access to own revenue generated by the growth of research projects managed by the research unit (without having to await the conclusion of those projects to be able to access their overheads) or any other mitigating solutions for this problem.
- d) Negotiation with the central structure of ISCTE-IUL of space conditions which enable D'C to supply workplaces for the new necessities generated by the new researchers and new projects of the research unit.
- e) Reinforcement of the technical structure of the research unit and their specialized skills, and refinement of the attributions and competences of each member of the Unit's technical support team.
- f) Development of a system for monitoring and assessing the research activity of full-time contract researchers
- g) Revision of internal functioning norms and D'C regulation, concerning the updating of membership statutes (including the categories of members and the respective attributions/responsibilities in light of new FCT requirements), as well as the RG coordinators attributions
- h) Preparation of the cleaning of the physical files of the Unit, with the selection of books and publications of old projects to be donated to the library of the ISCTE-IUL, and transition of the management of the computer park to the central services of the ISCTE-

IUL, as well as the improvement of the digital archive of the materials produced in the carrying out of the D'C research projects;

- i) Improvement of DINÂMIA'CET's information system, assuring a comprehensive, updated and pragmatic database with the scientific activities of all its members, which can be easily mobilized for monitoring the research unit's activity, with a versatility that enable more flexible analytical dimensions, but ensuring long-run comparabilities and homogeneous criteria.
- j) Preparation of a new D'C publishing/editing line (e-books), in parallel to the enhancement of the WP series and the development of further indexation of CCT Journal.
- k) Development of a monitoring system for the social impacts of the activity of the unit (Conceptual and empirical work will be pursued on this, including the implementation of routines and data systematization practices, which should allow to map, control and disseminate the social impacts of the activity of the Centre)
- l) Improvement of the monitoring system for the academic impacts of the activity of the unit and its researchers
- m) Dissemination and implementation of the ethical principles of DINÂMIA'CET-IUL, codified within the framework of the design of the Unit's strategic programme (point 13).

1.3. Main Achievements in 2018

1.3.1. General overview

A) Main features

Generally speaking, the main strengths and challenges revealed by D'C's activities in 2018, can be summarized as follows:

a) Main positive aspects and strengths:

- The efficiency and smoothness of the preparation and setting up of the process of external assessment of FCT (held in articulation with the conclusion of the strategic reflection process about the identity of the research unit), which resulted in the drawing of the Strategic Plan 2018-2022, the submission of the application for FCT's Research Unit's Evaluation process and the **preparation of the panel's visit** (postponed to 2019), including the **setting up of several collective preparatory meetings**, with significant advances in the discussion of the scientific identity of the research Unit and its contribution to society.
- This process was, again, the main task developed by the unit in 2018. As we already could write last year, it strengthened the coherence and scientific identity of the research unit, in times of considerable growth and change in its composition. It was conducted mainly by an Ad Hoc Task Force composed by the director and the two sub-directors of the unit, the members of the Scientific Commission, the coordinators of the three RG's, and in the face of the actual underrepresentation of these researchers in the formal organs of the unit, a group of five PhD researchers non ISCTE-IUL full-time teachers¹. This Task Force translated the results and the spirit of this collective reflection carried out throughout the year 2017 into the form provided by FCT for the evaluation of the Research Units, presenting the strategic plan for 2018-2022. The form was uploaded mid-February. After the submission of the application to FCT, several sessions were organized to promote the internal discussion of the articles attached to the strategic plan as main publications of D'C. This discussion paved the way to a substantial

justification of the topics of the three integrating thematic lines. This justification was later used for the presentation of D'C's activities to the evaluation panel (May 2019).

b) Growth of the unit in terms of team and staff

- During the year 2018, five researchers were hired within the framework of the so-called "Norma Transitória". Mafalda Pífano, initially hired for supporting the organization of the 2018 RCSL Conference Law and Citizenship beyond the States, joined the staff, to participate in the project management and to give administrative support to the new PhD programme (see next point). Other
- The offer of D'C was strengthened by the approval of two new training programmes:

Interdisciplinary PhD Programme in Political Economy, in partnership with CES at Coimbra University, CIES- IUL at ISCTE-IUL, CSG and UECE at ISEG-Lisbon University, to be launched in the academic year of 2019-2020. New Master Programme in Political Economy, to be launched in the academic year of 2020-2021.
- The journal *Cidades – Comunidades et Territórios* obtained its indexation in Scopus.

c) Main negative aspects and challenges:

- The **perpetuation of the fragile technical staff situation (with one person off throughout all year)** and the consequent **need for reorganization of the tasks performed by all the human resources** which are the support structure of the unit.

End of 2018, discussions were started with the central structure of ISCTE-IUL with a view to a possible reintegration of Fátima Santos in D'C staff. These discussions are still pending.

- **Extension of the financial asphyxiation of the unit, in particular due to the postponing of the evaluation process of the research units by FCT** (assuming a transitional funding value for 2018, set at the level of the preceding years – the lowest possible 75.000 euros) **and to the internal rules defined by the ISCTE-IUL for the financial management of projects** (in particular the retention of overheads until the final conclusion of projects, which continued, despite the changes in rectoral team).

In the face of this financial problem, D'C concentrated throughout the year 2018 all its energies on the design and defence of its strategic plan, within the framework of the FCT evaluation procedure, with the ambition to obtain an appropriate funding in the middle term future. This strategy proved to be successful: the results of the evaluation of D'C (received end of June 2019) led to a very substantial increase of the FCT funding.

- **Saturation of facilities and lack of workplaces for researchers**

With a view to a sustainable solution of this structural problem that ISCTE-IUL faces today concerning the capacity of its facilities, D'C representatives participated during the year 2018 to the process that led to the planning of a new building, designed to host the research activities of ISCTE-IUL, including new offices for researchers.

B) Accomplishment of the proposed objectives (established for 2018)

In a general overview, we can consider that in 2018 the Unit accomplished, in broad terms, the various commitments it had assumed regarding each of the previously introduced three layers of goals.

Summarized information on this is presented schematically in **Table 1**, in order to enhance the accountability of the accomplishment of those activities, for the three levels of objectives: (i) the accomplishment of scientific goals, (ii) the achievement of more pragmatic aspects, and (iii) the level of success on more direct short-term actions.

