1. INTRODUCTION: DINAMIA'CET-IUL AND ITS SCIENTIFIC IDENTITY

1.1. DINAMIA'CET-IUL Scientific Identity¹

DINÂMIA'CET - IUL (D'C), Centre for Socioeconomic and Territorial Studies is an ISCTE-IUL interdisciplinary research unit in social and human sciences, which combines fundamental and applied research on relevant economic, social and cultural topics.

We perform advanced international and comparative research, framed by a sustainable development approach, while pledging to increase knowledge about dynamics and changes of Portuguese society.

We seek to contribute to the understanding of the contemporary world and to the design of the future through the analysis of contexts, actors and consequences of change, encompassing a particular focus on public policy and institutional frameworks, on an analytical and a normative level.

D'C-IUL mobilizes an array of theoretical and methodological resources guided by a common core issue. What is at stake is to capture the nature of the dynamics underlying socioeconomic and territorial change, their genesis in the inter-play between collective public and private actors operating in different domains (e.g. markets, territorial communities, public spaces), as well as their impact, notably in spatial terms (landscape, morphology, etc.).

Researchers at D'C-IUL pay particular attention to individual action (choices, expectations, creative insights, emotions, etc.) and to institutional endeavours stemming from states as well as sub-, inter- and supranational bodies to moderate, boost or restrain such action.

Research focused on the evaluation of the consequences of such institutional regulation is also based on a reflexive analysis of our own domain of activity - scientific research, its relationships with its context and the changes it goes through, in line with D'C-IUL 's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers.

1.2. Organization and Activities

DINÂMIA'CET-IUL gathers researchers from a wide range of academic backgrounds (economics, sociology, law, architecture, regional and urban planning, anthropology, geography, management, quantitative methods, etc.). It is organized in three *research groups*:

- (i) **Innovation and Labour (IL);**
- (ii) **Cities and Territories (CT);**

(iii) **Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC).**

Each of the research groups has specific research programmes, drawing upon medium-term thematic lines of analysis, which reflect their particular scientific identity. Information about the specific scientific identity of each of these groups, as well as about their main goals and achievements, can be found in part 3 of this report.

It seeks to drive its activities and to reinforce its consistency through cross-sectional integrating thematic lines (ITL) set to boost synergies between the three groups:

- (i) Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies
- (ii) Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies
- (iii) Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies

Activities taking place at D'C combine research with service provision to the community, and advanced training (masters and PhD programmes). The Centre is invested in the articulation between teaching and research, according to international higher education standards. It nurtures the transfer of scientific knowledge through seminars, conferences and publications. It also promotes internal debate and collegial co-operation in order to favour theoretical and methodological cross-fertilization between its different projects, and to foster collective learning and capacity for organizational adaptation and innovation. Its members share the belief that public universities should produce knowledge that may underpin the public debate, namely the debate about public policy design and implementation. D'C publishes an online journal, CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios, and a Working Paper series, both peer-reviewed. It also participates in publishing *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* and the journal *Passagens*, in collaboration with the Architecture PhD programme. These activities are supported by a close-knit network of partnerships with other national and international research units, public agencies and civil society players.

1.2.1 Innovation and Labour (IL)

The general theoretical framework of the IL Research Group is that sustainable growth comprises environmental, economic, social and political dimensions that have to be dealt with in an interrelated manner. It is now consensual that the current growth regime is at stake since it is undermining some of its own major pillars, such as the responsible use of natural resources and social cohesion. In our view, mainstream economic theories have exerted a substantial influence in exacerbating the natural resources and social cohesion challenges that our societies are now facing, and due attention needs to be systematically paid to the prevailing economic theories when dealing with these issues.

The group is focused on two interdependent domains (Innovation and Labour) and their interconnections.

Regarding Innovation, IL works on the transition to sustainability of large sociotechnical systems, like the energy and food systems. It also studies the emergence, development and diffusion of scientific and technological knowledge and innovation and the patterns of spatial diffusion of new technologies, namely renewable energy technologies. The other main topics of research are: the formation and deployment of knowledge-intensive firms, academic spin-offs, start-ups and other; the intellectual capital management; and the emergence and role of actors, values, norms, policies and forms of governance in these processes.

Regarding Labour, IL works on contemporary labour market issues in Portugal and the EU. The research agenda draws on a multidisciplinary approach, combining sociology, political economy, industrial relations, management studies and social psychology, and using qualitative and quantitative methodologies. The agenda addresses issues associated with sources and consequences of stratification and inequality; and with intervention of state and social actors in the labour market. The research topics are: education and skills; work and job quality; unequal treatment of categories of workers; youth employment and unemployment; traditional and new vulnerable workers; trade unions and labour market regulation.

Methodological pluralism is a key feature of this Group. It combines qualitative and quantitative approaches; uses innovative data analysis techniques to deal with both approaches (e.g. social network analysis, fsQCA and fuzzy cluster analysis); and makes use of appropriate econometric tools to analyse the datasets. Another key feature is the combination of theoretical work with empirical research, drawing on comparative analysis.

1.2.2 Cities and Territories (CT)

This Group focuses its research on the territorial dimensions of contemporary socioeconomic, environmental and cultural change, analysing its complex restructuring mechanisms in the light of their spatiality, i.e. their territorial embeddedness and their spatial-morphological dimensions, framing them with a view to action towards the promotion of multidimensional sustainable development processes.

The deep restructurings which affected the organization of socioeconomic and physical systems since the 1970's, and their technological and socio-cultural drivers, raising the centrality of informational, cognitive and symbolic contents to these processes, brought new challenges to the way we conceptualize, empirically analyze, plan and develop public policies to urban and rural territories. The complexity of movements and rationalities behind centripetal and centrifugal dynamics which affect urban systems and the organization of metropolitan spaces

today raise also new questionings and challenges to the ways cities are shaped and planned and how academics can develop tools to understand and act in increasingly complex systems and develop tools to promote their resilience. This research group invests in the disentangling of these processes, through a variety of themes (e.g., the urban form, the creative dynamics, the ways of inhabiting, the recomposition processes, the urban representations,...) and empirical contexts (from the in depth analysis of Portuguese metropolitan areas and cities, to comparative analysis with European or Lusophone cities, for example), favouring an interdisciplinary perspective which is nurtured by the diversity of this research group.

The Cities and Territories Research Group strategy for deepening the knowledge about the dynamics of change in these spatial and territorial terms is based on the acknowledgment of the diversity of logics, processes and actors that produce and appropriate these processes. This is always done from a triple perspective, involving (i) the analysis of the "dynamics" themselves; (ii) the understanding of the regulation and planning issues and the aspects related to urban/territorial action and "policy-making"; and (iii), a "reflexive" consciousness of the way these spaces are worked and how they are studied.

This encompasses a permanent concern with the deployment of new planning methodologies and ideas in urban and social policy design, often based on research-action processes, and fostering the creation of useful knowledge to facilitate agents' action and policy-making, concerning urban planning and regional/local development strategies in Portugal and elsewhere, and providing public officials and community leaders with new tools for management and policy analysis.

The research group is also committed to the development of new methodologies to disseminate research results to society and to consolidate bridges between academia, policy makers and civil society.

1.2.3 Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC)

This Group centres its research on the modes of regulation and governance, encompassing state's intervention, markets and forms of collective action in the context of Europeanization and globalization trends. It is assumed that, in addition to the means used by governments to guarantee the rule of law and to promote public policies, new forms of public and private regulation are becoming increasingly relevant, based on cooperation, self-regulation and mobilization of social actors. Both formal modes and processes of regulation, including the legislative procedure, as well as "soft" law-making and informal modes of social and economic

(market) regulation are studied, with special attention to their impact on the citizens' individual rights and capacity of action, which they can promote or hinder. Among the domains under scrutiny are environmental and public health risks, ICT, financial markets, social policies.

