## 1. INTRODUCTION

### 1.1. General Description

#### a) DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE's Scientific Identity<sup>1</sup>

**DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE (D'C-ISCTE), Centre for the Study of Socioeconomic Change and the Territory** is an ISCTE-IUL interdisciplinary research unit in social and human sciences, which combines fundamental and applied research on relevant economic, social and cultural topics.

We perform advanced international and comparative research, framed by a sustainable development approach, while pledging to increase knowledge about dynamics and changes of Portuguese society.

We seek to contribute to the understanding of the contemporary world and to the design of the future through the analysis of contexts, actors and consequences of change, encompassing a particular focus on public policy and institutional frameworks, on an analytical and a normative level.

D'C-ISCTE mobilizes an array of theoretical and methodological resources guided by a common core issue. What is at stake is to capture the nature of the dynamics underlying socioeconomic and territorial change, their genesis in the inter-play between collective public and private actors operating in different domains (e.g. markets, territorial communities, public spaces), as well as their impact, notably in spatial terms (landscape, morphology, etc.).

Researchers at D'C-ISCTE pay particular attention to individual action (choices, expectations, creative insights, emotions, etc.) and to institutional endeavours stemming from states as well as sub-, inter- and supranational bodies to moderate, boost or restrain this action.

Research focused on the evaluation of the consequences of such institutional regulation is also based on a reflexive analysis of our own domain of activity - scientific research, its relationships with its context and the changes it goes through, in line with D'C-ISCTE's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers.

#### b) Organization and activities<sup>2</sup>

DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE gathers researchers from a wide range of academic backgrounds (economics, sociology, law, architecture, regional and urban planning, anthropology, geography, management, quantitative methods, etc.). It is organized in three *research groups*:

- (i) **Innovation and Labour (IL);**
- (ii) **Cities and Territories (CT);**
- (iii) **Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC).**

Each of the research groups has specific research programmes, drawing upon medium-term thematic lines of analysis, which reflect their particular scientific identity. Information about the specific scientific identity of each of these groups, as well as about their main goals and achievements, can be found in Part 3 of this report.

Consistency across the three Research Groups is promoted through Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL) set to boost synergies among the groups, i.e.:

- (i) **Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies**
- (ii) **Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies**
- (iii) **Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies**

Activities taking place at D'C-ISCTE combine research with service provision to the community, and advanced training (masters and PhD programmes). The Centre is invested in the articulation between teaching and research, according to international higher education standards. It nurtures the transfer of scientific knowledge through seminars, conferences and publications. It also promotes internal debate and collegial co-operation in order to favour theoretical and methodological cross-fertilization between its different projects, and to foster collective learning and capacity for organizational adaptation and innovation. Its members share the belief that public universities should produce knowledge that may underpin the public debate, namely the debate about public policy design and implementation.

D'C-ISCTE publishes an online journal, *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios*, and a *Working Paper series*, both peer-reviewed. It also participates in publishing *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* and the journal *Passagens*, in collaboration with the Architecture PhD programme.

These activities are supported by a close-knit network of partnerships with other national and international research units, public agencies and civil society players.

### c) Additional information

DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE is funded and evaluated by the Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia (FCT), the Portuguese Research Council. D'C-ISCTE was rated Very Good in the most recent evaluation process.

By the end of 2019, the Unit's technical staff comprised four full-time members: a R&D Project officer; the Unit's secretary, also responsible for the support to the members and to the organization of meetings; a website and communication officer; and a S&T management officer supporting the journal's publication, managing the data about D'C-ISCTE activities and the preparation of targeted initiatives to promote the dissemination of scientific production indicators. Additionally, a Science and Technology Management Grantee assists in project management and provides administrative support to the PhD programme in Political Economy.

The Unit has now been authorised to open a call for the recruitment of an additional worker, in order to upgrade its permanent technical staff to six members, with the functional distribution exhibited in Figure 2.

During the whole year of 2019 the work stream matching the vacant position (particularly the functions related to finance monitoring/reporting and the financial and administrative management of the unit's strategic project was provisionally secured by a staff member, namely M<sup>a</sup> João Machado (which added this to her regular attributions as project manager). Project management was also guaranteed by Mafalda Pífano, who, as Science and Technology Management Grantee, took on this function in parallel to the administrative support to the PhD programme in Political Economy. This transitory situation implied (once again, like in precedent years, and throughout the whole year), on the one hand, an added effort by some of the members of D'C-ISCTE technical staff to cover positions that are not the ones established in the functional distribution agreed with all staff members and exhibited on figure 2 (for instance, Mariana Leite Braga supporting financial and administrative management), bearing on the performance of their primary functions and, on the other hand, demanding an additional collective effort by the whole team to assure the work flow and mutual support, particularly in periods of work overload.

## 1.2. General Objectives established for 2019

D'C-ISCTE Action Plan for 2019 foresaw three complementary sets of objectives:

These objectives are presented in the three following subsections and the degree of their fulfilment is discussed in the next section (1.3).

### 1.2.1. Main scientific objectives pursued by the Unit

The research unit's scientific goals are those inherent to the mission and the collective scientific identity of its research programmes as described in section 1. The specific scientific objectives pursued by each Research Group, which are defined along Thematic Lines (assumed as mid-term research streamlines that can comprise several research programmes, materialized in different research projects, both collective and individual), are presented in detail in Part 3 of this Scientific Report, for each Research Group, respectively.

In the research activities of the three RGs, special attention has been devoted throughout 2019 to those more narrowly linked to the seven “Contributions to Knowledge” announced in the *D’C-ISCTE Strategic Plan 2018-2022* (Objectives and Strategy, point B, as well as publication *Dinâmia’CET – Activities 2013-2018 and Strategy*, Lisbon, May 2019)<sup>3</sup>.

### 1.2.2. Main mid-term operative goals linked to the Unit’s strategic programme

This is a set of pragmatic objectives that are linked to the development of the research centre, which underlay the activities at D’C-ISCTE in 2019 (many of them already identified and pursued in precedent years), which include:

- a) Consolidation of cross-cutting work and collaborative practices which have been promoted in recent years in the unit, among researchers and among Research Groups, (particularly with (i) the 5<sup>th</sup> edition of the Workshop D’C-ISCTE, prepared in 2019, and held in January 2020, (ii) the development of projects and project proposals crossing different groups, (iii) the implementation of the three new Integrating Thematic Lines in D’C-ISCTE activities (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point A; see Chapter 4. below).
- b) Improvement of the requirements for individual research development plans in the Unit (associated to membership conditions and to pluriannual individual researchers’ assessment scheme) and enhancement of its attractiveness to young high-potential researchers (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point A);
- c) Increase in research projects contracts, assuming the need to explore diversification of research funding opportunities, reducing the dependence on specific funding bodies (particularly FCT), aiming to strengthen submissions to calls for European funding mechanisms (particularly but not exclusively H2020) and to applied projects for public and private institutions, and, whenever possible in the case of submissions involving networks of centres, to take the lead in their setting up (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point C);
- d) Increase in publications, particularly (but not exclusively) in indexed peer-reviewed journals and books with international dissemination;  
  
(the idea was, despite financial constraints, which did limit the individual support to members in 2019, to make efforts to provide better financing conditions to facilitate this purpose for integrated researchers and also for research assistants) (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point C);

- e) Development of research networks and improvement of the Unit's role as a platform for hosting visitors and supporting internationalization initiatives (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point C);
- f) Strengthening the relation between research and advanced training;  
(e.g., the 1<sup>st</sup> edition of Political Economy interdisciplinary PhD programme; a new edition of DATMC (Architecture PhD programme) seminars linked to D'C-ISCTE Thematic Lines, resulting in the edition of a final publication; seminar cycles in several PhD and Master programmes; presentation of theses' results in the Unit's seminars; exhibitions of students' works in specific courses, etc.) (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point D);
- g) Growing dissemination of research results in academic events, both national and international;  
(despite financial constraints, which continued to limit individual funding to members in 2019, efforts were maintained to support attendance of integrated researchers and research assistants in these events) (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point E);
- h) Reaching broader audiences and the overall society, both by improving communication of research results to non-academic audiences and by the active involvement of stakeholders and civil society in the research projects' communication design (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point F);
- i) Development of research networks and improvement of the Unit's role as a platform for hosting visitors and supporting internationalization initiatives (worth being repeated here, for also aiming at the fulfilment of Objectives and Strategy, point G of the Strategic Plan 2018-2022);
- j) Consolidation and strengthening of the technical support staff of the research unit, improving specialized professionalization and enhancing skills in the various domains required for an expanding research unit (projects management, financial management, science & technology management, communication, publishing, etc.)
- k) Improving the relational and organizational conditions (research conditions; careers; full/part-time; generational issues, ...)

### 1.2.3. Specific goals for 2019

Short-term objectives underlying D'C-ISCTE's activities in 2019, included:

- a) Pursuing the implementation of the strategic plan for 2018-2022, which has been the result of a strategic reflection process, which started in 2016, about the scientific identity of the Unit, including the implementation of mechanisms that enable permanent self-monitoring of the Unit's activity.

(This was supposed to include, among other aspects, the transposition of the adopted strategic principles to all the communication channels (e.g. the updating of the website and other communication materials, institutional reports, etc., notably integrating the results of the reflexive process on D'C-ISCTE scientific identity and on the individual relation of each researcher to this identity), as well as the operationalization of its principles (e.g. implementation of the Integrating Thematic Lines; internal reflexive discussions in each RG about the thematic lines, etc. It is important to notice that some of the strategic actions considered in the 2018-2022 action plan – such as the setting up of observatories, the hiring of PhD researchers, or the setting of new incentives to researchers, among other – are dependent upon the transfer of the new funding stemming from the FCT evaluation process, whose results were announced in mid-June 2019. The research units should not have access to these funds before 2020, so that most of those actions had no opportunity to be held during 2019, and had to be postponed to 2020 and beyond).

- b) Preparing and carrying out the institutional assessment of the research unit under the ongoing FCT evaluation process.

Due to the strategic importance of this evaluation process for the mid/long term evolution of the Unit, it had to be, in 2019 as in previous evaluation years, the main focus of attention for the institutional structure and the technical staff. It required the elaboration of new documents presenting the unit, and the meticulous preparation of the evaluation panel's visit.