1.3.2. Main achievements by field of action

A) Research contracts

Eight new research contracts were assigned to DINÂMIA'CET-IUL, started in 2018:

On the other hand, three collective research contracts came to a close in 2018:

In terms of research contracts, 26 collective research projects were in course, 21 of which were funded:

- 10 by FCT
- 1 by H2020
- 1 by Interreg Atlantic Area
- 1 by Creative Europe (EU Programme)
- 3 by national public authorities (Câmara Municipal de Lisboa; Agência para o Desenvolvimento e Coesão; AGIF)
- 5 by other international institutions (Eurofound; P2020)
- 1 by other national private institutions (EAPN)

Funding programmes are consistently scarce and complex. D'C upholds its commitment to diversifying its pursuit for funding from various funding sources. A considerable number of submissions were made to several funding bodies during these years, some of them still awaiting a final decision:

- 1 proposal to FCT;
- 1 proposal to other national funding institutions (PT2020; AGIF; CML; Câmara Municipal de Oeiras)
- 3 to national private entities (Ordem dos Médicos Veterinários; Fundação Calouste Gulbenkian; Fundação Francisco Manuel dos Santos)
- 1 EC Programme (EACEA - Creative Europe - Support for European Cooperation Projects 2019 - EACEA/34/2018)
- 1 additional international proposal (Interreg Sudoe)

In 2018, there was no open call for tenders for projects in all scientific domains by FCT. There seems to be a certain increase in the market for applied studies stemming from public and institutional agents, compared to past scarcity of research contracts, mostly on a national level, both in terms of competitive science projects and applied research commissioned by public and private contractors. We hope this trend will hold and will encourage researchers to apply to the diverse kinds of funding mechanisms.

B) Publication outputs

Although the figures regarding outputs produced in 2018 show that there has been some decline, still a spill over effect of the funding restraints to research in the last few years, there are a number of positive signs of resilience and reconversion of key channels for scientific results diffusion. Main achievements at the **research** level in 2018 were:

1. A **consistent increase of indexed publication**, particularly articles in journals listed by Web of Science and SCOPUS, (see Table 3). This was most expressive in the CT RG, which caught up to RGs IL and GEC in this domain (see chart 1);
2. A recent upturn in the number of authored/edited **books, proceedings and journals**, namely international publishing.

Chart 1. Articles in journals indexed in Web of Science/ Scopus per RG (2016-2018)

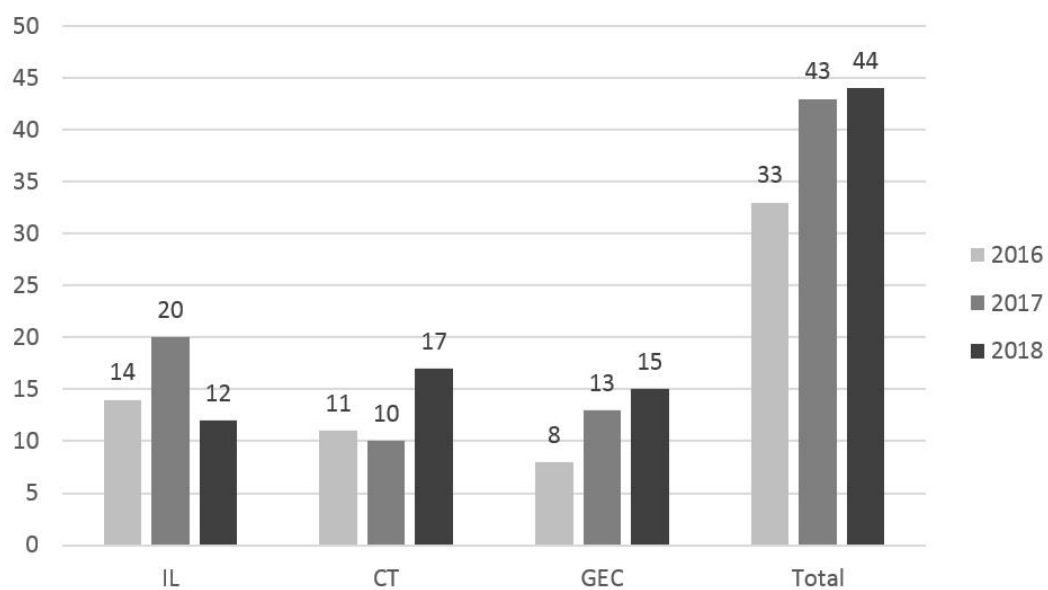


Chart 2. Books, proceedings and journals – author + editor (2016-2018)