This Group also provides a framework for research on science communication and public engagement, as well as the role and social responsibility of science and its actors, including researchers and research institutions, all of them actually increasingly asked to participate in regulatory processes. This is in line with the Centre's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers in order to better serve society. Economics has been especially concerned by this endeavour, but other scientific disciplines of relevance to the Centre – namely architecture and law – started similar lines of work.

Taking advantage of inputs from economics, jurisprudence, sociology, political science, architecture and computer science, these Research Group's thematic lines follow up from this backdrop, sustained by work developed in recent years at the Centre under projects BECOM, Value Isobars, Protect, Risks of S&T in the era of social networks, FESSUD, MORE-PE, OPEN-EC and RECON.

1.3. Some critical short-term contextual issues

The main activity and the short-term evolution as well as the main constraints associated to the activity of the research unit are presented on the Activity Report for 2018. However, there is a set of conjunctural contextual issues that are very important to the short-term evolution of DINAMIA'CET-IUL during 2019, that have to be highlighted previously to the enunciation of the main priorities and objectives for 2019 as they are essential to understand those options, and the difficulties faced by the research unit at administrative and financial levels.

- 1) The postponing by FCT of the finalization of the process of assessment of Research Units for 2019 had an important impact in the everyday life of D'C as it has significant implications for the funding of the unit. In effect, this new postponing, following the precedent one for 2018, prolonged the dramatic financial situation of D'C for another year, even if the expectations of a fairer and efficient assessment process, would give us expectations of a short term recovery as soon as the results of FCT external panel evaluation would be put in practice for the next few years. For now, as it is well-known from the precedent activity and accounting reports, the level of funding that the unit was used to (around 125-130 thousand euros, which corresponded roughly to the level of resources allocated to the unit's structure, particularly the technical staff) was severely diminished following the previous evaluation process (due to the contingencies of the evaluation process itself) regardless of the qualitative assessment of the Unit. That implied a drop to a funding of 75.000 euros/year from the FCT, which has been the sum annually transferred by the FCT in recent years. The financial survival of the research unit, despite its very limited budget in the recent years, has been facilitated by the transfer of funds from D'C and CET' previous private associations, funds that are now practically exhausted. The postponement of the effects of the new evaluation process (for the strategic plan 2018-2022) on funding (now, with this new postponement, with no real effect before 2020-2023), and the assumption of the "extension" of previous funding (at the level of 75000 euros) for this "transition" year of 2018 and 2019 by FCT has kept the research unit, for one more year, in a financial bottleneck situation. The current situation brings considerable challenges for the unit in 2019 (considering that the

financial “cushion” that has been mobilized in recent years has run out). A short term “loan” by ISCTE-IUL, such as happened in 2018 (in practice, advancing approximately the correspondent value of overheads that ISCTE is retaining now until the conclusion of running projects) would be a possible solution for this year again.

- 2) The internal administrative and financial management norms that have been imposed by ISCTE-IUL in recent years, concerning the management of research projects, are still strongly aggravating the situation described in the previous item. Particularly, the administrative norm which imposes the retention by ISCTE-IUL of an overhead of typically c. 10% of total funding of each project till the formal account closing of the project (in practice, enabling the research units to access the overheads of the project only at the end of the project) is strongly conditioning the access to the own revenue to the Unit. Even in the case of growth in the research projects and contracts granted (which is the current case) this growth would not be reflected in financial terms in the Unit sooner than 2 or 3 years later. Negotiations are being held with the governing team of ISCTE-IUL in order to overcome this problem.
- 3) With the centralization of several operations, throughout the last years, in particular the acquisition of services or goods, now processed by ISCT-IUL central departments, procedures became more bureaucratic and time consuming. This brings about a heavier workload for the carrying out of many administrative task, which impacts in the first place on the working conditions of the administrative staff of the unit.
- 4) In parallel to these three issues, the human resources situation, in terms of the technical staff, is still a major problem to be solved. The exit of an experienced and important member in the staff structure of DC in November 2017 (which was not yet substituted due to the financial constraints felt by the research unit – despite negotiations with the central structure of ISCTE-IUL) had significant impact on the everyday life of D'C, challenging the practical capacity to timely fulfill all the compromises required in terms of financial, administrative management of the research unit and its projects. A new person (Mafalda Pífano) was hired by means of a S&T management grant, for some months (using the remaining funds from some projects). However, the situation is not desirable given the precariousness of the labour link, nor sustainable in the short term. In fact, without the support of ISCTE-IUL central structure, justifiable given the transfer of functions from ISCTE-IUL to D'C that this member of staff is fulfilling (notably Management of the new Political

Economy doctoral program), it will be difficult to maintain this human resource (the situation is in negotiation with the central structure of ISCTE-IUL) . Other humanresources related problems (such as the increasing rigidity of ISCTE-IUL central human resources department towards schedule management and external work) are affecting the daily life and the productivity of some of the resources. Regardless the openness to discussion from the central structure of ISCTE-IUL concerning all of these problems, the fact is that negotiations show, for the moment, no clear signs of results. The need for new specialized human resources is identified in the strategic plan (considering, additionally, the growth of the Unit in terms of members and research projects), and application for funding for that purpose has been made in that framework. However, in the short term, a transitory solution needs to be worked out.

- 5) Finally, D'C is confronted with serious limitations in terms of the physical space available for the activities of its researchers, in particular work spaces, as already explained in last year's Action Plan. With the increasing number of researchers (new employment contracts, more scholarships, more PhD researchers,...) and the raise in the number of projects (most of them hiring also full-time human-resources, even if temporarily), this problem became even more acute. The governing structure of ISCTE-IUL shows concern towards this problem, and a new building for research is being programmed and will be adapted, but it will not be available, in the best scenario, before the end of 2020. Meanwhile, there are important space requirements that need to be solved, even if by the means of transitory solutions.

2. MAIN GOALS FOR 2019

2.1. Framing in the global strategy to 2018-2022

D'C strategic goals have been designed on the basis of its legacy of theoretical and empirical research, and accumulated experience of co-operation with other national and international research units, and collaboration with public entities and civil society since it was founded.

Generally, major goals defined in its mid-term strategic plan (which was submitted to FCT within the framework of the assessment process and funding application for the period 2018-2022) commit D'C to research work on cross-cutting and comprehensive topics addressing the key dynamics of contemporary socio-economic and territorial change and the inherent challenges for regulation and governance; to the mobilization of its researchers for innovation in research and communication methods, for intra- and interdisciplinary dialogue, and for strengthened co-operation with their national, foreign and international counterparts in research; as well as to openness to society.

A brief overview of the main strategic goals and features for the period 2018-2022 can be consulted on Box 1 and Box 2 (full document: see Annex I)

Box 1. Summary of the plan of activities 2018-2022

(from the FCT application – 10.3)

Mission:

DINÂMIA'CET-IUL (D'C) performs advanced international and comparative research, framed by a sustainable development approach, while pledging to increase knowledge about the Portuguese society. Working on an interdisciplinary basis - gathering economics, sociology, law, architecture, regional and urban planning, anthropology, geography, management, quantitative methods - it seeks to contribute to the understanding of the contemporary world and to the design of the future. At the core of its research are the dynamics underlying socioeconomic and territorial change, their genesis in the inter-play between collective public and private actors operating in different domains, as well as their impact, notably in spatial terms.

Organization:

The pillars of D'C's activities are its three Research Groups (RGs), each of them endowed with a strong scientific identity reflected in their Thematic Lines (TL):

- Innovation and Labour (IL); two TLs: Innovation; Labour;

- Cities and Territories (CT); six TLs: Creativity, Culture and Territory; Representations and Discourse on Architecture and Territory; Ways of Living, Society and Architectural Culture; Recompositions, Metropolitan Change, and Housing; Territorial Governance, Spatial Planning and Socio-spatial Intervention; Urban Morphology and Sustainability;

- Governance, Economy and Citizenry (GEC); two TLs: Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges; Reflexivity, Communication and Social Responsibility of Science.