- c) Negotiating short/medium-term funding conditions which enable D'C-ISCTE to get financial liquidity in the short-term with the central structure of ISCTE, in particular to overcome the impossibility to access its own revenue generated by the growth of research projects managed by the research unit (without having to wait for those projects to be concluded to be able to access their overheads) or considering any other mitigating solutions to this problem (see Action Plan 2019 point 1.2: short-term contextual issues).
- d) Negotiating with the central structure of ISCTE for space conditions, in order to provide workplaces for the newly arrived researchers and new projects starting at the research unit (specific short-term cases needed addressing, despite the ISCTE commitment for medium-term necessities, at the new premises to be constructed) (see Action Plan point 1.2: short-term contextual issues).
- e) Reinforcing the technical structure of the research unit and their specialized skills, and refining the attributions and competences of each member of the Unit's technical support team.

In the end of 2018 and in early 2019, discussions took place with the staff members, in order to better define each member's profile. Negotiations with ISCTE's central

structure over the possibility of establishing new labour contracts must be continued. Indeed, specialized human resources are in urgent demand in the fields of financial and project management, as well as information management. Progressively more dedicated support should be devoted to the prospection for funding opportunities, to dissemination of intra- and extra-unit information, and to the increase of D'C-ISCTE's publication series.

- f) Enhancing the functioning of the organizational structure of D'C-ISCTE, particularly at the level of the scientific management of the Research Groups and its Thematic Lines, as well as of the new integrative transversal thematic lines. A discussion process within each Research Group (RG) was started, in order to improve its efficiency, the involvement of all researchers, and the articulation of individual and collective research agendas. This process was supposed to culminate also in a discussion about the coordination of Research Groups and facilitators of Thematic Lines, with the possible renewal of the existing teams, if considered adequate by the RGs. A clear attribution of responsibilities for promoting the three Integrating Thematic Lines, with the nomination of facilitators (or coordination teams) for each of these lines, was part of this enhancement of the organizational structure.
- g) Developing a commemorative programme celebrating the 30 years of DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE (acknowledging the more recent merging with CET and other groups of researchers that now constitute DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE), including the setting up of a calendar with four main actions: a) Dynamization of the Integrating Thematic Lines, with the designation of the respective facilitators/coordinators, responsible for their dynamization; b) Organization of an Internal Retreat, outside ISCTE, involving all researchers, in fall 2019, with the objective of further internal reflection within each Research Group and its thematic lines; c) launching of a call for papers, in autumn 2019, associated to the organization of an international conference to be held in Spring 2020, structured around the three integrating transversal thematic lines; d) publication of a book with the results of this process, end 2020.
- h) Developing a system for monitoring and assessing the research activity of full-time contract researchers.

Following the elaboration of internal norms in 2017, the discussion of this issue was re-launched by ISCTE rectorate in 2019, requesting again the collaboration of the research units in the preparation of a unified/central assessment system. D'C-ISCTE kept on contributing to this discussion on the basis of a draft produced at the end of 2017 to answer a demand of the former Rectorate.

- i) Revising D'C-ISCTE's internal regulation aiming to update the statute of its members (including the categories of members and their duties/responsibilities in light of FCT requirements), as well as the duties of RG coordinators.

- j) Concluding the cleaning up process the Unit's physical files (selecting books and publications from past projects to for donation to ISCTE library), and transferring the computer and peripherals management to ISCTE central services, as well as improving the digital archive of materials produced by D'C-ISCTE research projects.

- k) Improving DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE's information system, including the development of a comprehensive, updated and user-friendly database about the scientific activities of all its members, which can be easily mobilized for monitoring the research unit's activity, flexible enough to enable analysis, and long-term comparison.

(Since 2018, D'C-ISCTE seeks to better explore the potential of articulation of D'C-ISCTE's information system, based on the information collected annually through "Fichas individuais de investigador", with ISCTE's information systems, particularly Ciência-IUL, Fenix and i-meritus platforms, where most researchers are expected to enter information about the various fields of their academic and scientific activity.)

- l) Preparing a new D'C-ISCTE publishing series (e-books), in parallel to the enhancement of the WP series and the development of further indexation of the CCT Journal.

- m) Development of a monitoring system for the social impacts of the Unit's activity (Conceptual and empirical work had to be conducted for this purpose, including the implementation of routines and data systematization practices, which should allow to map, control and disseminate the social impacts of the Centre's activity).

- n) Improving the monitoring system for the academic impacts of the Unit's activity and its researchers.

(Conceptual and empirical work was carried out for this purpose, including the implementation of routines, data systematization practices, and development of an appropriate and efficient database, helping to understand, map and better systematize the diversity of academic outputs of the Centre and the multiple results of its researchers' activity. This also requires a better coordination with ISCTE information system in these matters: Ciência-IUL).

- o) Dissemination and implementation of the DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE ethical principles, codified within the framework of the design of the Unit's strategic programme (point 13) This was supposed to include the setting up of an internal researchers' meeting/seminar on this topic during 2019.

### **1.3. Main Achievements in 2019**

#### **1.3.1 General overview**

##### **A) Main features**

Generally speaking, the main strengths and challenges emerging from D'C-ISCTE's activities in 2019, can be summarized as follows:

##### **a) Main positive aspects and strengths:**

- Capacity to mobilize its community of researchers for the preparation of the evaluation panel visit.
- Potential for cross-cutting issues congregating research ventures of the different research groups proved to be strong, and the ability to harness it is being further developed.
- After regular elections, the Scientific Board was renewed, and the management of the unit was confirmed, while the management team was reinforced by two new members.

##### **b) Main negative aspects and challenges:**

- Staff lacking reinforcement; division of tasks and modes of supervision still have to be finetuned.
- Financial constraints during 2019 still severely conditioned the unit's operation.
- Research Groups activities should still be intensified.



## B) Accomplishment of the proposed objectives (established for 2019)

In a general overview, we can consider that in 2019 the Unit accomplished, in broad terms, the various commitments it had pledged to meet regarding each of the previously introduced three layers of goals.

Summarized information on this is presented schematically in **Table 1**, in order to enhance the accountability of the accomplishment of those activities, for the three levels of objectives: (i) the accomplishment of scientific goals, (ii) the achievement of more pragmatic aspects, and (iii) the level of success on more direct short-term actions

### 3. Specific objectives established for 2019

- a) First measures of implementation of the strategic plan for 2018-2022, which has been the result of a strategic reflection process started in 2016 about the scientific identity of the Unit, including the putting into practice of mechanisms that enable permanent self-monitoring of the Unit's activity.

*(This is expected to include, among other aspects, the transposition of the adopted strategic principles to all the communication channels (e.g. continued updating of website and other communication materials, institutional reports, etc., notably integrating the results of the reflexivity process on D'C-ISCTE scientific identity and on the individual relation of each researcher with this identity), as well as the operationalization of its principles (e.g. implementation of the Integrating Thematic Lines; internal reflexive discussions in each RG about their thematic lines, etc). (It is important to bear in mind that some of the strategic actions considered in the action plan 2018-2022 – such as the settlement of observatories, the hiring of PhD researchers, or the setting of new incentive mechanisms for researchers, among other examples – are conditioned by the transfer of the funding deriving from the FCT evaluation procedure, whose results have recently been announced (mid-June 2019). In terms of research contracts, 25 collective research projects were in course, 22 of which were funded:

- 9 by FCT
- 2 by FCT (PT2020)
- 2 by H2020 (Marie Curie/COST ACTION)
- 1 by INTERREG Atlantic Area
- 1 by national public authorities (Câmara Municipal de Oeiras)
- 4 by other national private institutions (ProcurARTE, ARTEMREDE, CET)
- 2 by other international institutions (Eurofound; IIASA)
- 1 by Iscte (to support an FCT application of Data Science)

Funding programmes are consistently scarce and complex. D'C-ISCTE upholds its commitment to diversifying its pursuit for funding from various funding sources. A considerable number of submissions were made to several funding bodies during these years, some of which are still awaiting for a final decision:

- 3 proposals to H2020
- 2 proposals to FCT (Projetos de Investigação Científica e Desenvolvimento Tecnológico no âmbito da Arquitetura de Álvaro Siza Vieira – 2019)

And others starting at the beginning of 2020:

- SAMA “Prestação de serviços para o desenvolvimento de soluções para melhorar a eficiência e a fiabilidade dos objetivos e a gestão dos riscos na fase de candidatura e análise de pedidos de pagamento dos beneficiários dos sistemas de incentivos do Portugal 2020, com recurso a técnicas de aprendizagem automática”, funded by IAPMEI;
- 1 transnational project funded by FCT, under JPICH Conservation, Protection and Use Call

In 2019, there was no open call for tenders for projects in all scientific domains by FCT. Only a call on architecture issues, within which D'C-ISCTE submitted two proposals that await results.

There seems to be a certain increase in the market for applied studies stemming from public and institutional agents, compared to the recent scarcity of research contracts, mostly on a national level, both in terms of competitive science projects and applied research commissioned by public and private contractors. We hope this trend will hold and will encourage researchers to apply to the diverse kinds of funding mechanisms.

## B) Publication outputs

Overall publication improved from 2018 to 2019, especially due to a significant increase in articles featuring in indexed journals, which also reflects an expanding scenario in terms of indexed publications covering the social sciences, and Portuguese journals in particular. Main achievements in **publication** in 2019 were:

1. A **consistent increase of indexed publication**, particularly articles in journals listed by Web of Science and SCOPUS, (see Table 3). This was most expressive in the CT RG, which caught up to RGs IL and GEC in this domain (see chart 1). Papers in proceedings indexed in WoS and Scopus also account for a larger portion of all proceedings, which indicates a greater participation in consolidated scientific meetings;
2. An increase in **book chapter** contributions and stabilization in the number of authored/edited **books, proceedings and journals**, namely international publishing.