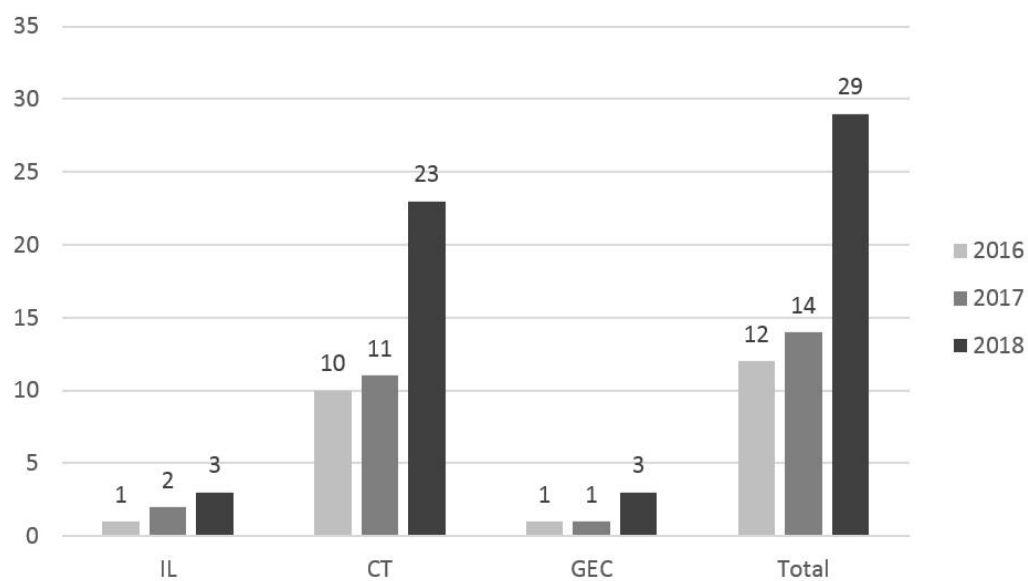

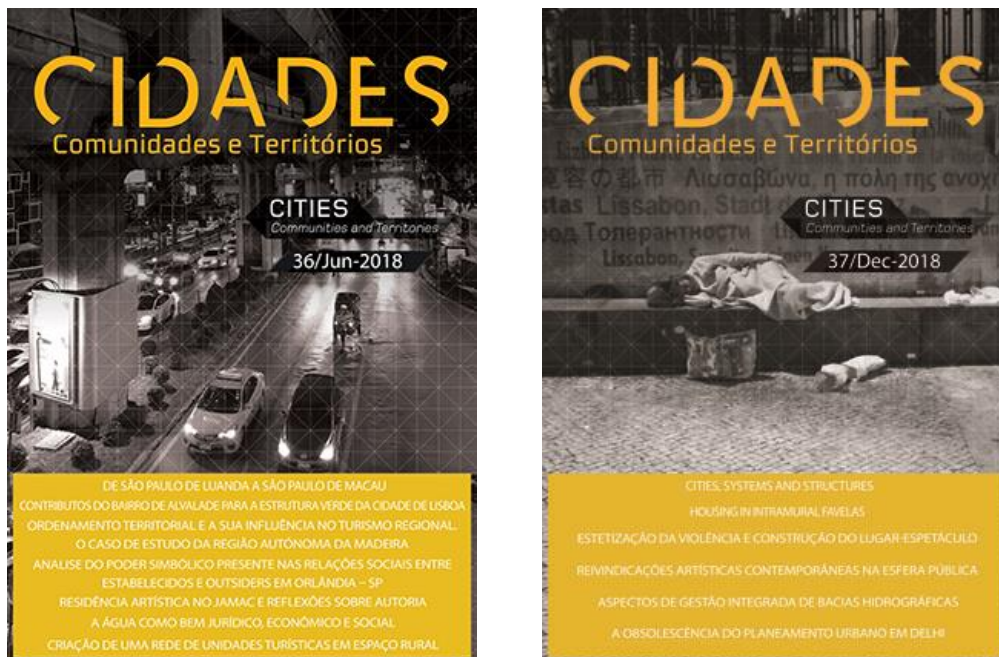

As far as citations are concerned, data retrieved in May 2018 from CIÊNCIA-IUL, regarding full researchers, show a consistent increase in cited materials both in Web of Science and Scopus. Again, overall publication is referred to more often in Scopus, especially that originating from research in the Governance, Economy and Citizenry RG. We remember that, among other factors, geographical focus and language of publication highly determine citation figures.

Following international and FCT guidelines, DINÂMIA'CET-IUL has been progressively increasing its presence in open access domains. *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios* has been freely available online for the past 6 years. All Working Papers are published on D'C website and a growing number of other research articles, conference proceedings, book chapters, reports and other materials are uploaded on to ISCTE-IUL Repository, which is integrated in RCAAP - Repositório Científico de Acesso Aberto de Portugal. Presently, around a fifth of all D'C publication is available in open access.



Charts 3 and 4 illustrate the growing scope of DINÂMIA'CET-IUL publications available through ISCTE-IUL Repository, in geographical and chronological terms. In 2018 there was a decrease in these figures, which may be due to a stabilization of data retrieval and/or dispersion of used platforms (e.g. CIÊNCIA-IUL). International audiences still account for almost two thirds of all downloaded material.

Chart 3. ISCTE-IUL Repository: D'C document downloads per year

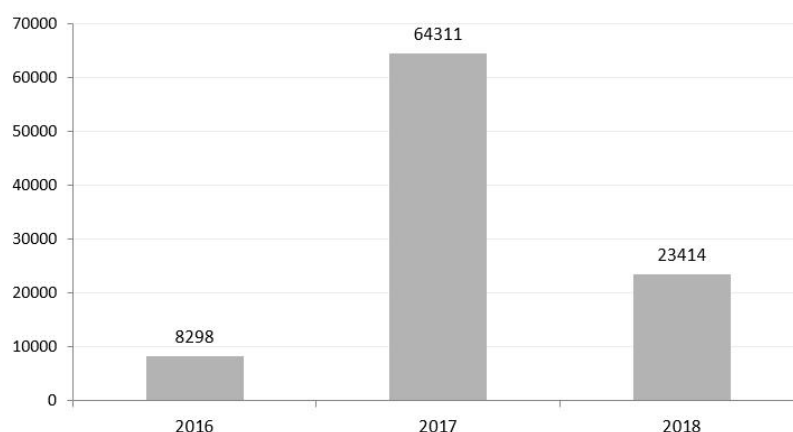
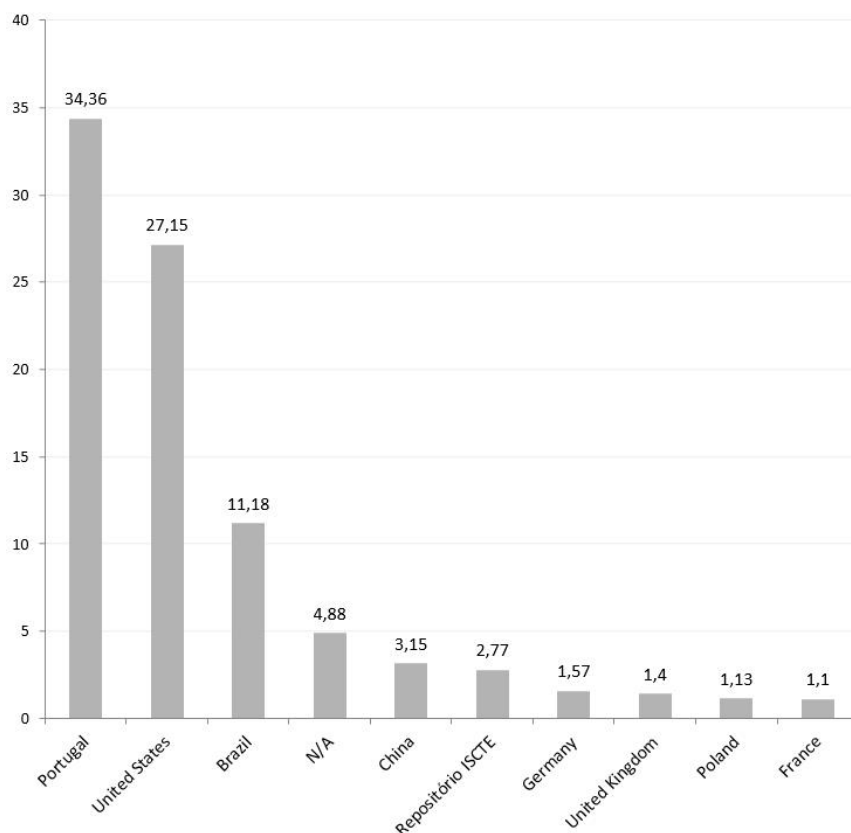


Chart 4. ISCTE-IUL Repository: D'C document downloads per country (Top 10) (%)

C) Other dissemination and outreach activities

In 2018, 230 papers were presented in academic conferences, both with national and international outreach. Several presentations were also made in the context of other seminars and broader discussion events.

Other dissemination and outreach activity in 2018 was the organization of events (62 in total).,

The organization of numerous events, 62 in total, including six international conferences with wide audiences: “Investimento Imobiliário Global em Londres”, “TICYUrb (Third International Conference of Young Urban Researchers)”, “KISMIF - Keep It Simple, Make It Fast! Gender, differences, identities and DIY cultures”, “Digital Survey in Religious Architecture”, “RCSL - SJD Lisbon Meeting 2018 - Law and Citizenship Beyond The States”, “Mulheres, Mundos do Trabalho e Cidadania - Diferentes Olhares, Outras Perspetivas”.





D’C continues to publish its Newsletter, which reached issue number 52 by end of 2018, being sent to 1842 Subscribers.

Academic research undertaken in DINÂMIA'CET-IUL has also been disseminated along the general public and the community through several media, particularly:

- Contracts and consultancies to public and private entities, which include constant interaction with society, namely through the active participation of stakeholders in research and continuous feedback knowledge-transfer dynamics between academia and society;
- Participation of researchers in events across the country organized by public and private institutions, including governmental agencies, local councils, business associations and trade unions;
- Workshops and seminars organized by DINÂMIA'CET-IUL, involving an audience of professionals from governmental agencies, academics, researchers and often also members of the general public;
- Articles published in newspapers and in technical publications, available to a wider audience.