D'C seeks to take advantage of the theoretical and methodological correspondences existing between these three RGs by developing three crosscutting Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL): Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies; Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies; Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies.

Team:

D'C recently experienced strong growth, from 48 PhD integrated researchers (IR) in 2013 to 78 nowadays.

Strategic Research Priorities 2018-2022:

D'C research programme, carried out within its three RGs, and having in view its three ITL, will seek to address, primarily, the following crosscutting issues: (a) the main dynamics governing the fundamental changes in sustainability transitions; (b) the current changes in metropolitan spaces, recomposition, gentrification and touristification processes; (c) the drivers of job creation and job quality at the levels of firms and of individuals; (d) the exercise by European citizens of their political and social rights and the design of regulative frameworks likely to mitigate the impact of the current financialization; (e) risk regulation experiences in the environmental and related domains, aiming at safeguarding intangible values such as privacy; (f) the prospects for new methodological approaches, intertwining research, experimentation and practical implementation; (g) the impact of current societal dynamics on the scientific domain itself.

Internationalization:

D'C will intensify its internationalization efforts, in particular by promoting new international research and publication projects, encouraging its members to publish in international journals, and, apart from strengthening links with the English, French and Germanspeaking scientific worlds, developing co-operation with researchers of other linguistic areas, in particular of Portuguese speaking countries.

Advanced Training:

D'C will give continuity to its ten Master's and three already functioning PhD programmes. The new PhD programme in the field of Political Economy will be launched in 2019-2020. To design a new PhD programme in Territorial Planning on an international collaborative basis. In order to better articulate teaching and research, D'C will continue to integrate, whenever possible, doctoral and master students in its research projects, publishing work, and meetings it organizes.

Dissemination:

Apart from standard scientific dissemination strategies, D'C will continue to publish its peer-reviewed journals *CIDADES*, *Comunidades e Territórios* and *Passagens*, and to develop its new website, its newsletter, as well as other means for documenting scientific activity. It will also encourage innovative methods in research communication, encouraging open science practices and public engagement in science.

Social impact:

While fostering awareness on social responsibility of science among its members, D'C intends to intensify knowledge transfer to society, in particular through the involvement of stakeholders in the research process, associating communities as subjects in research. Hence the deployment of new methodologies likely to foster the creation of useful knowledge useful for agents' action and policy-making, and to have an impact on the very design of the research projects.

Partnerships:

Several initiatives of D'C were set up in co-operation with other research units in Portugal and in other countries, a set of partnerships which is to be enlarged. Beside this network of academic partners, D'C will continue to develop partnerships with non-academic actors.

Management and Staff:

D'C Board of Directors - Director and two Vice-Directors - works in permanent contact with RG Coordinators and is advised by the D'C Scientific Board and External Advisory Board. The Board of Directors supervises D'C permanent staff. The staff supports research activities in administrative, financial, project management, scientific monitoring, communication and editorial matters.

Finance:

As already noted, D'C experienced considerable financial cuts as a result of 2013 FCT evaluation exercise, despite recognition of solid scientific merits. The impact of these cuts is exacerbated by the fact that the Centre's staff's salaries have to be fully supported by the Unit. Urgent increase of the financial resources is needed, with strategic priority to new research projects; but public support appears crucial, mainly as leverage for the success of this strategy.

Box 2. Description of the plan of activities for 2018-2022

(From the FCT application – 11.1 and 11.2)

I) Objectives and strategy of the R&D Unit for 2018-2022

A. Broad objectives and strategy of D'C

In line with D'C's commitment to analyze, on an interdisciplinary basis, the dynamics underlying socio-economic and territorial change, its Research Groups (RGs) will focus on the transition of large sociotechnical systems, e.g. energy and food systems, to face the environmental challenge; the combination, in emerging technological and ecological areas, of knowledge and social and moral values to produce creative and desirable solutions for changing societies; the transformations at the workplace and the labour inequalities and vulnerabilities; the urban and territorial dynamics and the ways cities are shaped and planned; and the plural forms of regulation and their interferences with fundamental human rights.

Indeed, the pillars of D'C activities are the RGs, each of them endowed with a strong scientific identity. However, D'C also seeks to take full advantage of the theoretical and methodological correspondences existing between them. Three Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL) were defined in 2013. A survey of the individual working programmes of D'C members carried out in 2017 confirmed the accuracy of this device and allowed to improve its coherence and its adequacy in relation to the Horizon 2020 Programme. Hence the new formulation of the three lines:

(a) Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies: relating topics such as technological innovation; innovative milieus; experience of environmental, economic and social pressures.

(b) Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies: relating topics such as changes in the design and implementation of public policies in times of regional and transnational integration processes; changes in corporate governance and in labour relations in times of financialization and technological revolutions; changes in territorial governance.

(c) Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies: relating topics such as forms of inhabiting; forms of appropriation of the public space; mobilization of rights, cultural, technological, scientific and artistic creativity.

B. D'C's intended contributions to knowledge

D'C research programme, carried out within its three RGs, considering the three ITL, will seek to meet the following crosscutting concerns, some of them identified as priorities of the Horizon 2020 Programme:

(a) Understand the main dynamics governing the fundamental changes in sustainability transitions, in particular, in the urban development domain, spatial planning, cities' metabolism, forms of inhabiting, mobility and energetic efficiencies, the transition of the energy system (in particular, renewable energies) and of the food system.

(b) Understand the current changes in metropolitan spaces - in particular in the Lisbon case, challenged by intense recomposition, gentrification and touristification processes - and the social, economic, political, cultural and environmental dynamics behind these changes and the responses to them.

(c) Understand the drivers of job creation and job quality - at the levels of firms and of individuals - with a particular emphasis on the impact of digitalization, the changes of collective bargaining systems in Europe, how the EU countries address nowadays the issue of youth unemployment, and how different Vocational Education and Training systems can contribute to different patterns of unemployment, in order to better grasp inclusive and skill enhancing reforms.

(d) Understand how European citizens have been exercising their political and social rights in the wake of the economic crisis, and what kind of economic policies and regulative frameworks may mitigate the impact of the financialization process of the past decades and may support an environmentally and socially sustainable development trajectory.

(e) Investigate to what extent risk regulation experiences in the environmental and related domains can provide critical backdrop for pondering the limitations as well as the opportunities of novel risk-based regulatory aiming at safeguarding intangible values such as privacy.

(f) Assess the prospects for new approaches, intertwining research, experimentation and practical implementation, mobilizing innovative multidisciplinary theoretical and methodological frameworks, and gathering researchers, policy makers, practitioners and civil society in university-industry-public administration-civil society collaborations.

(g) Take advantage, in the analysis of current societal dynamics, of the reflexive survey of the scientific domain itself, to which D'C, its members and the disciplines they practice, belong; by specific research, as well as by taking the ongoing academic activity as a field for participant observation, while enhancing the validity of this exercise's results by comparison with other domains (e.g. non-academic jobs, journalism, legal professions), and by international comparison.

C. Internationalization

D'C will strengthen its internationalization efforts, particularly by:

- (a) Promoting new international research and publication projects, notably by structuring and mobilizing already established relevant networks; participating in such projects;
- (b) Enhancing the capability of D'C to take the lead of such projects;
- (c) Supporting the setting up of applications to highly competitive international calls (ERC, H2020, etc);
- (d) Encouraging its members to publish in international journals, and to participate actively in internationally operating networks and scientific associations;
- (e) Inviting internationally recognized specialists in D'C domains of interest;
- (f) Apart from strengthening links with the English, French, and German-speaking scientific worlds, developing the co-operation with researchers of other linguistic areas, in particular of Portuguese-speaking countries.