**Chart 1. Articles in journals indexed in Web of Science/ Scopus per RG (2015-2019)**

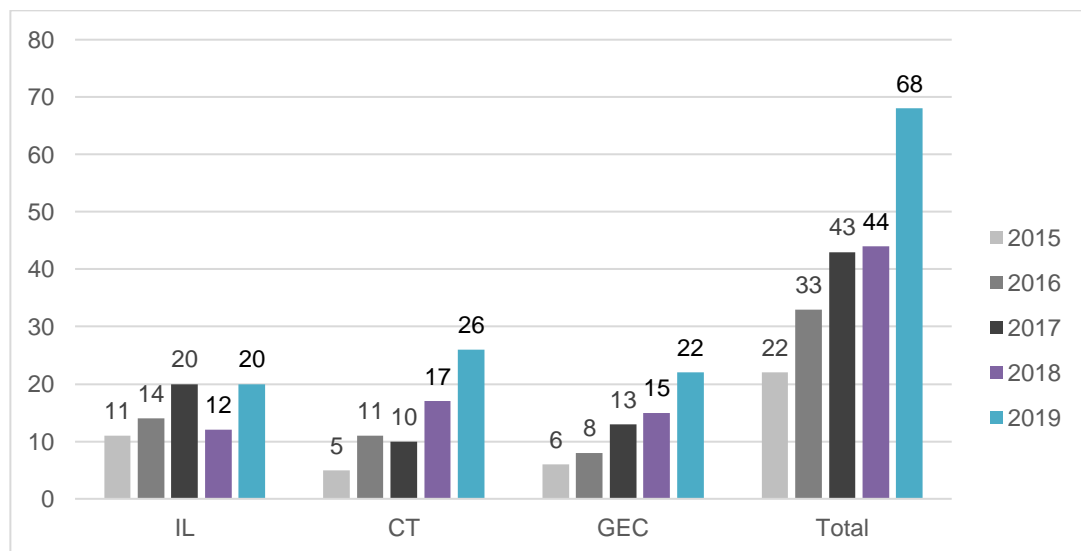


Chart 2. Books, proceedings and journals – author + editor (2015-2019)

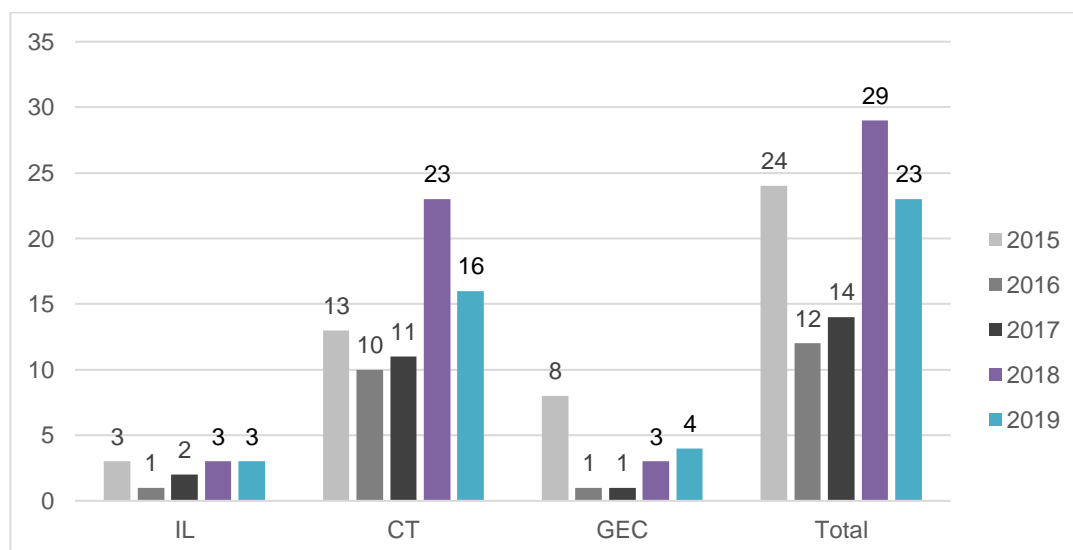

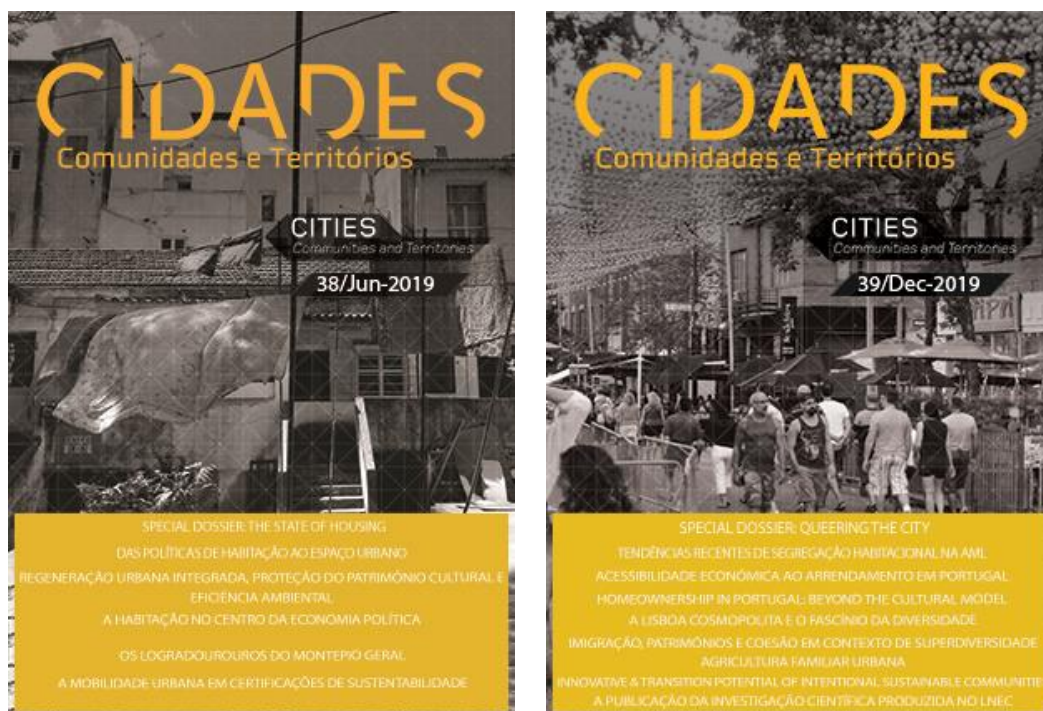

As far as citations are concerned, data retrieved in April 2020 from CIÊNCIA-IUL show a slight decrease in cited materials both in Web of Science and Scopus in all RGs. Again, overall publication is referred to more often in Scopus, especially that originating from research in the Cities and Territories RG. We remain aware that, among other factors, geographical focus and language of publication highly determine citation figures. These numbers do not match other (namely, individual) sources for citations so a different retrieval method must be implemented in the future.

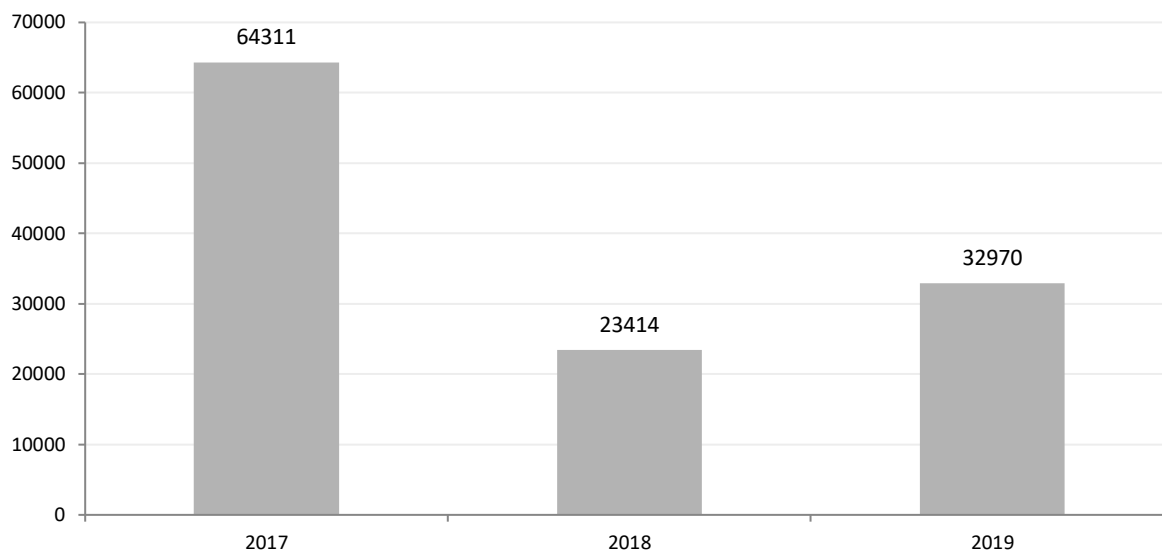
Following international and FCT guidelines, DINÂMIA'CET-IUL has been progressively increasing its presence in open access domains. *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios* has been freely available online for the past 7 years and is indexed on several international databases (e.g. SciELO, Open Edition, among others). In 2019 this journal accomplished the indexation to Scopus database. All Working Papers are published on D'C-ISCTE website and a growing number of other research articles, conference proceedings, book chapters, reports and other materials are uploaded on to ISCTE-IUL Repository, which is integrated in RCAAP - Repositório Científico de Acesso Aberto de Portugal.