DINÂMIA'CET-IUL was also involved and participated in the institution’s dissemination activities which ISCTE-IUL and the Ministry of Science developed in 2018, such as “Semana da Investigação ISCTE-IUL” (at ISCTE-IUL), or “European Researchers’ Night” (28 September). It was also actively involved in

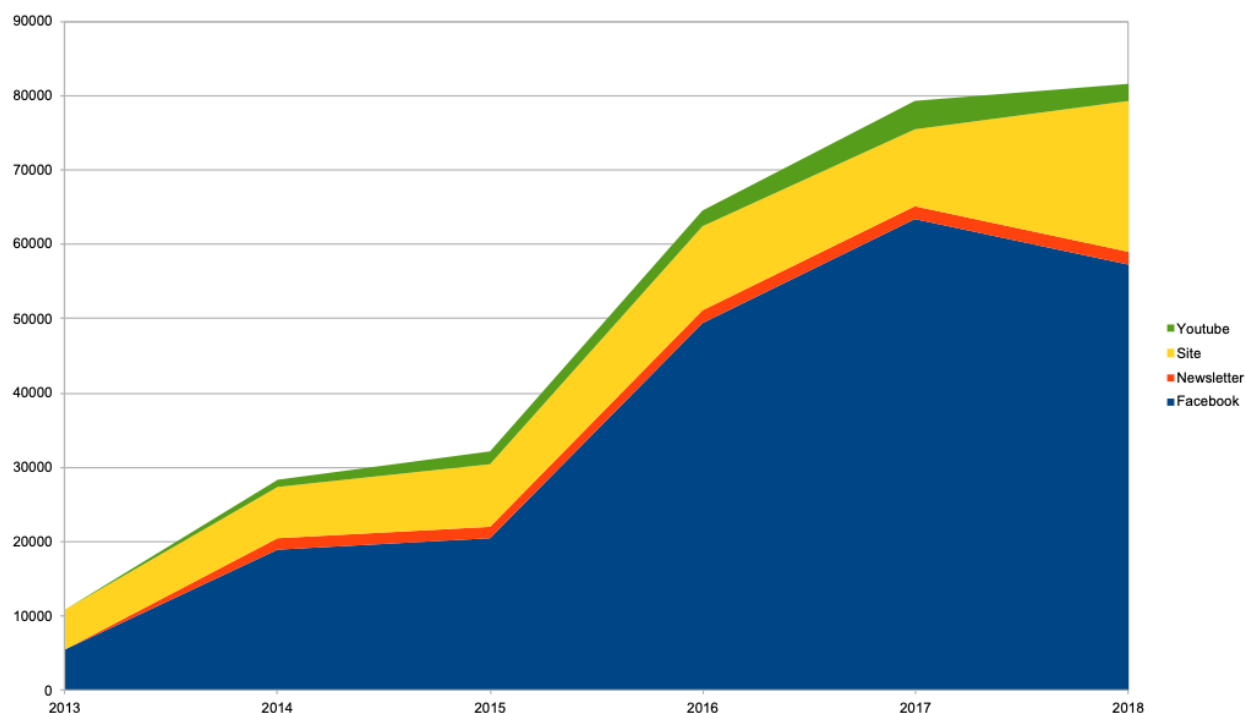

Since 2013, DINÂMIA'CET-IUL has assumed a deliberate role as a science communicator through Social Media platforms, taking advantage of these communication tools in order to promote academic activities and to disseminate the scientific production generated by the research team. This approach has increasingly produced positive results. The results are organic; no paid promotions were activated.

In 2013 the Research Unit posted 76 impressions on Facebook, reaching 72 people. In 2018 the number of posts amounted to 147 (a decrease of 36% compared with 2017), with an average audience of 389 (an increase of 40% compared with 2017) people per post. These numbers reveal a more efficient use of a reduced number of posts reaching a larger number of people. The new website shows an increase of the number of sessions (a growth of 27% comparing to 2017) as well of the number of pages views (a growth of 13% comparing to 2017).

- 8) Master in Social and Solidarity Economics (1 supervised by DC researchers concluded in 2018);
- 9) Master in Development Policies of Human Resources (9 supervised by Dc researchers concluded in 2018);
- 10) Master in Social Studies of Environment and Sustainability (1 supervised by DC researchers concluded in 2018);
- 11) Master in Development Studies (2 supervised by DC researchers concluded in 2018);
- 12) Master in Business Law (9 supervised by DC researchers concluded in 2018).

The concretization of the objective of creating a new PhD course devoted to an interdisciplinary study of contemporaneous economies and societies, addressed through an interdisciplinary PhD in Political Economy in collaboration with Lisbon University (ISEG) and Coimbra University (FEUC and CES), was achieved with the approval of the proposal in the beginning of 2018. The PhD course in Political Economy will be launched in 2019-2020.

Researchers of D'C are also directly involved in a few international advanced training programmes.

E) Network building, researcher hosting and internationalization

D'C continues to host researchers of various nationalities and academic degrees, who are part of our research team in the periods in which they are integrated in D'C. In 2018 D'C hosted the following researchers:

F) Networks and Partnerships

The Centre continues to conduct its activity with an open approach, developing many cooperative networks and partnerships with other institutions of foreign higher education institutions or associations, either through undergoing projects, or through the activities of its researchers. This relation, by a diversity of mechanisms, can be seen in detail in part 3, devoted to the RGs.

G) Integrative/multidisciplinary activities

As a multidisciplinary research centre, DINÂMIA'CET-IUL was founded on the explicit understanding that major current issues in social science can only be properly understood and studied through multidisciplinary approaches, carried out by research teams holding different skills and perspectives. Paradigmatic issues discussed in this way include local and regional development, labour market transformation, creation and diffusion of innovation, and globalization. The multidisciplinary nature of the Centre permeates throughout its activities.

First of all, researchers come from diverse academic backgrounds: Sociology, Economics, Architecture, Territorial and Urban Planning, Law, Anthropology, Geography, and Management Studies. As a consequence, many of the Centre's activities are unavoidably interdisciplinary, namely projects, conferences and other events.

Major international conferences organized by DINÂMIA'CET-IUL typically involve more than one discipline. Additionally, informal networking and discussion at the Centre between researchers from different backgrounds means that the sharing of varied approaches to problems greatly contributes to all research carried out by members.

Accordingly, scientific areas are organized around themes, rather than disciplines. A full understanding of labour market transformation requires by its nature the contribution of scholars from varied fields.

Likewise, the issue of territorial development and planning requires inputs from economists, sociologists and urban planners. Moreover, some projects, due to their specific nature, are carried out by teams involving members from various scientific areas, entailing the formation of ad hoc research groups on particular topics for a particular project.