D. Advanced training

- (a) While carrying further with existing 2nd and 3rd cycle programmes, D'C and five other research centres have submitted, in collaboration with the Universities of Coimbra and Lisbon and ISCTE-IUL as leading Institution, a proposal of a PhD programme in Political Economy, matching particularly well with D'C's scientific programme. This programme recently received the recommendation for approval, under the condition of reformulating its name.
- (b) D'C plans to design and propose a PhD programme in Territorial Planning on an international collaborative basis.
- (c) In order to better articulate teaching and research, D'C will continue to integrate, whenever possible, doctoral and master students in its research projects and in its collaborative publishing work, and will organize research seminars devoted, for instance, to the presentation of theses' results (e.g. seminar cycle of Contemporary Issues in Economic Theory and Policy in the PhD in Economics, in the Architecture PhD programme seminars, each linked to a CT thematic line, or the Transdisciplinary Research Seminar in the new above mentioned PhD programme).

E. Promotion of science and dissemination of research results

D'C dissemination strategy is meant to be enlarged by appealing both to more conventional circuits and to innovative methods in order to reach broader audiences and consolidate the existing internal and external D'C community. In particular:

- (a) Concerning standard scientific dissemination strategies, while strongly encouraging publication in high-ranking academic journals, D'C maintains its activity of regular publications produced in-house. It will continue to publish its peer-reviewed D'C working papers series and its journals on an open-access basis, promoting new indexations for *Cidades, Comunidades e Territórios* (now indexed in SciELO, IBSS, Latindex, EBSCO, RCAAP and OpenEdition);
- (b) D'C will develop its new website, as well as its weekly, monthly and yearly routines documenting its scientific activity, increasing their impact through more efficient, inclusive and up to date techniques and methods (newsletter, digital social networks, short videos).

(c) D'C will strengthen the mobilization of researchers for innovative methods in research communication, encouraging open science practices and awareness of the social responsibility of science.

F. Transfer of research findings to society - The social impact of D'C research

D'C will intensify direct knowledge transfer to society, through the involvement of stakeholders in the research process, the production of project summaries and policy papers, and the organization of workshops with members of local authorities and councils. It sticks to its commitment to associate communities as research subjects. This encompasses the deployment of new methodologies likely to foster the creation of useful knowledge facilitating agents' action and policy-making, and often with an impact on the very design of research projects - e.g. in urban and social policy design. For this reason, too, D'C focuses on the evolution of regulation modes and governance practices, as well as on the interdependence between knowledge and policy making. This approach, among other outputs, is providing relevant social actors with tools to develop policy actions and to engage citizens in policy and research (e.g. research about urban regeneration, Internet governance in the big data age; the regulation of the financial sector in an era of financialization, or the impact of European structural and investment funds on the performance of firms).

G. Networks and Partnerships

Several D'C initiatives (research projects, PhD programmes, conferences) were set co-operation with other research units in Portugal and in other countries, aof partnerships which shall be enlarged. Beside this network of academic partners, D'C will continue to develop partnerships with non-academic actors, in particular municipalities. D'C will maintain these policies, increasing visibility of established co-operative links in the information circulated about its activities, and on its website.

II. Organization of the R&D Unit for 2018-2022

A. Research Groups (RG)

D'C gathers researchers from a wide range of academic backgrounds (economics, sociology, law, architecture, regional and urban planning, anthropology, geography, management, quantitative methods, among others). Pluridisciplinarity and interdisciplinarity have been a hallmark of D'C since its founding, expressed in most of its projects/activities and reinforced by the merger between DINÂMIA and CET - Centre for Territorial Studies in 2009, and by the subsequent incorporation of the architecture researchers' nucleus of ISCTE-IUL. These specific characteristics of D'C justify the organization in three RG in order to create a baseline to structure this scientific diversity, but also to ensure scientific consistency. D'C RG were recently restructured in the light of the new socioeconomic challenges identified after the crisis but also in light of the points raised by the previous R&D units evaluation process. The restructured RG are: (i) Innovation and Labour; (ii) Cities and Territories; (iii) Governance, Economy and Citizenry. Each of these RG is coordinated by a team of researchers and has distinct research agendas, drawing upon well-defined thematic lines of analysis, reflecting their scientific identity. Each thematic line has its own coordinator.

RG and their thematic lines are:

1. Innovation and Labour:

1.1. Innovation (Salavisa);

1.2. Labour (H. Lopes).

2. Cities and Territories

2.1. Creativity, Culture and Territory (P. Costa);

2.2. Representations and Discourse on Architecture and Territory (P.T. Pinto);

2.3. Ways of Living, Society and Architectural Culture (Milheiro);

2.4. Recompositions, Metropolitan Change, and Housing (T. Pinto, Pereira, Gato);

2.5. Territorial Governance, Spatial Planning and Socio-spatial Intervention (Ferreiro, Henriques);

2.6. Urban Morphology and Sustainability (Marat-Mendes).

3. Governance, Economy and Citizenry

3.1. Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges (A. Costa);

3.2. Reflexivity, Communication and Social Responsibility of Science (Guibentif).

B. Integrating Thematic Lines (ITL)

The consistency between the three RG is promoted by the ITL introduced in section 11.1.

(a) Innovation and Transition to Sustainable Societies;

(b) Regulatory and Governance Challenges for Complex Societies;

(c) Creative and Participative Lives in Empowered Societies.

D'C ITL are conceived as light structures, to be implemented by (1) a specific section of the D'C website dedicated to each of them, gathering links to all D'C initiatives related to the line's topic; (2) for each ITL, one conference in the second half of 2018-2022, combining sessions addressing a broader audience and gathering researchers and practitioners, and sessions debating possible cross-fertilization between the theoretical and methodological approaches developed by the different RG. The identification of relevant RG and D'C initiatives, and the organization of the ITL conferences, would be among the main missions of the scientific manager whom D'C hopes to hire through the pluri-annual funding it is now applying for.

C. Promoting a Shared Vision: Crosscutting Actions in DINÂMIA'CET-IUL

The organization of D'C activities aiming at ensuring the productive involvement of the three RG and their thematic lines, and the effective development of the three ITL, comprises four layers.

(a) Transversally to all D'C structures, the R&D Unit has a permanent staff of five people (four at this moment, due to the promotion of one staff member, who left D'C to move to the ISCTE-IUL Rectorate staff; the effective replacement of this person, and the gathering of the required financial means is top priority of D'C Management), to support the research activities in administrative, financial, project management, scientific monitoring, communication and editorial matters.

(b) D'C communicates about its activities through several channels (D'C website, social media, monthly newsletter, and mailing list), not only externally to D'C, maintaining contact and

transferring research results into the community, but also internally, reinforcing the awareness of RG and individual members about the work being carried out at D'C.

(c) D'C organizes an internal annual workshop and periodic thematic seminars. These events are promoted and open to all scientific community to attend. D'C intends to better structure this layer of activity, aiming at the organization of one thematic seminar per semester, for each RG, so as to more intensely involve all members of the different thematic lines. The annual workshops' main goal is to involve the members of all research groups to present their recent research results to the other members of the three research groups, and to find potential synergies and bridges among them. This practice has been successfully implemented now for three years. It will be continued, with a new emphasis on its overture to a broader non-academic audience.