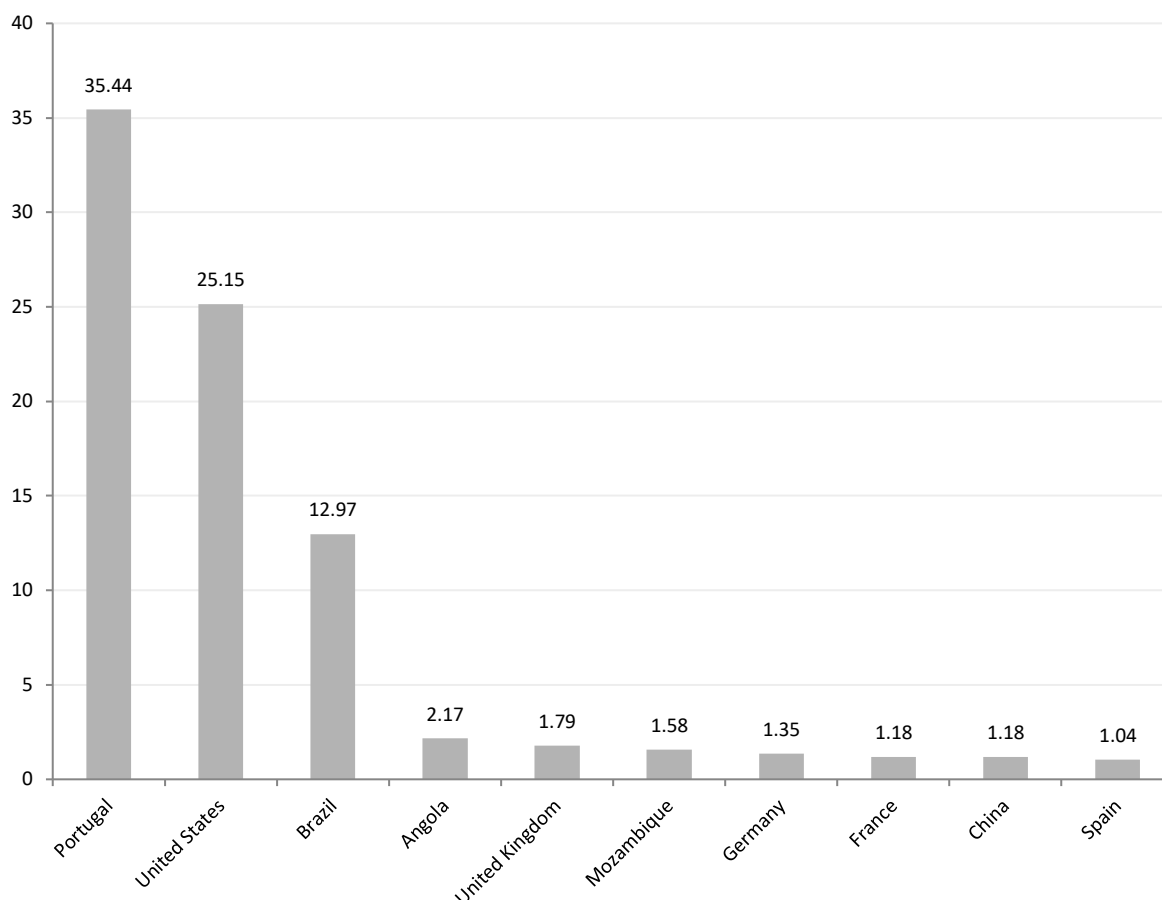
Charts 3 and 4 illustrate the growing scope of DINÂMIA'CET-IUL publications available through ISCTE-IUL Repository, in geographical and chronological terms. 2019 records show a slight increase in

download figures, which may be interpreted as a maturation phase for this platform and its regular users. International audiences still account for almost two thirds of all downloaded material.

### C) Other dissemination and outreach activities

Apart from publication, several other activities help the dissemination of the results of research performed in the unit. Particularly important are the presentation of papers at scientific events.

D'C-ISCTE continues to publish a Newsletter, which reached issue number 56 by the end of 2019, sent to 1891 subscribers.

Academic research undertaken at DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE has also been disseminated along the general public and the community through several media, particularly:

- Contracts and consultancies to public and private entities, which include constant interaction with the society, namely through the active participation of stakeholders in research and continuous feedback knowledge-transfer dynamics between academia and society;
- Participation of researchers in events across the country organized by public and private institutions, including governmental agencies, local councils, business associations and trade unions;
- Workshops and seminars organized by DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE, involving an audience of professionals from governmental agencies, academics, researchers and often also members of the general public;
- Articles published in newspapers and in technical publications, available to a wider audience.

DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE was also involved and participated in the institution's dissemination activities which ISCTE-IUL and the Ministry of Science developed in 2019, such as "Semana da Investigação ISCTE-IUL" (at ISCTE-IUL) with an activity dedicated to the theme "(U)topias Alimentares de Lisboa"

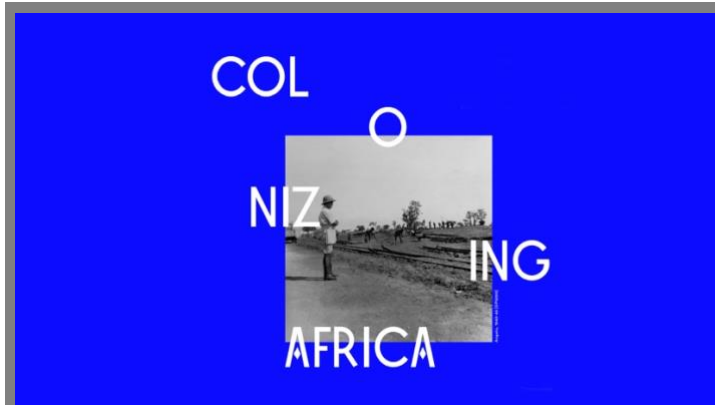

## D) Social Media

In order to promote academic activities and disseminate scientific production generated by its research team, DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE draws upon multiple social media platforms and tools: Facebook, YouTube, website, as well as mail marketing and data analysis tools.

The global perspective in terms of Interactions and Reach (see Chart 5) shows a positive scenario in the last year. Nevertheless, the Unit's 2020 strategy for Communication and outreach will include objectives such as improving engagement with our readers and viewers, generating more appealing scientific content, and establishing promotion campaigns in social media platforms.

Also, the Unit's monthly newsletter has taken a negative turn since August 2019 (see Chart 6) due to a security breach of the ISCTE mail server, compromising the University mail domain reliability through global servers. Hence, ISCTE mail server implemented protection filters to mail marketing services, such as Mailchimp, which automatically send emails from this service directly to the spam folder. However, the number of new subscribers increased 3.4%.

A positive milestone is the growing number of "e-mail opens" (see Chart 7) which represents a rising engagement of current subscribers (54%).

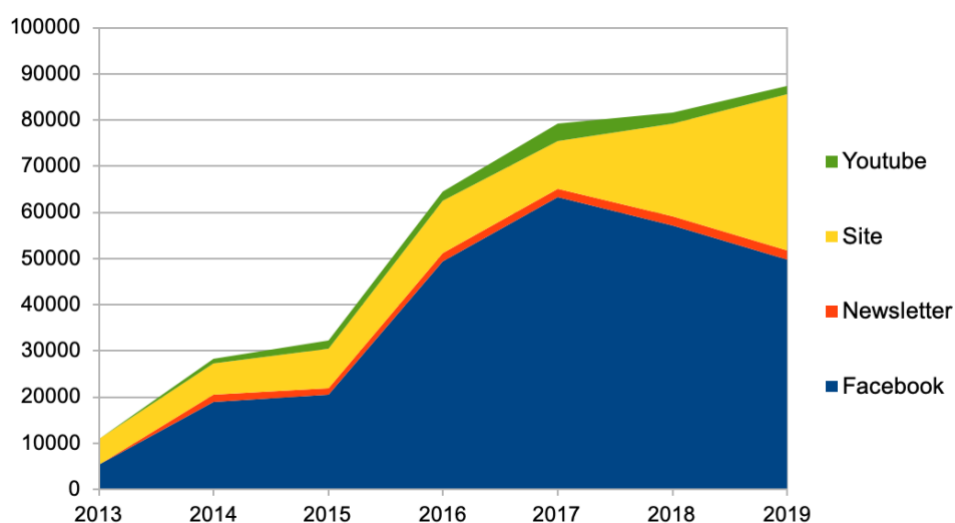
Regarding Facebook (see Chart 8), we have strived to generate more relevant content. Despite intentionally decreasing the number of posts, since 2018 (23% less), in 2019, reach per post increased 14%.

Regarding YouTube (see Chart 9), the number of video uploads has decreased since 2017 mainly due to a change in strategy and availability of ISCTE human resources recording scientific events. The introduction of a stricter policy of image and content authorization by the speakers caused the retention of several multimedia contents yet to be published in the archive, still waiting for authors' approval. In 2019 only two videos were uploaded, with, as a result, a decrease of 19% in the number of views.

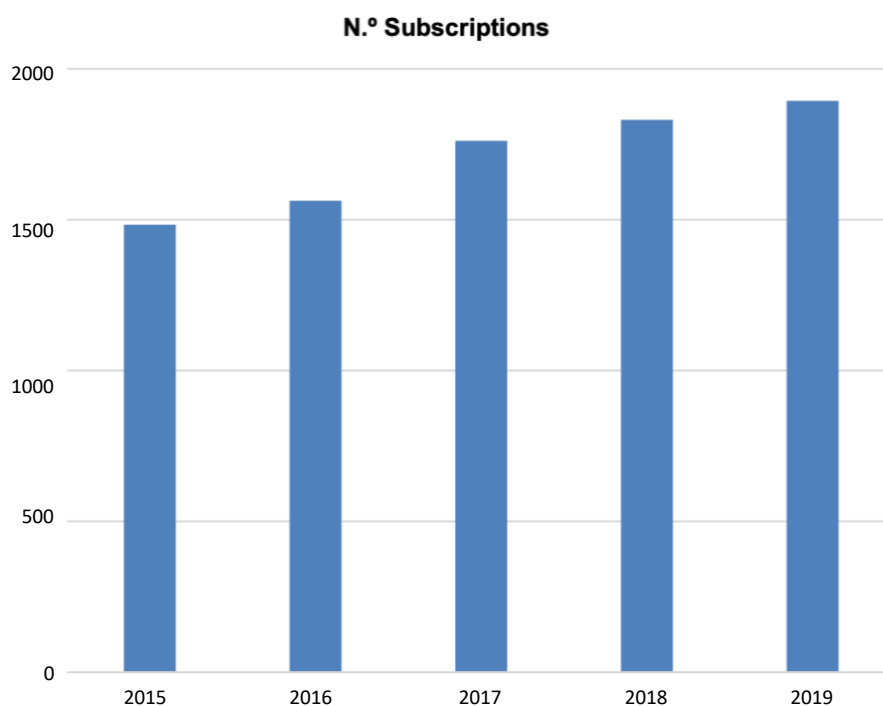
Regarding the Unit's website (see Chart 10), and compared to 2018, the number of new sessions has increased 67%. However, the number of Page views has had a slight decrease of 7%. We believe that it is a result of the abovementioned constraints implemented by the ISCTE mail server, that reduced the number of leads from the newsletter to our website.