3. INFORMATION BY RESEARCH GROUP

3.1. Innovation and Labour

Coordinators of the RG: Isabel Salavisa and Fátima Suleman

3.1.1. Objectives

The general theoretical framework of the IL Research Group is that sustainable growth comprises environmental, economic, social and political dimensions that have to be dealt with in an interrelated manner. It is now consensual that the current growth regime is at stake since it is undermining some of its own major pillars, such as the responsible use of natural resources and social cohesion. In our view, mainstream economic theories have exerted a substantial influence in exacerbating the natural resources and social cohesion challenges that our societies are now facing, and due attention needs to be systematically paid to the prevailing economic theories when dealing with these issues.

The group is focused on two interdependent domains (Innovation and Labour) and their interconnections.

Regarding Innovation, IL works on the transition to sustainability of large sociotechnical systems, like the energy and food systems. It also studies the emergence, development and diffusion of scientific and technological knowledge and innovation and the patterns of spatial diffusion of new technologies, namely renewable energy technologies. The other main topics of research are: the formation and deployment of knowledge-intensive firms, academic spin-offs, start-ups and other; the intellectual capital management; and the emergence and role of actors, values, norms, policies and forms of governance in these processes.

Regarding Labour, IL works on contemporary labour market issues in Portugal and the EU. The research agenda draws on a multidisciplinary approach, combining sociology, political economy, industrial relations, management studies and social psychology, and using qualitative and quantitative methodologies. The agenda addresses issues associated with sources and consequences of stratification and inequality; and with intervention of state and social actors in the labour market. The research topics are: education and skills; work and job quality; unequal treatment of categories of workers; youth employment and unemployment; traditional and new vulnerable workers; trade unions and labour market regulation.

Methodological pluralism is a key feature of this Group. It combines qualitative and quantitative approaches; uses innovative data analysis techniques to deal with both approaches (e.g. social network analysis, fsQCA and fuzzy cluster analysis); and makes use of appropriate econometric tools

to analyse the datasets. Another key feature is the combination of theoretical work with empirical research, drawing on comparative analysis.

This RG develops its work along 2 Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

TL 1.1: Innovation (Inovação) (Coord: Isabel Salavisa)

TL 1.2: Labour (Trabalho) (Coord: Fátima Suleman)

3.1.2. Main Achievements

It is clear from Table 9 that the number of projects and the funds raised by IL researchers has grown significantly in the last year, mainly due to projects funded by FCT, that is, projects that fulfill very demanding requisites in terms of scientific quality and innovative contribution. International activity also raised substantially, though to a lesser extent.

The number of articles published in journals indexed in WoS and Scopus (Table 10) was similar to that of recent years and the number of chapters published in edited books increased. The small improvement in this domain is due to the researchers' investment in preparing and submitting projects proposals to FCT. The high number of PhD and Master students supervised by senior researchers in IL is also worth noting.

3.2. Cities and Territories

Coordinators of the RG: Pedro Costa e Teresa Costa Pinto

3.2.1. Objectives

The deep restructurings which affected the organization of socioeconomic and physical systems since the 1970s, and their technological and socio-cultural drivers, strengthening the informational, cognitive and symbolic dimensions of these processes, brought new challenges to the way we conceptualize, empirically analyse, plan and develop public policies for urban and rural territories. The complexity of movements and rationalities behind centripetal and centrifugal dynamics which affect urban systems and the organization of metropolitan spaces today also raises new challenges addressing the ways cities are shaped and planned, and the ways academics can develop tools to understand and act in increasingly complex systems and help promoting these systems resilience. CT invests in the disentangling of these processes, through a variety of themes (e.g. urban form, creative dynamics, ways of inhabiting, recomposition processes, urban representations; and empirical fields (from the in-depth analysis of Portuguese metropolitan areas and cities, to comparative analysis with European or Lusophone cities), favouring an interdisciplinary perspective.

CT acknowledges the diversity of logics, processes and actors that shape these processes, from a triple perspective, which involves (i) the analysis of the “dynamics” themselves; (ii) the understanding of the regulation and planning issues and the aspects related to urban/territorial action and “policy-making”; and (iii) a “reflexive” consciousness of the way these spaces are being shaped and how they are studied.

This RG develops its work along six Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

C. Social impact of research

CT is focused on the study of urban dynamics, land use planning and territorial cohesion, in a vast range of empirical contexts ranging from the forms of organization of urban and rural territories to migrations and resulting cultural interaction, as well as the dynamics of cultural and creative activities, the housing issue, sustainability challenges, the diversity of urban morphologies and new forms of governance and participation in the city. The approach to these issues naturally combines positive and normative dimensions, and is often related to policy and planning issues, as well as to other action-oriented research.

By their own nature, the thematics analysed by this RG, as well as the approaches chosen to work with them, favour processes and methodologies which are socially engaged and often deeply embedded in the territorial characteristics of the analysed subjects. The frequent use of research-action methodologies as well as, more generally, deep concerns with the social impacts of the research are constant features, for many years, of this group's research.

Therefore, this encompasses a permanent concern with the deployment of new planning methodologies and ideas in urban and social policy design, often based on research-action processes, and fostering the creation of useful knowledge to facilitate agents' action and policy-making, concerning urban planning and regional/local development strategies in Portugal and elsewhere, and

providing public officials and community leaders with new tools for management and policy analysis. On the other hand, this implies a direct collaboration and involvement with the agents and contractors, which often allows the co-design of projects, the coproduction of knowledge, and fuels the dissemination of results to end-users' communities.

Having this broad framework in mind and acknowledging the general concern with the social responsibility of science and with the social impact of scientific research which pervades D'C projects and activities, some aspects, in particular projects and events, can be underlined for their more specific social involvement or policy-oriented intent. Among others, the following initiatives are examples of the diversity of mechanisms by which this is achieved in this RG:

- The proposals submitted to Oeiras and Lisboa City Councils (Cultural strategies for first case,; policy impacts assessment in the second case), just like many others projects developed in the past by this research group (e.g Cultural strategies for Lisbon), by their own nature as a policy-design projects, commissioned by these entities for defining a medium-term strategy for cultural policy in the city, in one case, or to assess and reorient their urban art policy, in the other case, are clear examples of the direct social impact of a research project in the community, in this case through the definition (or recalibration) of a public policy (objectives, instruments, etc.);
- A project such as "CREATOUR" involving, along other aspects, a call for "creative tourism projects", and the incubation, with specific designed idea-labs, of innovative creative tourism projects, which are nurtured and monitored through the research project, is also a clear example of the social impact of this research, by its own social value itself (as any other research), but also by the knowledge transfer to these agents, and by the co-production of knowledge between them and the research teams, in the monitoring process of their activities, for instance;
- The active involvement of stakeholders and agents in the methodological design of a project (as informers, as monitoring panels, as discussants of the results, etc.), as well as the active involvement in the co-production of knowledge (e.g. Parallel project, Moytirra and KINESYSTEM summer schools), is extremely relevant not just to facilitate dissemination and communication strategies for the achieved results, but also to enhance co-construction and accumulation of knowledge, on a territorial basis, at multiple levels.