(d) A fourth layer of management, coordination and involvement with research activities comprehends D'C editorial activities, which include several publications open to submissions from the whole scientific community, but where D'C members are also encouraged to submit papers (the academic journals *CIDADES*, *Comunidades e Territórios* and *Passagens*, the Working Paper Series, and the occasional publication of books). *Passagens* is a scientific journal focused on metropolitan territories, linked to the PhD Programme in Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories, and with a close partnership with São Paulo University. D'C also supports the Portuguese Journal of Social Science (financial contribution; participation in its editorial board). These publications present yet another opportunity for D'C members to publish their own research results, but also to know the work developed by other D'C members in detail and to get more engaged in D'C research activities.

D. Governance

D'C Board of Directors consists of a team of three researchers, the Director and two Vice-directors. Its main duties are: institutional representation of D'C, in particular in ISCTE-IUL government bodies; strategic and operational management; staff supervision; RG activities monitoring; development of the required researchers' and staff evaluation schemes; coordination of the D'C communication policy, namely producing the D'C monthly Newsletter editorials. DC Board of Directors works in permanent contact with the RG Coordinators, with the support and advice of the DC Scientific Board, which meets about six times a year, and taking into account the yearly evaluation of the D'C External Advisory Board.

This general strategic framework for the period 2018-2022 is assumed as the structural background framework for the 2019's activity plan, and can be translated into a set of goals within which **three main levels** can be distinguished, to be presented in the three following sections:

1. The main scientific objectives to be pursued by the Unit
2. The main mid-term operative goals linked to the Unit's strategic programme
3. Specific goals established for 2019

2.2. The main scientific objectives that are pursued by the Unit

The research unit scientific goals are those inherent to the mission and the collective scientific identity of its research programmes as described in section 1. The specific scientific objectives pursued by each Research Group, which are defined along Thematic Lines (assumed as mid-term research streamlines that can comprise several research programmes, materialized in different research projects, both collective and individual), are presented in detail in part 3 of this Action Plan, for each Research Group, respectively.

In the research activities of the three RGs priority will be given throughout the year 2019 to those more narrowly linked to the seven "Contributions to Knowledge" announced in the D'C Plan of Activities for 2018-2022 (Objectives and Strategy, point B; see Annex, as well as publication *Dinâmia'CET – Activities 2013-2018 and Strategy*, Lisbon, May 2019).

2.3. The main mid-term operative goals that are linked to the Unit's strategic programme

This is a set of pragmatic objectives² that are linked to the development of the research centre and to its expected activity in this period (many of them already identified and pursued in precedent years), which include:

- a) Consolidation of transversal work and collaborative practices which have been promoted in recent years in the unit, among researchers and between research groups,

(Particularly with (i) a new edition – the 5th - of the Workshop D'C, (ii) the development of projects and projects proposals crossing different groups, (iii) the dynamization of the 3 new integrated thematic lines in D'C activities; (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point A).
- b) Improvement in the requirements for individual research development plans in the Unit (associated to membership conditions and to pluriannual individual researchers assessment scheme) and enhancement of its attractiveness to young high-potential researchers (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point A);
- c) Increase in research projects contracts, assuming the need to explore diversification of research funding opportunities, reducing the dependence on specific funding bodies (particularly FCT), aiming to strengthen the application to calls for European funding mechanisms (particularly but not exclusively H2020) and the application for applied projects for public and private institutions, and, whenever possible in the case applications involving networks of centers, to take the lead in the setting up of such applications (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point C);
- d) Increase in publications, particularly (but not exclusively) in indexed peer-reviewed journals and books with international dissemination;

(Despite financial constraints, which will continue limiting the individual support to members in 2019, an effort will continue to be made to provide better financing conditions to facilitate this purpose for integrated researchers and also for research assistants) (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point C);

- e) Development of research networks and improvement of the Unit's role as a platform for hosting visitors and supporting internationalization initiatives (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point C);
- f) Strengthening the relation between research and advanced training;

(e.g., with the launching of the 1st edition of Political Economy interdisciplinary PhD program; with another edition of DATMC (Architecture PhD programme) seminars linked to D'C Thematic Lines, resulting in the edition of a final publication; with seminar cycles in several PhD and Master programmes; with presentation of theses' results in unit's seminars, with exhibitions of work developed by students in specific courses, etc.)
(Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point D);
- g) Growing dissemination of research results in academic events, both national and internationally;

(Despite financial constraints, which will continue limiting the individual support to members in 2019, an effort will continue to be made to provide better financing conditions to facilitate this purpose for integrated researchers and also for research assistants) (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point E);
- h) Reaching broader audiences and overall society, both by improving communication of research results to non-academic audiences and by the active involvement of stakeholders and civil society in the projects' communication design (Strategic Plan 2018-2022, Objectives and Strategy, point F);
- i) Development of research networks and improvement of the Unit's role as a platform for hosting visitors and supporting internationalization initiatives (worth being repeated here, for also aiming at the fulfillment of Objectives and Strategy, point G of the Strategic Plan 2018-2022);
- j) Consolidation and strengthening of the technical support staff working at the research unit, improving specialized professionalization and enhancing skills at the several domains required to a growing research unit (projects management, financial management, science & technology management, communication, publishing, etc.)
- k) To improve the relational and organizational conditions (research conditions; careers; full/partial time; generational issues, ...)

2.4. Specific goals established for 2019

Short term objectives which were set up to be put into practice during 2019, include:

- a) First measures of implementation of the strategic plan for 2018-2022, which has been the result of a strategic reflection process started in 2016 about the scientific identity of the Unit, including the putting into practice of mechanisms that enable permanent self-monitoring of the Unit's activity.

(This is expected to include, amongst other aspects, the transposition of the adopted strategic principles to all the communication channels (e.g. continue updating of website and other communication materials, institutional reports, etc., notably integrating the results of the reflexivity process on D'C scientific identity and on the individual relation of each researcher with it), as well as the operationalization of its principles (e.g. implementation of the integrating thematic lines; internal reflexive discussions in each RG about their thematic lines, etc). (It is important to notice that some of the strategic actions considered in the action plan 2018-2022 - such as the settlement of observatories, the hiring of PhD researchers, or the setting of new incentive mechanisms to researchers, among other examples – are conditioned by the transfer of the funding deriving from the FCT evaluation procedure, which results have been recently made public (mid-June 2019). The research units should not have access to these funds before 2020, so that most of those actions will not have any opportunity to be held during 2019, and will be postponed to 2020 and following years, due to the financial and human resources constraints faced by the unit).

- b) The preparation and carrying out of the institutional assessment of the research unit under the ongoing FCT evaluation process.

The present report is finalized after the conclusion of this process. So it has on this point to give an account of activities already carried out. Due to the strategic importance of this evaluation process for the mid/long term evolution of the Unit, it had to be, this year 2019 again, the main focus of attention of the institutional structure and of the technical staff. It required the elaboration of new documents presenting the unit, and the meticulous preparation of the visit of the evaluation panel.

- c) Negotiation with the central structure of ISCTE-IUL of short/medium-term funding conditions which enable D'C to get financial liquidity in the short-term, in particular to

overcome the impossibility of getting access to the own revenue generated by the growth of research projects managed by the research unit (without having to await the conclusion of those projects to be able to access their overheads) or considering any other mitigating solutions for this problem (see above point 1.2: short-term contextual issues).

- d) Negotiation with the central structure of ISCTE-IUL of space conditions which enable the provision of workplaces for the new necessities generated by the new researchers and new projects of the research unit (specific short-term needs must be addressed, despite the promises assumed by ISCTE-IUL for medium-term necessities, in the new premises under construction) (see above point 1.2: short-term contextual issues).
- e) Reinforcement of the technical structure of the research unit and their specialized skills, and refinement of the attributions and competences of each member of the Unit's technical support team.

End of 2018 and in early 2019, discussions took place with the staff members, in order to better define each member profile. Negotiations with ISCTE-IUL's central structure on the possibility of launching new labour contracts have to be continued. In effect, specialized human resources are urgently required in the fields of financial and project management, as well as information management. Progressively more dedicated support should be devoted to prospection for funding opportunities, to dissemination of intra- and extra-unit information, and to the increase of D'Cs publication series.