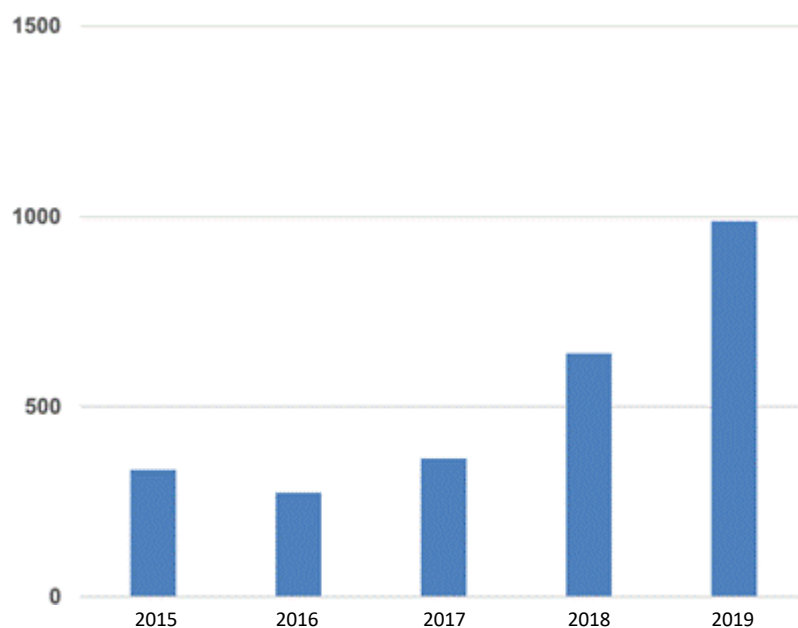
The website has been subject to visual content improvements and to increasingly centralized news and articles, involving the research team in the production of social media-oriented content.

**Chart 5. Overall reach**

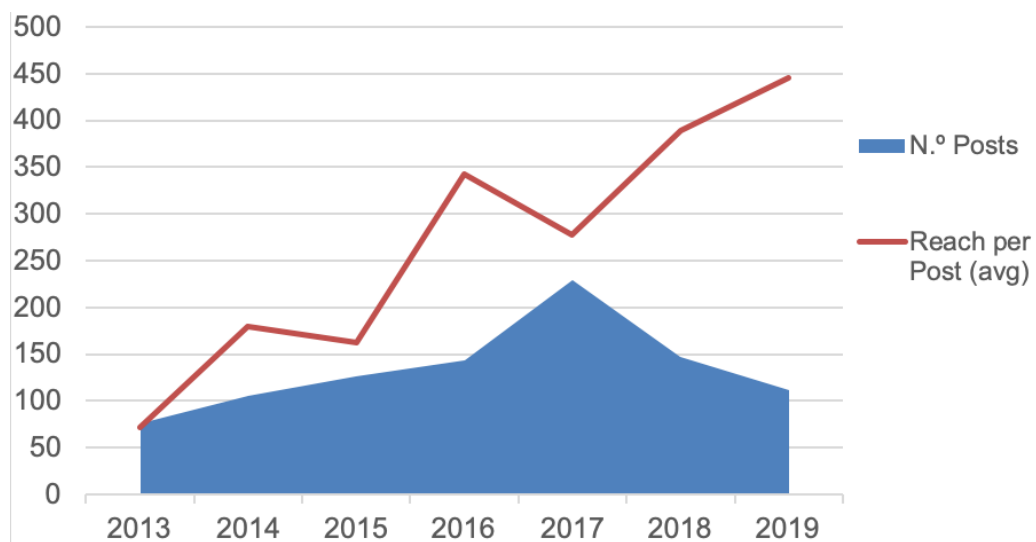


**Chart 6. Newsletter**

**Chart 9. YouTube Views per year**



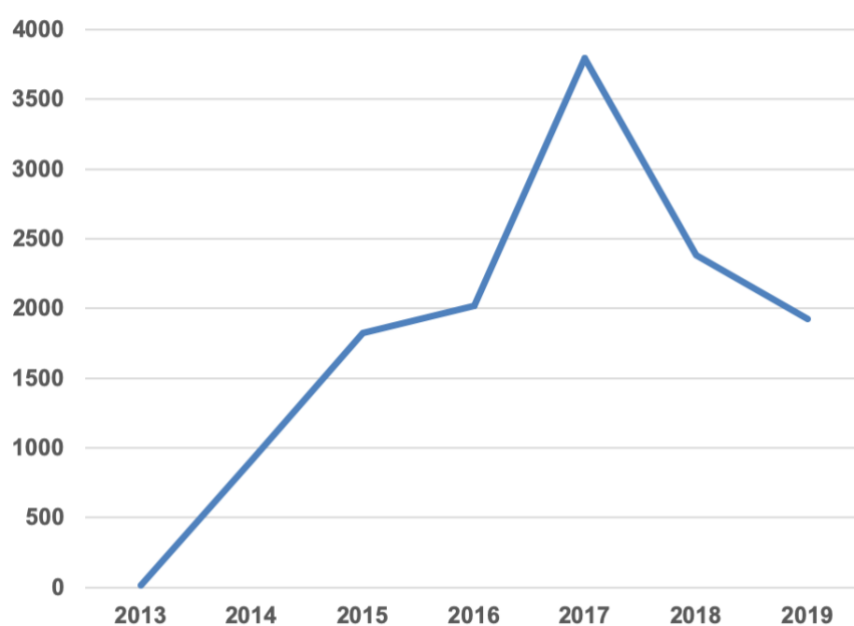

## G) Networks and Partnerships

The Centre continues to conduct its activity with an open approach, developing many cooperative networks and partnerships with other institutions of foreign higher education institutions or associations, either through undergoing projects, or through the activities of its researchers (see full list of involvement at networks and scientific associations in Appendix 5) . This relation, by a diversity of mechanisms, can be seen in detail in part 3, devoted to the RGs.

## H) Integrative/multidisciplinary activities

As a multidisciplinary research centre, DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE was founded on the explicit understanding that major current issues in social science can only be properly understood and studied through multidisciplinary approaches, carried out by research teams holding different skills and perspectives. Paradigmatic issues discussed in this way include local and regional development, labour market transformation, creation and diffusion of innovation, and globalization. The multidisciplinary nature of the Centre permeates throughout its activities.

First, researchers come from diverse academic backgrounds: Sociology, Economics, Architecture, Territorial and Urban Planning, Law, Anthropology, Geography, and Management Studies. Therefore, many of the Centre's activities are unavoidably interdisciplinary, namely projects, conferences and other events.

Major international conferences organized by DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE typically involve more than one discipline. Additionally, informal networking and discussion between researchers from different backgrounds means that the sharing of varied approaches to problems greatly contributes to all research carried out by members.

Accordingly, scientific areas are organized around themes, rather than disciplines. A full understanding of labour market transformation requires by its nature the contribution of scholars from varied fields. Likewise, the issue of territorial development and planning requires inputs from economists, sociologists and urban planners. Moreover, some projects, due to their specific nature, are carried out by teams involving members from various scientific areas, entailing the formation of ad hoc research groups on particular topics for a particular project.

### **3. INFORMATION BY RESEARCH GROUP**

#### **3.1. Innovation and Labour (IL)**

Coordinators of the RG: Isabel Salavisa and Fátima Suleman

##### **3.1.1. Objectives**

The general theoretical framework of the IL Research Group is that sustainable growth comprises environmental, economic, social and political dimensions that have to be dealt with in an interrelated manner. It is now consensual that the current growth regime is at stake since it is undermining some of its own major pillars, such as the responsible use of natural resources and social cohesion. In our view, mainstream economic theories have exerted a substantial influence in exacerbating the natural resources and social cohesion challenges that our societies are now facing, and due attention needs to be systematically paid to the prevailing economic theories when dealing with these issues.

The group is focused on two interdependent domains (Innovation and Labour) and their interconnections.

Regarding Innovation, IL works on the transition to sustainability of large sociotechnical systems, like the energy and food systems. It also studies the emergence, development and diffusion of scientific and technological knowledge and innovation and the patterns of spatial diffusion of new technologies, namely renewable energy technologies. The other main topics of research are: the formation and deployment of knowledge-intensive firms, academic spin-offs, start-ups and other; the intellectual capital management; and the emergence and role of actors, values, norms, policies and forms of governance in these processes.

Regarding Labour, IL works on contemporary labour market issues in Portugal and the EU. The research agenda draws on a multidisciplinary approach, combining sociology, political economy, industrial relations, management studies and social psychology, and using qualitative and quantitative methodologies. The agenda addresses issues associated with sources and consequences of stratification and inequality; and with intervention of state and social actors in the labour market. The research topics are: education and skills; work and job quality; unequal treatment of categories of workers; youth employment and unemployment; traditional and new vulnerable workers; trade unions and labour market regulation.

Methodological pluralism is a key feature of this Group. It combines qualitative and quantitative approaches; uses innovative data analysis techniques to deal with both approaches (e.g. social network analysis, fsQCA and fuzzy cluster analysis); and makes use of appropriate econometric tools to analyse the datasets. Another key feature is the combination of theoretical work with empirical research, drawing on comparative analysis.

This RG develops its work along two Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

TL 1.1: Innovation (Inovação) (Coord: Isabel Salavisa)

TL 1.2: Labour (Trabalho) (Coord: Fátima Suleman)

### 3.1.2 Main Achievements

It is clear from Table 9 that the number of projects and the funds raised by IL researchers has grown significantly in the last year, mainly due to projects funded by FCT, that is, projects that fulfil very demanding requisites in terms of scientific quality and innovative contribution. International activity also raised substantially, though to a lesser extent.

The number of articles published in journals indexed in WoS and Scopus (Table 10) was similar to that of recent years and the number of chapters published in edited books increased. The small improvement in this domain is due to the researchers' investment in preparing and submitting projects proposals to FCT. The high number of PhD and Master students supervised by senior researchers in IL is also worth noting.

### **3.2. Cities and Territories (CT)**

Coordinators of the RG: Pedro Costa and Teresa Costa Pinto

#### **3.2.1. Objectives**

The deep restructuring processes which affected the organization of socioeconomic and physical systems since the 1970's, and their technological and socio-cultural drivers, raising the centrality of informational, cognitive and symbolic contents to these processes, brought new challenges to the way we conceptualize, empirically analyse, plan and develop public policies to urban and rural territories. The complexity of movements and rationalities behind centripetal and centrifugal dynamics which affect urban systems and the organization of metropolitan spaces today raise also new questionings and challenges to the ways cities are shaped and planned and how academics can develop tools to understand and act in increasingly complex systems and develop tools to promote their resilience. This research group invests in the disentangling of these processes, through a variety of themes (e.g., the urban form, creative dynamics, ways of inhabiting, recomposition processes, urban representations, among others) and empirical contexts (from the in-depth analysis of Portuguese metropolitan areas and cities, to comparative analysis with European or Lusophone cities, for example), favouring an interdisciplinary perspective.

CT acknowledges the diversity of logics, processes and actors that shape these processes, from a triple perspective, which involves (i) the analysis of the “dynamics” themselves; (ii) the understanding of the regulation and planning issues and the aspects related to urban/territorial action and “policy-making”; and (iii) a “reflexive” consciousness of the way these spaces are being shaped and how they are studied.