3.2.3. Goals and achievements, by thematic line

A. Goals and achievements of the “Creativity, culture and territory” Thematic Line in 2018

This Thematic Line carries out fundamental and applied research on the role of the arts and culture in fostering development, the competitiveness of territories and urban revitalization from both a historic and contemporary perspective. It seeks to understand the territoriality of these activities and creative dynamics, getting a perception of their organization and spatiality and, on the other hand, it strives to shed light on their multiple contributions to various aspects of sustainable development and the resilience of the territories.

The research on these thematic lines now comprises six research programmes: (a) Urban artistic interventions; (b) Culture, knowledge co-creation and sustainable territorial development; (c) Cultural districts and creative dynamics: new methodologies of analysis; (d) Structuring cultural activities, pathways and publics; (e) Creative tourism; and (f) Art, heritage and territories.

The activities developed during 2018 crossed and comprised all these domains, and tried to give answers to the main scientific objectives of this thematic line, in their diversity. The ambition of developing conceptual and empirical work on the role of cultural activities in the promotion of territorial development and inform territorially-based cultural planning, was pursued in various collective projects (CREATOUR, Artsbank, 4HCREATE) and events (E.g. Creatour Idealabs, Parallel Lisbon's Workshop) and many individual dissertations (e.g., Lopes, Concha), and is expressed in several publications (e.g. Costa e Lopes, 2018, 2018a, Borges, 2018, Oliveira, 2018, Lopes, 2018, Costa, 2018). In parallel, conceptual and empirical work was also developed in order to understand the role of urban milieus in the development of creativity and cultural activities, again in the scope of various projects and events (Parallel, Artsbank, Creatour, 4HCREATE), publications (e.g. Costa e Lopes, 2018, Tomaz, 2018, Lopes, 2018) and individual research projects (e.g. Pavoni, Lopes, Oliveira, Viana, Sequeira, Borges, Tomaz, Cruz). Conceptual and empirical work has been also developed in the assessment of the multidimensional impacts and effects of cultural activities in terms of sustainable development processes (Parallel, Creatour project, PARALLEL Project, collaboration and proposal of submission with ARTEMREDE). The disentanglement of the socio-economic functioning of cultural activities, creation processes, audiences, and their relation with the territory (in specific empirical cases: e.g. performing arts, architecture, alternative music; photo festivals) is also another key feature of the analysis in this thematic Line, and it is visible, e.g., in the work of many researchers and sub-themes (e.g., Borges, Oliveira, Sequeira) and many of the events organized in this year (e.g. “Creativity, Culture and Territory” research line seminars; CREATOUR idealbs, ARTSBANK's Barreiro Intervention). Many of these events and analysis were also very important to achieve the ambition of studying and of putting

in practice and testing urban interventions and art in public spaces (Pavoni, Sequeira, Lopes, Antunes, Viana, etc., research; Parallel and Artsbank projects; etc.). In parallel, Creatour project gave substance to the intention of studying these subjects, conceptually and empirically, and to help developing creative tourism practices, particularly in low-density areas. Several master theses and PhD projects embodied the desire to further explore the relation between art, heritage, architecture, history and territories. Finally, many of those projects (Artsbank, Parallel), interventions (Artsbank), and publications (e.g. Costa and Lopes, 2018; Costa, 2018) pursued the intention to develop the exploration of new methodologies and concepts for artistic urban interventions and to enhance participation-research methodologies.

**B. Goals and achievements of the “Representations and discourse on architecture and territory”
Thematic Line in 2018**

This Thematic Line conducts research focused on discourse and representation in the practice and theory of architecture, primarily on questions related to the copyright and contextual interpretation of architectural work, taking a perspective that crosses the contemporary with the history of architecture and urbanism. This multiple interpretation of the various forms of representation and discourse is understood to be as important as the research line on the change of the territory and contemporary society. The four research programmes assumed in 2018 within this line were: (a) Representation of contemporary space; (b) Architecture, landscape and territory, (c) Architecture and Portuguese architects: portraits and dynamics; and (d) Architectural practice and teaching.

Main achievements in 2018 regarding this Thematic Line involved seminars that promoted debate and critical assessment of PhD theses, which will lead to the publication of presented works, available online through the ISCTE-IUL Repository. Also this year, several seminars and events were organized in the scope of this thematic line, including, as usual, one yearly seminar and one conference associated to the Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories PhD Program.

**C. Goals and achievements of the “Ways of Living, Society and Architectural Culture” Thematic Line
in 2018**

This Thematic Line develops several sub-lines of research on the issues of architectural culture and history, housing and ways of living. The analysis carried out deals with the architectural production and the sociological presuppositions of architecture, considering the private and public initiatives,

understanding local specificities, national and international realms. The five research programmes defined in the scope of this Thematic Line were: (a) Architectural culture, in contemporary and historical scopes; (b) Housing, habitat and ways of living; (c) Residential behaviour, social and housing re-composition in the metropolis; (d) Post-colonial perspectives on Portuguese-speaking countries urban growth; and (e) Rehabilitation, regeneration and urban revitalization. In 2018, researchers involved in the “Ways of Living: Society and Architectural Culture” thematic line carried out a set of activities incorporated in the five research programmes by participating in conferences (presenting papers, attending as keynote speakers, etc.), publishing articles, organizing books, setting up exhibitions, organizing seminars, workshops, etc. Special focus was placed on research programmes (a) (Architectural culture, in contemporary and historical scopes), (c) (Residential behaviour, social and housing re-composition in the metropolis), and (d) (Post-colonial perspectives on Portuguese-speaking countries urban growth).

Curricular Units included in the Integrated Masters in Architecture (MIA) were featured in this discussion, particularly in the areas of Society, Theory and History of Architecture and the City. This enabled a greater interaction between MIA students and DINÂMIA'CET-IUL researchers. Second cycle students were directly connected to the research programme (e) (Rehabilitation, regeneration and urban revitalization, for example), as they analysed case studies regarding Lisbon's historic centre or its Metropolitan Area. In some instances, the direct involvement of researchers and PhD grantees in research produced network collaboration and improved synergies.

Major outputs included exhibitions (in public spaces and outside the institution premises) and publication illustrating joint reflection). Different agents were involved with a view of bringing research closer to the community: designers, local government officers, associations, archives, users, etc.

A set of PhD students laboured over these matters in order to produce their theses. Seven ongoing PhD theses are being developed under this TL in ISCTE-IUL, and four more are being developed in other institutions.

D. Goals and achievements of the “Recompositions, metropolitan change and housing” Thematic Line in 2018

This Thematic Line was focused on the analysis of the processes and dynamics of territorial and urban change, studying the relations between development, territorial cohesion and the logics of recomposition that affect territories today, with special emphasis on metropolitan areas and the

relationship between urban spaces and their hinterlands. The five research programmes settled in the scope of this TL were: (a) Structural social and economic recompositions in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area: physical and social impacts; (b) Metropolization dynamics: peri-urban and suburban territories; (c) Gentrification, consumption and new life styles; (d) City and quality of life; and (e) Medium-sized cities and rural development.