- f) Enhancement of the functioning of the organizational structure of D'C, particularly at the level of the scientific management of the research groups and its Thematic lines, as well as of the new integrative transversal thematic lines. A discussion process within each research group will be started, in order to enhance the efficiency of its functioning, the involvement of all researchers, and the articulation of individual and collective research agendas. It is expected that this process will culminate also in a discussion on the coordinators of research groups and facilitators of thematic lines, with eventual refreshment of these teams, if considered adequate by the RGs. A clear attribution of responsibilities for promoting the three integrating thematic lines, with the nomination of coordinators (or coordination teams) for each of these lines, will also be part of this enhancement of the organizational structure.
- g) Developing of a commemorative program celebrating the 30 years of DINAMIA (acknowledging the more recent merging with CET and other groups of researchers that now constitute DINAMIA'CET-IUL), including the setting up of a calendar with 4 main

events: a) Dynamization of integrating thematic lines, with the designation of the respective facilitators/coordinators, responsible for their dynamization; b) Organization of an Internal Retreat, outside ISCTE-IUL, involving all researchers, in fall 2019, with the objective of further internal reflection within each Research Group and its thematic lines; c) launching of a call for papers, in autumn 2019, associated to the organization of an international conference to be held in Spring 2020, structured around the three integrating transversal thematic lines; d) publication of a book with the results of this process, end 2020.

- h) Development of a system for monitoring and assessing the research activity of full-time contract researchers

(Answering a demand of the former Rectorate, a draft regulation for the assessment of researchers activity was produced by the end of 2017 through the effort of a task force that was appointed by D'C management. Following the several changes in ISCTE-IUL's policy concerning this issue, and after the elaboration of internal norms in 2017, a process of discussion of this issue was re-launched by ISCTE-IUL rectorate, requesting again the collaboration of the research units in the preparation of a unified/central assessment system. D'C will continue contributing to this discussion, based on the existing draft.

- i) Revision of internal functioning norms and D'C regulation, concerning the updating of membership statutes (including the categories of members and the respective attributions/responsibilities in light of new FCT requirements), as well as the RG coordinators attributions

(Clarification of such rules and procedures have been developed and will be regulated; RG coordinators role should be explicit in the Unit's regulation, following an ISCTE-IUL Rectorate request)

- j) Conclusion of the processes of cleaning of the physical files of the Unit (with the selection of books and publications of old projects to be donated to the library of the ISCTE-IUL), and of transition of the management of the computer park to the central services of the ISCTE-IUL, as well as the improvement of the digital archive of the materials produced in the carrying out of the D'C research projects;
- k) Improvement of DINAMIA'CET's information system, including the development of a comprehensive, updated and user friendly database with the scientific activities of all its members, which can be easily mobilized for monitoring the research unit's activity, with

a versatility that enable more flexible analytical dimensions, but ensuring long-run comparison and homogeneous criteria.

(For this, it is essential to continue to explore the potential of articulation of the internal system – based on the recollection of information annually through “Fichas individuais de investigador” - with ISCTE-IUL's information systems, particularly Ciencia-IUL, Fenix and i-meritus platforms, where most of the researchers are expected to enter information about their activity, in the various fields of their academic and scientific activity. A better articulation with this, in the sequence of what was already made during 2018, will simplify the internal processes of recollection, classification and treatment of information, not dispensing, however, for now, the direct collection of some specific information with the researchers, not covered by these sources).

- l) Preparation of a new D'C publishing/editing line (e-books), in parallel to the enhancement of the WP series and the development of further indexation of CCT Journal.
- m) Development of a monitoring system for the social impacts of the activity of the unit (Conceptual and empirical work will be pursued on this, including the implementation of routines and data systematization practices, which should allow to map, control and disseminate the social impacts of the activity of the Centre)
- n) Improvement of the monitoring system for the academic impacts of the activity of the unit and its researchers

(Conceptual and empirical work will be developed on this, including the implementation of routines, data systematization practices, and development of an appropriate and efficient database, which help to understand, map and better systematize the diversity of academic outputs of the centre and the multiple results of its researchers' activity. This will also require a better coordination with ISCTE-IUL information system in these matters: Ciência-IUL)

- o) Dissemination and implementation of the ethical principles of DINAMIA'CET-IUL, codified within the framework of the design of the Unit's strategic programme (point 13). This will include the setting up of an internal researchers meeting/seminar on this topic during 2019.

3. RESEARCH GROUPS

3.1. INNOVATION AND LABOUR (IL)

This Group aims to study two interdependent domains (Innovation and Labour) and their interconnections. Sustainable growth comprises environmental, economic, social and political dimensions that have to be dealt with in an interrelated manner. It is assumed that the current growth regime is in stake since it is undermining some of its major pillars, such as the responsible use of resources (namely natural resources) and social cohesion.

Methodological pluralism is a key feature of this Group. It combines qualitative and quantitative approaches; uses innovative data analysis techniques to deal with both approaches (e.g. social network analysis, fsQCA and fuzzy cluster analysis); and makes use of appropriate econometric tools to analyse the datasets. Another key feature is the combination of theoretical work with empirical research, drawing on comparative analysis.

3.1.1. Innovation (Coord: Isabel Salavisa)

The team members continue to work on topics related to: the creation and diffusion of scientific and technological knowledge and innovation; the creation of knowledge-intensive firms, academic spin-offs and other; the transformation of large sociotechnical systems, like the energy system and the food system in the transition to sustainability; and the emergence and role of actors, values, norms, policies and forms of governance in these processes. This team also addresses other topics, like intellectual capital management.

Most of the research is supported by empirical analysis, resorting to different quantitative and qualitative techniques - econometrics, case studies and social network analysis – and a large array of data, both primary and secondary.

More specifically, the team members target the following theoretical and empirical goals:

1. Creation of scientific and technological knowledge

- Study the creation, dissemination and use of knowledge in emerging technological areas, such as renewable energies (wind, solar and ocean-based)

2. Dissemination of knowledge

- Study the university-industry collaborations;
- Analyse the commercialization of academic knowledge;
- Study the entrepreneurial performance of academic spin-offs;
- Explore the role of academic spin-offs as intermediators between higher education organizations and business.

3. Patterns of spatial diffusion

- Analyse the determinants of the patterns of adoption/diffusion of sustainable energy technologies.

4. Impact of innovation

- Study the impact of innovation on society and economy (structural change and competitiveness);
- Analyse the impact of academic spin-offs on growth and regional development.

5. Emergence of knowledge-intensive firms

- Study the emergence and development of firms in the new technological fields.

6. Transitions to sustainability

- Study the transition of the energy system in a comparative perspective;
- Study the transition of the food system in a comparative perspective.

7. Intellectual capital management

- Develop a methodology to foster the introduction of intellectual capital management in the strategic management of the cities.

3.1.2. Labour (Coord: Fátima Suleman)

The team members continue to work in the topics targeting the analysis of the labour market in different perspectives. Some research focuses on theoretical and methodological issues. The goal is to re-examine traditional and new contributions from different disciplines to reflect on recent labour market outcomes. For this purpose, due attention is given to the institutionalist approach

and to the need for regulations of economic and social activities. In such a context, the research agenda includes macro and meso levels regulation but also regulations arising from employers.

Most of the research is supported by empirical analysis based on qualitative and quantitative data. Furthermore, the members attempt to reinforce the comparative perspective taking advantage of international datasets available to researchers. More specifically, the team members target the following theoretical and empirical goals:

1. The quality of work and jobs

- Re-examine theoretical models of firms' behaviours and their impacts on the quality of working life;
- Examine the firm-level and individual-level drivers of job quality and vulnerable workers in a comparative perspective using international datasets;
- Examine how digital work contributes to degrade the quality of work and increase unemployment;
- Examine the impact of country-level characteristics on workers categories.