Alongside all these projects, the coordination of the EU COST Action: CA18137 “European Middle Class Mass Housing” (coord: A.V. Milheiro; D’C-ISCTE Team: A. V. Milheiro, I. L. Rodrigues, M. Similarly, the development of parallel platforms and opportunities for debate and discussion (e.g., the research seminars developed in the scope of Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories PhD Programme, linking to the research of the six thematic lines of this RG; or the Urban Studies PhD Seminar “Jornadas de Estudos Urbanos 2019”) promoted new fields for the interaction between individual and collective research and for the enhancement of collective accumulation of knowledge. The development of an informal “Readings Group” with several young researchers of D’C-ISCTE, and regular activity during 2019, was also important for this objective, particularly amongst the CT research group, but also in the dialogue with the researchers from other groups.

Small funding opportunities linked to research-related development activities were also linked to research and dissemination activities during this year, including the support of FACC/FCT for the organization of some conferences and the support of several entities to the urban intervention in Barreiro or the diverse summer schools organized by the RG, for instance. A special effort was made to involve more students within the framework of research projects or through the articulation of the group activities with Masters dissertations and PhD theses. Second and third cycle programmes in Urban Studies and in Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories were particularly important to strengthen this connection.

### B. Publication and diffusion

In terms of publication and dissemination activities, the main goals and achievements were focused, within this research group, on a diversity of activities:

- Publication of articles in international and national peer-reviewed journals and books;
- Participation in a number of top-level international conferences with conference papers;
- Participation in several national and international seminars and scientific meetings with the aim of promoting knowledge diffusion and community-oriented research work.

Table 12 summarizes the more visible outputs of scientific production performed by this Research Group in 2019. Reflecting the efforts made by the researchers in recent years, overall publications increased, but with special focus in publications in indexed journals (particularly in WoS and SCOPUS), which raised nearly 53% since 2018 alone.

## **C. Social impact of research**

CT is focused on the study of urban dynamics, land use planning and territorial cohesion, in a vast range of empirical contexts ranging from the forms of organization of urban and rural territories to migrations and resulting cultural interaction, as well as the dynamics of cultural and creative activities, the housing issue, sustainability challenges, the diversity of urban morphologies and new forms of

governance and participation in the city. The approach to these issues naturally combines positive and normative dimensions, and is often related to policy and planning issues, as well as to other action-oriented research.

By their own nature, the thematics analysed by this RG, as well as the approaches chosen to work with them, favour processes and methodologies that are socially engaged and often deeply embedded in the territorial characteristics of the analysed subjects. The frequent use of research-action methodologies as well as, more generally, deep concerns with the social impacts of research are constant features, for many years, of this group's research.

Therefore, this encompasses a permanent concern with the deployment of new planning methodologies and ideas in urban and social policy design, often based on research-action processes, and fostering the creation of useful knowledge to facilitate agents' action and policy-making, concerning urban planning and regional/local development strategies in Portugal and elsewhere, and providing public officials and community leaders with new tools for management and policy analysis. On the other hand, this implies a direct collaboration and involvement with the agents and contractors, which often allows the co-design of projects, the co-production of knowledge, and fuels the dissemination of results to end-users' communities.

Having this broad framework in mind and acknowledging the general concern with the social responsibility of science and with the social impact of scientific research which pervades D'C-ISCTE projects and activities, some aspects, in particular projects and events, can be underlined for their more specific social involvement or policy-oriented intent. Among others, the following initiatives are examples of the diversity of mechanisms by which this is achieved in this RG:

- The projects conducted to Oeiras City Council and to the municipality's network ARTEMREDE (Cultural strategies for first case; policy impacts assessment in the second case), just like many others projects developed in the past by this research group (e.g. Cultural strategies for Lisbon), by their own nature as a policy-design projects, commissioned by these entities for defining a medium-term strategy for cultural policy in the city, in one case, or to assess and reorient the cultural activities provided in the scope of these municipalities' cultural policies, in the other case, are clear examples of the direct social impact of a research project in the community, in this case through the definition (or recalibration) of public policies (objectives, instruments, etc.);
- A project such as "CREATOUR" involving, along other aspects, a call for "creative tourism pilot-projects", and the incubation, with specific designed idea-labs, of innovative creative tourism projects, which are nurtured and monitored through the research project, is also a clear example of the social impact of this research, by its own social value itself (as any other research), but also by the knowledge transfer to these agents, and by the co-production of knowledge between them and the research teams, in the monitoring process of their activities, for instance;
- The construction, at the end of 2019, of the first sculpture resulting from the participative process conducted with Lousal community, within the framework of the project "Arte Pública e participação cidadã - Um Monumento para o Lousal", funded by Câmara Municipal de Grândola, which was inaugurated at a public space of this mining village, is a very concrete material result of this social and community-oriented research.

The active involvement of stakeholders and agents in the methodological design of a project (as informers, as monitoring panels, as discussants of the results, etc.), as well as the active involvement in the co-production of knowledge (e.g. Parallel project, RESHAPE project, or Technopolitics in Urban Regeneration summer school), is extremely relevant not just to facilitate dissemination and communication strategies for the achieved results, but also to enhance co-construction and accumulation of knowledge, on a territorial basis, on multiple levels.

### 3.2.3. Goals and achievements, by thematic line

#### A. Goals and achievements of the “Creativity, culture and territory” Thematic Line in 2019

This Thematic Line carries out fundamental and applied research on the role of the arts and culture in fostering development, the competitiveness of territories and urban revitalization from both a historic and contemporary perspective. It seeks to understand the territoriality of these activities and creative dynamics, getting a perception of their organization and spatiality and, on the other hand, it strives to shed light on their multiple contributions to various aspects of sustainable development and the resilience of the territories.

The research on these thematic lines now comprises six research programmes: (a) Urban artistic interventions; (b) Culture, knowledge co-creation and sustainable territorial development; (c) Cultural districts and creative dynamics: new methodologies of analysis; (d) Structuring cultural activities, pathways and publics; (e) Creative tourism; and (f) Art, heritage and territories.

The activities developed during 2019 crossed and comprised all these domains, and tried to provide answers to the main scientific objectives of this thematic line, in their diversity. The ambition of developing conceptual and empirical work on the role of cultural activities in the promotion of territorial development and inform territorially-based cultural planning, was pursued in various collective projects (CREATOUR, Artsbank, 4H-CREAT, RESHAPE, OEIRAS) and events (e.g. CREATOUR IdeaLabs, RESHAPE “Workshops” and “Intensives”, 4H-CREAT’s Lisbon Conference and Spring Seminar) and many individual dissertations (e.g., Lopes, Concha), and is expressed in several publications (e.g. Cruz et al, 2019a, 2019b; Costa e Lopes, 2019; Costa, Lopes e Bassani, 2019; Cruz e Pinto, 2019; Almeida e David, 2019; Oliveira, 2019). In parallel, conceptual and empirical work was also developed in order to understand the role of urban milieus in the development of creativity and cultural activities, again in the scope of various projects and events (Parallel, Artsbank, CREATOUR, 4H-CREAT), publications (e.g. Costa e Lopes, 2019; Lopes e Costa, 2019; Oliveira, 2019) and individual research projects (e.g. Pavoni, Lopes, Oliveira, Tomaz, Cruz, Concha). Conceptual and empirical work has been also developed in the assessment of the multidimensional impacts and effects of cultural activities in terms of sustainable development processes (CREATOUR project, PARALLEL Project, ARTEMREDE-impactos, RESHAPE). The disentanglement of the socio-economic functioning of cultural activities, creation processes, audiences, and their relation with the territory (in specific empirical cases: e.g. performing arts, architecture, alternative music; photo festivals) is also another key feature of the analysis in this thematic Line, and it is visible, e.g., in the work of many researchers and sub-themes (e.g., Oliveira, Concha, Gato, Costa, Antunes) and many of the events organized in this year (e.g. “Creativity, Culture and Territory” research seminar; CREATOUR ideaLabs, Barreiro’s Urban Intervention). Many of these events and analysis were also very important to achieve the ambition of studying and of putting in practice and testing urban interventions and art in public spaces (Pavoni, Lopes, Antunes, Viana, etc., research; PARALLEL, RESHAPE, ARTSBANK projects; etc.). In parallel, CREATOUR project gave substance to the intention of studying these subjects, conceptually and empirically, and to help developing creative tourism practices, particularly in low-density areas. Several master theses and PhD projects embodied the desire to further explore the relation between art, heritage, architecture, history and territories. The Collaborative Laboratory “Laboratório Colaborativo | Dinâmicas Urbanas, Património, Artes” (V seminar), at Matadero, Madrid, envisaged to go further in

the sharing of those practices. Finally, many of those projects (RESHAPE, PARALLEL, ARTSBANK), interventions (Barreiro-Artsbank; Lousal), and publications (e.g. Costa, Lopes e Bassani, 2019) pursued the intention to develop the exploration of new methodologies and concepts for artistic urban interventions and to enhance participation-research methodologies.

## **B. Goals and achievements of the “Representations and discourse on architecture and territory” Thematic Line in 2019**

This Thematic Line conducts research focused on discourse and representation in the practice and theory of architecture, primarily on questions related to the copyright and contextual interpretation of architectural work, taking a perspective that crosses the contemporary with the history of architecture and urbanism. This multiple interpretation of the various forms of representation and discourse is deemed to be as important as the research line on the change of the territory and contemporary society. The four research programmes taken on in 2019 within this line were: (a) Representation of contemporary space; (b) Architecture, landscape and territory, (c) Architecture and Portuguese architects: portraits and dynamics; and (d) Architectural practice and teaching.

Main achievements in 2019 regarding this Thematic Line involved seminars that promoted debate and critical assessment of PhD theses, which will lead to the publication of presented works, available online through the ISCTE-IUL Repository. Also this year, several seminars and events were organized in the scope of this thematic line, including, as usual, one yearly seminar and one conference associated to the Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories PhD Programme. Among others, events such as the International Symposium “Walking Places”, at CIUL, the conference “Transformações e lugares em espera: as frentes de água da AML”, at Teatro Thalia, the conference (and the guided tour) “Mergulhando no Sul de Raúl Hestnes Ferreira”, at ISCTE-IUL, or the Seminar Cycle: “II Ciclo de Palestras sobre Investigação em Arquitectura & Urbanismo no LNEC”, marked this year’s activities. Two main collective research projects were fundamental in this thematic line: “Fotografia Impressa” (from which resulted, in 2019, the Exhibition “Fotografia Impressa e Propaganda Visual em Portugal (1934-1974)”, at Biblioteca Nacional de Portugal, and the project “GRAND PROJECTS - AFTER Expo98”. Numerous individual research projects (PhD and post-doctoral level) are also an important backbone of this research streamline.