In the sequence of the process developed during recent years, in the framework of the unit's strategic reflection process, this thematic line focuses now mostly on the understanding of contemporary housing systems, socioeconomic recompositions and metropolitan dynamics of change, taking into account the global processes and multiple impacts, interests, conflicts and associated values.

All the outputs produced by the team members took into account these three main pillars (Housing, Recompositions and Metropolitan Change), developing complementary perspectives of analysis that allow not only to diversify the approaches from a theoretical point of view, but also deepen the analytical dimensions from an empirical point of view. The achievement of these goals can be proven through various publications, communications, scientific events and projects developed in 2018.

Regarding the papers in peer-reviewed scientific journals, the research published on book chapters and in other publications, the main focus is related with housing issues, residential trajectories and territorial changes in Lisbon. The spatial scale of analysis rang from the city to the metropolitan area and all explore different perspectives related to observed social recompositions and change effects, linking the latest theoretical issues with concrete case studies.

The research of this TL disseminated through participation in national and international scientific events also highlights the changing processes that affect the metropolitan territories through multi-situated scales of analysis and based on several thematic correlations. The presentations also show the ongoing research in topics related to the multiple effects – social, political, economic, cultural and symbolic – that result from these territorial processes of change that are currently taking place in the metropolitan area of Lisbon.

E. Goals and achievements of the “Territorial governance, spatial planning and socio-spatial intervention” Thematic Line in 2018

This Thematic Line objectives to 2018 were defined aiming at analysing (and whenever possible to participate in and/or evaluate) the formal and informal public intervention processes of spatial

planning, strategic planning, master or specific plans, and to glean further knowledge on the rationale of socio-territorial interventions that result from either public initiative (or financing) or citizens' movements in response to concrete problems. It also intended to tackle questions of regional and local development in light of the endogenous and exogenous dynamics of the territories, examining the respective development strategies in terms of the negotiation of interests of the different (public and private) agents involved and the resulting rationale of regulations and governance.

Seven research programmes were defined in the scope of this Line: (a) Planning instruments and spatial planning; (b) Socio-spatial intervention, social inclusion and community development; (c) Territorial development and regional and local development policies; (d) Planning and enhancing facilities and public spaces; (e) Territorial management and metropolitan governance; (f) Participation, associativism and citizenship; and (g) Innovative milieus, networks and territorial development.

Drawing upon the strategic reflection process made in the unit in the meanwhile, a focus for these ambitions was developed. The aim of this Thematic Line is to contribute to action in spatial planning processes and to develop knowledge on socio-territorial interventions that result from either public initiative (or financing) or citizens' movements in response to concrete problems. It also strives to tackle questions of territorial development examining agent's strategies concerning potential regulation and governance. The contemporaneous challenges concerning agency, social innovation and transdisciplinary research for capacity building in territorial development and resilience are also included in the scope of research concerns of this Thematic Line.

Examples of research being developed include transdisciplinary research for territorial development (DIMAT-SIGA Project) and impact evaluation of the role of social entrepreneurship for social innovation in rural areas (RURACTION Project).

F. Goals and achievements of the “Urban Morphology and Sustainability” Thematic Line in 2018

This Thematic Line has been focused on the analysis of the metabolic behaviour of the urban, the social and the physical/spatial systems which encompasses the anthropomorphised urban system, from an ecological and social perspective. The main goal is to provide a morphological reading of such urban system, within several territorial scales and disciplinary approaches. A cultural systemic approach guides this specific thematic line, enabling therefore the reading of the specific points of cultural transition and the reasons that have sustained such transitions.

Given the interdisciplinary vocation of the urban metabolism term, this should be used as a concept to bridge perspectives and build collaborations across different strands of research on environment, territory and cities. Both urban and rural realities are assumed as a strategic dynamic and transversal factor for the development of the territories of the future.

Four research programmes were defined in the scope of this Thematic Line: (a) Urban morphology and the form of the human Habitats; (b) Urban metabolism, environment and sustainability; (c) Infrastructures, technologies and modernization of the Habitat; and (d) Food supply, short circuits, food quality and security.

Main goals and achievements. Urban Morphology and Sustainability thematic line has been developed within the C&T research group while focusing on two particular dimensions. First, to cover a wide number of territories to which conventional research lines related to architecture or urbanism do not pay adequate attention. These are rural areas, environmental issues, urban and territorial infrastructures, health issues, among others. Secondly, it covers the study of the urban form in its most varied dimensions (social, economic and physical) while trying to retrieve the relationships between all of them to better explain changes in the human environment, as consequence of changes to daily human life.

One of the main achievements of this line was to proceed with a research project articulated with the Innovation thematic line of IL, other RG of D'C, and two other universities, which was financed (SPLACH). This Project enabled the integration of three master young researchers and two post-docs at D'C in order to proceed with this research and strength this TL.

Several PhD and Master theses were concluded and are being developed on the framework of this thematic line.

3.3. Governance, Economy and Citizenry

Coordinators of the RG: Ana Costa and Maria Eduarda Gonçalves

3.2.1. Objectives

Presently, new forms of public and private-based regulation are becoming relevant, in addition to the means used by governments to guarantee the rule of law and to promote public policies. GEC addresses both formal modes and processes of regulation, including the legislative procedure, and informal modes of social and economic (market) regulation with special attention to their impact on fundamental human rights. Among the domains under scrutiny are financial markets, Information and Communication Technologies (ICT) and social policies.

GEC also provides a framework for research on science communication and public engagement, as well as on the role and social responsibility of science and its actors, including researchers and research institutions, all of them actually increasingly asked to participate in regulatory processes. This is in line with the Centre's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers in order to better serve society. Economics has been especially concerned by this endeavour, but other scientific disciplines of relevance to the Centre – namely architecture and law – started similar lines of work.

Researchers of GEC played a key role in the design of the new PhD Programme in Political Economy, an interdisciplinary PhD, set up in partnership with CES at Coimbra University, CIES-IUL at ISCTE-IUL, CSG and UECE at ISEG-Lisbon University, which starts in 2019-2020.

This RG develops its work along two Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

TL 3.1: Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges (Direitos Humanos, Mercados e Desafios da Governação) (Coord: Ana Costa);

TL 3.2: Reflexivity, Communication, and Social Responsibility of Science (Reflexividade, Comunicação e Responsabilidade Social da Ciência) (Coord: Pierre Guibentif).

Does the law at the present time still contribute to the production of citizens' power? Starting from this question, we aim to focus on the institutional conditions enabling individuals to participate effectively in the construction of the communities to which they belong, whether by the means of their own agency, by establishing relationships of cooperation or by forming organized groups. Indeed, these conditions are experiencing profound changes, at a time when communities below and above the states are gaining relevance; ie communities which assume themselves somehow to be complementary or even an alternative to the states. The current process of Europeanization is an obvious example of this trend. This meeting aims at promoting discussion of the challenges that such changes bring for the plural set of norms constituent of these institutional conditions. It is our conviction that the sociology of law and justice has a key role to play in the analysis and debate of these issues which are of the utmost importance for democracy.