2. Skill requirements in the labour market

- Explore theoretical and methodological issues to analyse skill needs;
- Analyse the skills required from higher education graduation;
- Analyse how firms acquire or develop skills.

3. Labour market regulation

- Analyse the collective bargaining systems in Europe;
- Explore the challenges of unions in the context of labour market flexibility;
- Examine changes in labour legislation and collective bargaining;
- Examine labour legislation for specific categories of workers.

3.2. CITIES AND TERRITORIES (C&T)

DESCRIPTION

This Group focuses its research on the territorial dimensions of contemporary socioeconomic, environmental and cultural change, analysing its complex restructuring mechanisms at the light of their spatiality, their territorial embeddedness and their spatial-morphological dimensions, framing them in the scope of the action towards the promotion of multidimensional sustainable development processes.

The deep restructurings which affected the organization of socioeconomic and physical systems since the 1970's, and their technological and socio-cultural drivers, raising the centrality of informational, cognitive and symbolic contents to these processes, brought new challenges to the way we conceptualize, empirically analyse, plan and develop public policies for urban and rural territories. The complexity of movements and rationalities behind centripetal and centrifugal dynamics which affect urban systems and the organization of metropolitan spaces today raise also new questionings and challenges to the ways cities are shaped and planned and how academics can develop tools to understand and act in increasingly complex systems and develop tools to promote their resilience. This research group invests in the disentangling of these processes, through a variety of themes (e.g, the urban form, the creative dynamics, the ways of inhabiting, the recomposition processes, the urban representations,...) and empirical contexts (from the in depth analysis of Portuguese metropolitan areas and cities, to comparative analysis with European or Lusophone cities, for example), favouring an interdisciplinary perspective which is nurtured by this research group's diversity.

The Cities and Territories Research Group strategy for deepening the knowledge about the dynamics of change in these spatial and territorial terms is based on the acknowledgment of the diversity of logics, processes and actors that produce and appropriate these processes. This is always done from a triple perspective, involving (i) the analysis of the "dynamics" themselves; (ii) the understanding of the regulation and planning issues and the aspects related to urban/territorial action and "policy-making"; and (iii), a "reflexive" consciousness of the way these spaces are worked and how they are studied.

This encompasses a permanent concern with the deployment of new planning methodologies and ideas in urban and social policy design, often based on research-action processes, and fostering the creation of useful knowledge to facilitate agents' action and policy-making, concerning urban planning and regional/local development strategies in Portugal and elsewhere, and providing public officials and community leaders with new tools for management and policy analysis.

The research group is also committed to the development of new methodologies to disseminate research results to society and to consolidate bridges between academia, policy makers and civil society.

THEMATIC LINES

3.2.1. Creativity, culture and territory (Criatividade, Actividades Culturais e Território)

(Coord: Pedro Costa)

This Thematic Line carries out fundamental and applied research on the role of the arts and culture in fostering development, the competitiveness of territories and urban revitalization from both a historic and contemporary perspective. It seeks to understand the territoriality of these activities and creative dynamics, getting a perception of their organization and spatiality and, on the other hand, it strives to shed light on their multiple contributions to various aspects of sustainable development and the resilience of the territories.

The 5 research programmes within this TL are:

- A. Urban artistic interventions;
- B. Culture, knowledge, competitiveness and territorial development;
- C. Cultural districts and creative dynamics: new methodologies of analysis;
- D. Structuring cultural activities, pathways and publics;
- E. Creative tourism;
- F. Art, heritage and territories.

The main scientific objectives of this Thematic Line are:

- i) To develop conceptual and empirical work on the role of cultural activities in the promotion of territorial development and inform territorially-based cultural planning;
- ii) To develop conceptual and empirical work in order to understand the role of urban milieus in the development of creativity and cultural activities;
- iii) To develop conceptual and empirical work in the assessment of the multidimensional impacts and effects of cultural activities in terms of sustainable development processes.
- iv) To disentangle the socio-economic functioning of cultural activities, creation processes, audiences, and their relation with the territory (in specific empirical cases: e.g. performing arts, architecture, alternative music; photo festivals);
- v) To study and put in practice and test urban interventions and art in public spaces;
- vi) To study, conceptually and empirically, and to help the development of creative tourism practices, particularly in low-density areas;
- vii) To further explore the relation between art, heritage, architecture, history and territories;
- viii) To develop the exploration of new methodologies and concepts for artistic urban interventions and to enhance participation-research methodologies.

Goals of this Thematic Line for 2019 include the development of the objectives of the several ongoing collective research projects (Creatour, 4HCREATE, Parallel, Artsbank, Lousal) and new projects starting in 2019 (RESHAPE; Oeiras-Cultura; ARTEMREDE-Impactos1), and of the multiple individual (Post-Doc and PhD projects) in course in this thematic line. Several international conferences are being co-organized in 2019 (including the international 4HCREATE conference and spring seminar, at ISCTE and 3rd Creatour international conference in Faro) and at least two Thematic Line seminars are envisaged. Expected outputs include several international presentations, working papers, book chapters, papers in scientific peer-reviewed journals, as well as the submission of new projects. Exhibitions, urban interventions and audio-visual outputs are also expected results of the diverse projects.

3.2.2. Representations and discourse on architecture and territory (Representação e discurso na arquitectura e no território) (Coord: Paulo Tormenta Pinto)

This Thematic Line conducts research focused on discourse and representation in the practice and theory of architecture, primarily on questions related to the copyright and contextual interpretation of architectural work, taking a perspective that crosses the contemporary with the history of architecture and urbanism. This multiple interpretation of the various forms of representation and discourse is understood to be as important as the research line on the change of the territory and contemporary society.

The 4 research programmes within this line are:

- A. Representation of contemporary space;
- B. Architecture, landscape and territory
- C. Architecture and Portuguese architects: portraits and dynamics;
- D. Architectural practice and teaching.

The main scientific objectives of this Thematic Line are:

- i) Analysis of the territorial representation on architectural thought and on the discourse(s) of architecture;
- ii) Study of the authorial dimension of spatial development projects and their urban insertion;
- iii) Analysis of the representations of architecture in other fields (literature, cinema, etc.);
- iv) Study of architects' biographies and architecture schools, particularly in Portugal;
- v) Analysis of the meanings of authorial and popular architectures.
- vi) Reflexive analysis of the profession and of the pedagogical practices in architecture.

Goals for 2019 concerning the “Representations and discourse on architecture and territory” Thematic Line include the following-up of seminars fostering debate and critical assessment of PhD theses and the joint organization (with ISTAR-IUL) of the colloquium “Pragmatismo e Arquitetura”. The FCT funded projects “Printed Photography. Image and Propaganda in Portugal (1934-1974)” (in its final phase) and “GRANDS PROJECTS - AFTER Expo98 - The Grand Projects - Architectural and Urbanistic Operations after the 1998 Lisbon World Exposition” (in its initial phase), involving a large number of researchers, are central in the work of this thematic line during 2019.

3.2.3. Ways of Living, Society and Architectural Culture (Modos de Habitar, Sociedade e Cultura Arquitectónica) (Coord: Ana Vaz Milheiro)

This Thematic Line develops several sub-lines of research on the issues of architectural culture and history, housing and ways of living. The analysis carried out deals with the architectural production and the sociological presuppositions of architecture, considering the private and public initiatives, understanding local specificities, national and international realms.

Five research programmes are defined in the scope of this Thematic Line.