## **C. Goals and achievements of the “Ways of Living, Society and Architectural Culture” Thematic Line in 2019**

This Thematic Line develops several sub-lines of research on the issues of architectural culture and history, housing and ways of living. The analysis carried out deals with the architectural production and the sociological presuppositions of architecture, considering the private and public initiatives, understanding local specificities, national and international realms. The five research programmes defined in the scope of this Thematic Line were: (a) Architectural culture, in contemporary and historical scopes; (b) Housing, habitat and ways of living; (c) Residential behaviour, social and housing re-composition in the metropolis; (d) Post-colonial perspectives on Portuguese-speaking countries urban growth; and (e) Rehabilitation, regeneration and urban revitalization.

In 2019, researchers involved in the “Ways of Living: Society and Architectural Culture” thematic line carried out a set of activities incorporated in the five research programmes by participating in conferences (presenting papers, attending as keynote speakers, etc.), publishing articles, organizing books, setting up exhibitions, organizing seminars, workshops, etc. Special focus was placed on research programmes (a) (Architectural culture, in contemporary and historical scopes), (c) (Residential behaviour, social and housing re-composition in the metropolis), and (d) (Post-colonial perspectives on Portuguese-speaking countries urban growth).

Curricular Units included in the Integrated Masters in Architecture (MIA) were featured in this thematic line’s discussion, particularly in the areas of Society, Theory and History of Architecture and the City. A set of PhD students laboured over on these matters in order to produce their theses. Several ongoing PhD theses are being developed under this TL in ISCTE-IUL, and also several doctoral researchers are working on these themes at DINÂMIA’CET-IUL.

Two main collective projects structured during 2019 the research along this thematic line: Coast to Coast - Desenvolvimento infraestrutural tardio na antiga África continental portuguesa (Angola e Moçambique): Análise histórico-crítica e avaliação pós-colonial (finishing in this year); and MCMH - Middle Class Mass Housing in Europe, Africa and Asia. In parallel to these, the COST Action CA18137 “European Middle Class Mass Housing”, coordinated at D’C-ISCTE by researchers working on this streamline was a helpful tool for the development of research within this thematic line. Major outputs in 2019, apart from the mentioned publications, included exhibitions, the International Congress, “Colonial and Post Colonial Landscapes”, at Calouste Gulbenkian Foundation, and the organization of the international colloquium “100 Anos de Bissau”, in Bissau (postponed to 2020, due to socio-political instability in Bissau, at the moment of the congress). The Exhibition “Colonizing Africa”, at Arquivo Histórico Ultramarino, in Lisbon, was another key-moment in the activity in this thematic line during this year.

#### **D. Goals and achievements of the “Recompositions, metropolitan change and housing” Thematic Line in 2019**

This Thematic Line was focused on the analysis of the processes and dynamics of territorial and urban change, studying the relations between development, territorial cohesion and the logics of recomposition that affect territories today, with special emphasis on metropolitan areas and the relationship between urban spaces and their hinterlands. The five research programmes settled in the scope of this TL were: (a) Structural social and economic recompositions in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area: physical and social impacts; (b) Metropolization dynamics: peri-urban and suburban territories; (c) Gentrification, consumption and new life styles; (d) City and quality of life; and (e) Medium-sized cities and rural development.

In the sequence of the most recent urban dynamics, this thematic line focuses mostly on the understanding of contemporary housing systems, socioeconomic recompositions and metropolitan dynamics of change, taking into account the global processes and multiple impacts, interests, conflicts and associated values.



All the outputs produced by the team members took into account these three main pillars (Housing, Recompositions and Metropolitan Change), developing complementary perspectives of analysis that enable not only a diversification of approaches from a theoretical point of view, but also deepen the analytical dimensions from an empirical point of view. The achievement of these goals is attested by various publications, communications, scientific events and projects developed in 2019.

Regarding the papers in peer-reviewed scientific journals, the research published in book chapters and in other publications, the main focus is related with housing issues, residential trajectories and territorial changes in Lisbon. The spatial scale of analysis ranges from the city to the metropolitan area and all explore different perspectives related to observed social recompositions and change effects, linking the latest theoretical issues with concrete case studies.

The research of this TL disseminated through the participation in national and international scientific events also highlights the changing processes that affect the metropolitan territories through multi-situated scales of analysis and based on several thematic correlations. The presentations also show the ongoing research in topics related to the multiple effects – social, political, economic, cultural and symbolic – that result from these territorial processes of change that are currently taking place in the metropolitan area of Lisbon.

In addition to a diversity of individual research projects, ongoing research within this thematic line during 2019 was also related to collective research projects: “Transições urbanas observar e agir” and the conclusion of “Tur&Bairros - Turismo & dinâmicas de transformação em bairros históricos: o caso de Alfama”.

#### **E. Goals and achievements of the “Territorial governance, spatial planning and socio-spatial intervention” Thematic Line in 2019**

This Thematic Line objectives for 2019 were defined aiming at analysing (and whenever possible to participate in and/or evaluate) the formal and informal public intervention processes of spatial planning, strategic planning, master or specific plans, and to glean further knowledge on the rationale of socio-territorial interventions that result from either public initiative (or financing) or citizens' movements in response to concrete problems. It also intended to tackle questions of regional and local development in light of the endogenous and exogenous dynamics of the territories, examining the respective development strategies in terms of the negotiation of interests of the different (public and private) agents involved and the resulting rationale of regulations and governance.

Seven research programmes were defined in the scope of this Line: (a) Planning instruments and spatial planning; (b) Socio-spatial intervention, social inclusion and community development; (c) Territorial development and regional and local development policies; (d) Planning and enhancing facilities and public spaces; (e) Territorial management and metropolitan governance; (f) Participation, associativism and citizenship; and (g) Innovative milieus, networks and territorial development.

Drawing upon the strategic reflection process undertaken at DINÂMIA'CET-ISCTE in the meanwhile, a focus for these ambitions was developed. The aim of this Thematic Line is to contribute to action in spatial planning processes and to develop knowledge on socio-territorial interventions that result from either public initiative (or financing) or citizens' movements in response to concrete problems. It also

strives to tackle questions of territorial development examining agents' strategies concerning potential regulation and governance. The contemporaneous challenges concerning agency, social innovation and transdisciplinary research for capacity building in territorial development and resilience are also included in the scope of research concerns of this Thematic Line.

Examples of undergoing research include transdisciplinary research for territorial development (DIMAT-SIGA Project), impact evaluation of the role of social entrepreneurship for social innovation in rural areas (RURACTION Project), collaboration in the impact assessment of the Portuguese Polytechnical Institutes network (Estudo de Avaliação dos Institutos Politécnicos Portugueses) or the involvement at "Incubadora Popular d'Ajuda", in the scope of the Lisbon's City Council Program BIPZIP. Along with this, a multiplicity of other individual research work was translated into a diversity of post-doctoral and PhD projects and publications.

Among other events, the International Conference and Summer School "Technopolitics in Urban Regeneration: Co-creating Public Spaces", and the International Conference "European Transnational Cooperation", at ISCTE-IUL, marked this thematic line work during 2019.

#### **F. Goals and achievements of the "Urban Morphology and Sustainability" Thematic Line in 2019**

This Thematic Line has been focused on the analysis of the metabolic behaviour of the urban, the social and the physical/spatial systems, which encompasses the anthropomorphized urban system, from an ecological and social perspective. The main goal is to provide a morphological reading of this urban system, within several territorial scales and disciplinary approaches. A cultural systemic approach guides this specific thematic line, enabling therefore the reading of the specific points of cultural transition and the reasons that have sustained such transitions. The main aim is to retrieve potential incomes to inform further urban planning policies towards a more sustainable environment.

Given the interdisciplinary vocation of the urban metabolism term, this should be used as a concept to bridge perspectives, geographical boundaries and build collaborations across different strands of research on environment, territory and cities. Both urban and rural realities are perceived as a strategic dynamic and transversal factor for the development of the territories of the future.

Four research programmes were defined in the scope of this Thematic Line: (a) Urban morphology and the form of the human Habitats; (b) Urban metabolism, environment and sustainability; (c) Infrastructures, technologies and modernization of the Habitat; and (d) Food supply, short circuits, food quality and security.

Urban Morphology and Sustainability thematic line has been developed within the CT research group while focusing on two particular dimensions. First, to cover a wide number of territories to which conventional research lines related to architecture or urbanism do not pay adequate attention, but also to expand the knowledge about urban form itself and its potential role to benefit the natural environment. Rural areas, current ways of living, environmental issues, urban and territorial infrastructures, health issues, among others are all considered in the sustainability debate. Secondly, it covers the study of the urban form in its most varied dimensions (social, economic and physical) while trying to retrieve the relationships between all of them to better explain changes in the human environment, as consequences of changes in daily human life.

One of the main achievements of this line is the development of a big research project articulated with the Innovation thematic line of IL, and two other universities (SPLACH - Spatial Planning for Change). This Project has been able to integrate a variety of master/doctorate researchers and post-docs at D'C-ISCTE in order to proceed with this research and strength this TL.

Several PhD and Masters theses were concluded and are being developed on the framework of this thematic line.

### **3.3. Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC)**

Coordinators of the RG: Ana Costa and Maria Eduarda Gonçalves

#### **3.3.1. Objectives**

GEC centres its research on regulation and governance encompassing the role of the state, of markets and collective action in the context of Europeanization processes in particular. It is assumed that, in addition to the means used by the state through the rule of law and of public policies, new modes of regulation and governance, both public and private, as well as social are increasingly influential underpinned by co-operation and self-regulation. These plural forms are studied, as well as their interferences with fundamental rights and values, promoting or hindering them. Empirical analyses focus on specific domains of policy, namely environmental and public health, digital technologies, financial markets, and social policies.

GEC also provides the framework for research and thinking on science communication and the social responsibility of science, seeking to promote the social reflexivity of D'C-ISCTE researchers themselves.