3.3.3. Goals, achievements, and social impact in 2018 by thematic line

A. Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges

Goals: Under this thematic line, research has focused in particular on the role that the financial system has been playing in contemporary societies, on its impact upon economic performance and income distribution. The regulatory approach towards financial markets was also under scrutiny. Another, somewhat related stream under the same thematic line, analyses the narratives which have prevailed throughout Portugal's "adjustment programme", both in the design of the austerity policies and in their public discussion in the media. Attention has been paid to the intercourse between the academia and the public sphere as spaces of economic knowledge making, to the extent that the latter engages economists as experts, as well as to the dominance of specific economic ideas and the underlying dynamics.

Regulatory challenges raised by technological progresses in the ICT domain have also provided a key topic for inquiry. Seemingly, big data technologies, the Internet of Things and related developments are bringing about new risks for fundamental human rights that public regulation finds it hard to cope with. On-going research under this thematic line discusses the extent to which the EU data protection reform (in force in 2018), and the novel risk-based approach to data protection are up to this challenge, and lessons that might be drawn from risk regulatory experiences in the environmental risk domain.

Benefitting from research at the confluence of this and other Research Groups of the Centre, in particular "Innovation, Knowledge and Labour", on-going research also addresses the impact of specific public policies, namely industrial and innovation policies, on the structural changes in the productive fabric, and the transformations of labour law, which have occurred in Portugal particularly during the troika financial bail-out of 2011-2014, looking at the long term consequences of internal devaluation, its drivers and the means to counteract them.

Achievements: In 2018, under this thematic Line, attention was paid specifically to the processes of development of economic and political ideas in relation to processes of material transformation of societies, in particular, financialization, the circulation of economic ideas in the public space and the role of media, and the production of dominant economic knowledge at multiple scales. The RG has also concentrated its work on several domains of public policies, with a special focus on financial markets, ICT and data protection regimes, and social policies. Special emphasis has been devoted to EU Structural Funds Impact Assessment study on the performance of Portuguese companies. Attention was also paid to aspects of the methodology of conventional law making and the legislative procedure and their present dynamics, together with the drift to flexibilization and informalization of the law. Several researchers tackle domains of the legal system: constitutional law, labour law, environmental law, courts, legislation, etc. The relevance of legal categories, in particular human rights, in the debates that permeate the processes of societal change strengthens the research on law, with special focus on citizens' attitudes towards the law, providing it with a solid theoretical and methodological toolkit.

GEC's researchers are actively engaged in the coordination of the Sociology of Law and Justice Section of the Portuguese Sociological Association. D'C also organized the 2018 meeting of the Research Committee on Sociology of Law of ISA (ISCTE-IUL, 10-13 September 2018).

Social Impact: Among other initiatives, the following are worth a special mention:

- The research project “Empreendedorismo Inclusivo nos Açores” is particularly engaged with economic and territorial resilience and social innovation and with building agency.
- The on-going research in the realm of projects “Barómetro de Pessoas que se encontram em situação vulnerável - Fase III” and “Journey Maps” is meant to promote the up-grading of public policies and the enlargement of public debate.
- Several NGO's and governmental agencies were invited to the 2018 RCSL Conference; many of them sent representatives, who participated in the debates.

B. Reflexivity, Communication, and Social Responsibility of Science

Goals: The TL aims at contributing to the development of training methodologies and scientific practices that understand academic training and research as democratic experiences that include forms of integration and co-creation of innovative knowledge. It also studies, under the heading of public engagement of science, the practices of external scientific communication. Through these two streams of work, the TL intends to help the opening up of spaces for broader debates about current societal evolutions and, in so doing, to rescue the original purpose of the Academia.

One priority topic is the renewal of economic thought, underpinned by the study and updating of economic theory and dialogue with other disciplines, namely economic sociology and law. What is at stake is to foster reflection on the relation between strands of economic thought and analysis, the economic expertise in relation to the design of policies, and the social responsibility of university research. And to tackle this question: would economic science aspire to be neutral? The preparation of the unit's Strategic Programme was an opportunity for a reflexive analysis of the unit's own current research practice. Within this framework, a survey of the individual research programmes was carried out and, on that basis, the three integrating thematic lines were redesigned. This provided an opportunity to shape concepts crucial for the formulation of the unit scientific aims. The ethical principles of the units were codified. Among those principles, social responsibility of science deserves special emphasis, including the commitment to making research results accessible and usable by institutions and organized stakeholders as well as by individual citizens.

In this reflexive exercise addressing science, the TL takes advantage of the participation of its members in scientific governance bodies, and of the observation of reflexive efforts undertaken by other professions, such as jurists or architects.

Achievements: Two research projects, MORE_PE (Mobilisation of REsources for Public Engagement with science and technology) and RECON (The making of economics in Portugal: a study of Portuguese recent economic research (1980 to the present)), are particularly related to this thematic line.

RECON shares the understanding that the nature and evolution of economics in Portugal since the 1980s to the present, and, in particular, how the Portuguese research interact with other loci of scientific economics production, implies a special focus on the postgraduate teaching programmes in economics at Portuguese universities, its evolution and the main factors that influenced the strategies pursued. Research was devoted to give an account of a large number of postgraduate courses that have emerged in Portuguese universities, both at doctoral and master's level, of its main objectives, contents, bibliography, the dominant research methodologies, of the relationship between postgraduate training and an increasing scientific capacity and of how postgraduate training at Portuguese universities is articulated, both at national and international level, with postgraduate training in other universities.

MORE-PE is investigating the culture of public engagement at academic institutions in different countries. Its innovative character has attracted interest around the world and resulted already in important contributions in international journals, as well as invitations for presentations at international renowned institutions and at conferences (e.g. in China and Brazil). The project is providing evidence on policies and practices of public engagement around the globe that can be used by research and academic institutions - such as D'C itself - as well as governments and policy makers, to better engage social actors in research and produce research that serves society.

Apart from these outputs of funded research projects, the involvement of members of the TL in the work necessary for the FCT evaluation process has also to be mentioned here.

This work included in particular the final formulation of the D'C self-evaluation, included in the evaluation form handed in mid-February 2018, and the coordination of the D'C working sessions (November-December 2018; see above point 1.3.1.A.a) preparing the visit of the FCT evaluation panel. Both tasks required the coordination of a participated process of D'C activities self-analysis, and the interpretation of the results of that self-analysis, over against the background of the recent evolution of the academic field in general, in the context of broader current societal evolutions.

Social impact: In this period conditioned by the FCT evaluation procedure, priority had to be given to the internal discussion of the issues of interest to the TL. As part of a long-term strategy

of improving the social impact in particular of socio-legal research, a session was organized by the coordinator of this TL, within the framework of the 2018 RCSL Conference, gathering representatives of some of the main academic journals in the field, with a view to start a discussion about cooperation between journals, in order to improve their impact on a global level. A follow up session on this topic took place within the framework of the 2019 RCSL Conference organized at the International Institute for the Sociology of Law in Oñati.