This RG develops its work along two Thematic Lines (TLs), namely:

TL 3.1: Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges (Direitos Humanos, Mercados e Desafios da Governação) (Coord: Ana Costa);

TL 3.2: Reflexivity, Communication, and Social Responsibility of Science (Reflexividade, Comunicação e Responsabilidade Social da Ciência) (Coord: Pierre Guibentif).

### 3.3.3. Goals, achievements, and social impact in 2019 by thematic line

#### B. Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges

**Goals:** Under this thematic line, research has focused in particular on the role that the financial system has been playing in contemporary societies, on its impact upon economic performance and income distribution. The regulatory approach towards financial markets was also under scrutiny. Another, somewhat related stream under the same thematic line, analyses the narratives which have prevailed throughout Portugal's "adjustment programme", both in the design of the austerity policies and in their public discussion in the media. Attention has been paid to the intercourse between the academia and the public sphere as spaces of economic knowledge making, to the extent that the latter engages economists as experts, as well as to the dominance of specific economic ideas and the underlying dynamics.

Regulatory challenges raised by technological progresses in the ICT domain have also provided a key topic for inquiry. Seemingly, big data technologies, the Internet of Things and related developments are bringing about new risks for fundamental human rights that public regulation finds it hard to cope with. On-going research under this thematic line discusses the extent to which the EU data protection reform (in force in 2018), and the novel risk-based approach to data protection are up to this challenge, and lessons that might be drawn from risk regulatory experiences in the environmental risk domain.

Benefitting from research at the confluence of this and other Research Groups of the Centre, in particular "Innovation, Knowledge and Labour", on-going research also addresses the impact of specific public policies, namely industrial and innovation policies, on the structural changes in the productive fabric, and the transformations of labour law, which have occurred in Portugal particularly during the troika financial bail-out of 2011-2014, looking at the long term consequences of internal devaluation, its drivers and the means to counteract them.

**Achievements:** In 2019, under this thematic Line, attention was paid specifically to the processes of development of economic and political ideas in relation to processes of material transformation of societies, in particular, financialization, the circulation of economic ideas in the public space and the role of media, and the production of dominant economic knowledge at multiple scales. This TL has also concentrated its work on several domains of public policies, with a special focus on financial markets, ICT and data protection regimes, and social policies. Special emphasis has been devoted to EU Structural Funds Impact Assessment study on the performance of Portuguese companies. Attention was also paid to aspects of the methodology of conventional law making and the legislative procedure and their present dynamics, together with the drift to flexibilization and informalization of the law. Several researchers tackle domains of the legal system: constitutional law, labour law, environmental law, courts, legislation, etc. The relevance of legal categories, in particular human rights, in the debates

that permeate the processes of societal change strengthens the research on law, with special focus on citizens' attitudes towards the law, providing it with a solid theoretical and methodological toolkit.

GEC researchers are actively engaged in the coordination of the Sociology of Law and Justice Section of the Portuguese Sociological Association. D'C-ISCTE also organized the 2019 meeting of the Research Committee on Sociology of Law of ISA (ISCTE-IUL, 10-13 September 2019).

**Social Impact:** Among other initiatives, the following are worth a special mention:

- The on-going research in the realm of projects “Barómetro de Pessoas que se encontram em situação vulnerável – Fase III” and “Journey Maps” is meant to promote the up-grading of public policies and the enlargement of public debate.
- Several NGO's and governmental agencies were invited to the 2018 RCSL Conference; many of them sent representatives, who participated in the debates.

## **B. Reflexivity, Communication, and Social Responsibility of Science**

**Goals:** The TL aims at contributing to the development of training methodologies and scientific practices that understand academic training and research as democratic experiences that include forms of integration and co-creation of innovative knowledge. It also studies, under the heading of public engagement of science, the practices of external scientific communication. Through these two streams of work, the TL intends to help the opening up of spaces for broader debates about current societal evolutions and, in so doing, to rescue the original purpose of the Academia.

One priority topic is the renewal of economic thought, underpinned by the study and updating of economic theory and dialogue with other disciplines, namely economic sociology and law. What is at stake is to foster reflection on the relation between strands of economic thought and analysis, the economic expertise in relation to the design of policies, and the social responsibility of university research. And to tackle this question: would economic science aspire to be neutral? The preparation of the unit's Strategic Programme was an opportunity for a reflexive analysis of the unit's own current research practice. Within this framework, a survey of the individual research programmes was carried out and, on that basis, the three integrating thematic lines were redesigned. This provided an opportunity to shape concepts crucial for the formulation of the unit scientific aims. The ethical principles of the units were codified. Among those principles, social responsibility of science deserves



special emphasis, including the commitment to making research results accessible and usable by institutions and organized stakeholders as well as by individual citizens.

Both streams of work require a reflexive exercise addressing science itself. In this exercise, this TL could take advantage of the participation of its members in scientific governance bodies. It also takes into account a research on renewal of economic thought, underpinned by the study and updating of economic theory and dialogue with other disciplines, namely economic sociology and law, and on the relation between strands of economic thought and analysis and the design of policies, discussing on this basis the social responsibility of university research, and of the observation of reflexive efforts undertaken by other professions, such as jurists or architects<sup>4</sup>.

**Achievements:** Two research projects, MORE\_PE (Mobilisation of Resources for Public Engagement with science and technology) and RECON (The making of economics in Portugal: a study of Portuguese recent economic research (1980 to the present), still in course in 2019, are particularly related to this thematic line.

MORE-PE is investigating the culture of public engagement at academic institutions in different countries. Its innovative character has attracted interest around the world and resulted already in important contributions in international journals, as well as invitations for presentations at international renowned institutions and at conferences (e.g. in China and Brazil). The project is providing evidence on policies and practices of public engagement around the globe that can be used by research and academic institutions – such as D'C-ISCTE itself – as well as governments and policy makers, to better engage social actors in research and produce research that serves society<sup>5</sup>.

RECON shares the understanding that the nature and evolution of economics in Portugal since the 1980s to the present, and, in particular, how the Portuguese research interact with other *loci* of scientific economics production, implies a special focus on the postgraduate teaching programmes in economics at Portuguese universities, its evolution and the main factors that influenced the strategies pursued. Research was devoted to give an account of a large number of postgraduate courses that have emerged in Portuguese universities, both at doctoral and master's level, of its main objectives, contents, bibliography, the dominant research methodologies, of the relationship between postgraduate training and an increasing scientific capacity and of how postgraduate training at Portuguese universities is articulated, both at national and international level, with postgraduate training in other universities.

The non-funded research project “Le droit et les crises”, carried out with an international network of researchers in sociology of law, was finalized during 2019. Papers were reworked after the peer review process and handed in for publication in the French journal *Droit et Société*, in October 2019.

As a first attempt to bridge RECON and “Le droit et les crises”, Ana Costa and Pierre Guibentif made a joint presentation at the Conference *Ciência 2019 – Encontro com a Ciência e Tecnologia em Portugal*, in July 2019, under the heading “Crise financeira e democracia”.

Apart from these outputs of research projects, members of the TL were involved, also in 2019, in the last steps of the work necessary for the FCT evaluation process, which included the interpretation and presentation of the results of an analysis of the unit’s scientific production, against the background of the recent evolution of the academic field in general, in the context of broader current societal evolutions. The results were presented to the evaluation panel upon their visit to DINÂMIA’CET-ISCTE.

The main characteristic of this Thematic Line is that it gathers researchers interested in the analysis of science in society, and these researchers have necessarily a relevant role to play when the analysis of D’C-ISCTE itself is concerned. In a certain sense, this Thematic Line functions as an organizational structure sustaining the unit’s broader reflexive effort. A side effect of this position is that such broader reflexive efforts may condition, in their critical phases, activities of the Thematic Line itself. This is certainly what has happened since the last FCT evaluation process started. This may also be the case, with the setting up of the new D’C-ISCTE Integrating Thematic Lines, starting in 2019 (see next Chapter 4.).

**Social impact:** In this period conditioned by the FCT evaluation procedure, priority had to be given to the internal discussion of the issues of interest to the TL. As a first step on the way back to a more public discussion of our work, a result of the preparation of the evaluation panel visit was the production of a publication (*DINÂMIA’CET-IUL – Activities 2013-2018 and Strategy*), designed to reach not only an academically specialized audience.

## 4. INTEGRATING THEMATIC LINES

D’C-ISCTE seeks to take full advantage of the theoretical and methodological correspondences existing between its three Research Groups. Three Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL) were defined in 2013. A survey of the individual working programmes of D’C-ISCTE members carried out in 2017 confirmed the accuracy of this device and allowed to improve its coherence and its adequacy in relation to the Horizon 2020 Programme.

ITL are light structures aiming at stimulating contacts between researchers, between projects, and between Research Groups with a view to the setting up of cross-cutting initiatives, from working sessions to the design of research projects. They are conceived as flexible, likely to be adapted, on the middle run, both to the social demand and to research currently carried out by D’C-ISCTE. ITL have no members, only a team of designated facilitators (*dinamizadores*) and a general coordination (for 2020: M. A. Gato & P. Guibentif). The aim is to link most initiatives of D’C-ISCTE to one or more ITL.

The new (2020-2024) three D’C-ISCTE ITL are:

**Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies**

**Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies**

**Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies**

A first opportunity to test the accuracy of these lines was a set of Paper Discussion Sessions that took place in November 2018. The results of these sessions served as background material for the preparation of the unit’s presentation to the evaluation team at the occasion of its visit within the framework of the FCT Research Units Evaluation process. The main output of this work appears in the publication *DINÂMIA’CET-IUL – Activities 2013-2018 And Strategy* (2019), p. 76, under the heading “Designing a Concept of Social Change”.

A first step of implementation took place in November 2019. Six researchers accepted to participate, as “facilitators” (*dinamizadores*), in the coordination of this device:

According to the guidelines of the unit management, this facilitators team issued in the end of November a working plan including (1) the promotion of the ITL, in particular by the means of an adequate information on the DINÂMIA’CET-IUL website, and mainly (2) the preparation of an event to take place in 2020, celebrating the 10 years as an organic unit of ISCTE, 30 years of D’C-ISCTE, and 40 years of CET. The prospect is to invite, at the occasion of this event, the unit researchers to present contributions revisiting the unit’s activity trying to take advantage of the cross-cutting concepts

underlying the definition of the three ITL. Final versions of these papers should be included in a book supporting the unit's research achievements and the theoretical and methodological tools likely to be derived from the work performed. Alongside the publication of articles based on this cooperative research and theory exercise, such a book could strengthen the background for future applications to highly competitive international calls.