- A. Architectural culture, in contemporary and historical scopes;
- B. Housing, habitat and ways of living;
- C. Residential behaviour, social and housing re-composition in the metropolis;
- D. Post-colonial perspectives on Portuguese-speaking countries' urban growth;
- E. Rehabilitation, regeneration and urban revitalization.

The main scientific objectives of the Thematic Line are:

- i) Analysis of the private housing market dynamics, residential trajectories and their relationship with the social recomposition of territories and ways of inhabiting;
- ii) Support to the formulation, implementation and evaluation of public policies, including rehabilitation and urban regeneration;
- iii) Analysis of the morphologic dimension of housing projects and their urban insertion;
- iv) Study of the urban development processes in colonial and post-colonial contexts (with particular focus on Portuguese-speaking African countries, Macao and Brazil)

In 2019, researchers involved in the “Ways of Living: Society and Architectural Culture” thematic line will carry out a diversity of activities related to all its five research programmes by participating in conferences (presenting papers, attending as keynote speakers, etc.), publishing articles, organizing books, setting up exhibitions, organizing seminars, workshops, etc. Besides collective projects in course (Coast to Coast and MCMH, both funded by FCT), several ongoing PhD theses are being developed under this TL in ISCTE-IUL, both in ISCTE-IUL and other institutions.

3.2.4. Recompositions, metropolitan change and housing (Recomposições, mudança metropolitana e habitação) (Coord: Teresa Costa Pinto, M^a Assunção Gato and Sandra Marques Pereira)

This Thematic Line focuses on the understanding of contemporary housing systems, socioeconomic recompositions and metropolitan dynamics of change, taking into account the multiple impacts, interests, conflicts and associated values.

Five research programmes in the scope of this TL are:

- A. Structural social and economic recompositions in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area;
- B. Metropolization dynamics (peri-urban and suburban territories, small and medium-sized cities);
- C. Global processes of urban change (e.g. gentrification, touristification, financialization/commodification);
- D. City consumptions, life styles and quality of life;
- E. Housing, residential practices, markets and politics.

The main scientific objectives of this Thematic Line are:

- i) To understand the dynamics of recomposition and change in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area and to assess the several impacts resulting from these changes, while developing comparative analyses with other territories;
- ii) To understand the metropolitan transformation dynamics, with particular focus on suburban and peri-urban areas and on restructuring areas, not neglecting small and medium-sized cities;
- iii) To conceptualize and empirically inform the relations between territorial change and globalized processes of economic, social, and cultural transformation, focusing on the effects produced in cities and their populations;
- iv) To analyse socioeconomic and territorial recompositions in light with consumption practices, life styles and quality of life;
- v) To understand and analyse the contemporary housing and residential practices, in line with market transformations and public policies.

The team members continue to work on the topics targeting the housing, recompositions and territorial change analysis in different perspectives. In this sense, the current changes in Lisbon's housing and the awareness of their high speed require a new approach on their monitoring - the need to capture them in (almost) real time. For this purpose, some members of this TL are developing LXHABIDATA which is an open-source platform of georeferenced data on housing including different indicators to be collected/published quarterly. It has 4 main targets: citizens/civil society; public stakeholders; academics; real estate agents. The platform is built and will be soon available online. It's an innovative tool that fills a void in the academic and the wider urban context of Lisbon. For the same purpose, the organization of some scientific events is

already scheduled. Several researchers will also be involved in international and national events within the scope of the thematic line, as well as participating in activities and research programs with other universities. An international publication for Springer is being prepared (e.g. Urban Renewal, Gentrification and Globalisation: from North America to South Europe), and the publication of some articles in national and international journals is expected, given the different stages in which some are already within the scope of the publication process. In addition, several individual research projects are underway. Furthermore and taking advantage of the networks that emerge from these research initiatives, the members seek to strengthen their analytical and critical knowledge around the key issues that bring them together in this Thematic Line.

3.2.5. Territorial governance, spatial planning and socio-spatial intervention
(Governação territorial, ordenamento do território e intervenção socio-espacial)
(Coord: José Manuel Henriques and M^a Fátima Ferreiro)

The aim of this Thematic Line is to analyse (and whenever possible to participate in and/or evaluate) the formal and informal public intervention processes of spatial planning, strategic planning, master or specific plans, and to glean further knowledge on the rationale of socio-territorial interventions that result from either public initiative (or financing) or citizens' movements in response to concrete problems. It also strives to tackle questions of regional and local development in light of the endogenous and exogenous dynamics of the territories, examining the respective development strategies in terms of the negotiation of interests of the different (public and private) agents involved and the resulting rationale of regulations and governance.

Seven research programmes are defined in the scope of this Line for the period:

- A. Planning instruments and spatial planning;
- B. Socio-spatial intervention, social inclusion and community development;
- C. Territorial development and regional and local development policies;
- D. Planning and enhancing facilities and public spaces;
- E. Territorial management and metropolitan governance;
- F. Participation, associativism and citizenship;
- G. Innovative milieus, networks and territorial development.

The main scientific objectives of this Thematic Line are:

- i) To analyse the relationship between development, territorial cohesion and regional and local planning and policies;
- ii) To assess and help monitor public policies, namely at local/regional level, developing public advising in the diverse fields related to urban planning and territorial development
- iii) To help the design of public policies related with spatial planning and strategic planning of territories and cities;

- iv) To discuss governance issues and contribute to the theoretical development of the analysis on governance, public policies and planning methodologies;
- v) To understand the role of community rooted development mechanisms, participation and urban social movements;
- vi) To promote the deepening of the analysis of the governance processes of territorial systems and planning strategies;

The aim of this Thematic Line is to contribute to action in spatial planning processes and to develop knowledge on socio-territorial interventions that result from either public initiative (or financing) or citizens' movements in response to concrete problems. It also strives to tackle questions of territorial development examining agent's strategies concerning potential regulation and governance. The contemporaneous challenges concerning agency, social innovation and transdisciplinary research for capacity building in territorial development and resilience are also included in the scope of research concerns of this Thematic Line (e.g projects RURATION, DIMAT/SIGA, Politécnico). There is space for further reinforcement of synergy and scientific cooperation within this Thematic Line along 2019. Expected outputs include working papers, book chapters, papers in scientific peer-reviewed journals and submission of projects. The organization of international conferences and seminars (e.g European Transnational Cooperation - International Conference, at ISCTE) or the collaboration in the organization in international conferences leading to international publications (e.g "Monstrous Ontologies") is also an important streamline under this thematic line.

3.2.6. Urban Morphology and Sustainability (Morfologia Urbana e Sustentabilidade) **(Coord: Teresa Marat-Mendes)**

This Thematic Line focuses on the analysis of urban morphology and the operational rationale and structuring of territorial and urban metabolisms, as well as the cross-cutting theme of sustainability. Given the interdisciplinary vocation of the urban metabolism term, this should be used as a concept to bridge perspectives and build collaborations across different strands of research on environment, territory and cities. Both urban and rural realities are assumed as a strategic dynamic and transversal factor for the development of the territories of the future.

Four research programmes are defined in the scope of this Thematic Line for the current period:

- A. Urban morphology and the form of the human Habitats;
- B. Urban metabolism, environment and sustainability;
- C. Technologies and modernization of the Habitat;
- D. Food supply, short circuits, food quality and security.

The main scientific objectives of this Thematic Line are:

- i) to understand the evolution of the urban metabolism and its relation with sustainability challenges;
- ii) to understand the management of uses and land property in rural and urban areas;

- iii) to promote interdisciplinary methodological approaches concerning urban form analysis and prescription;
- iv) to help the management of environmental risks and natural resources;
- v) to explore technological building issues and energy efficiency;
- vi) to enhance the knowledge and policy advisory tools concerning food security, food quality and food provision circuits, and their relationship with rural development policies.

The main activities that are expected to take place in 2019 are related to the development of the SPLACH project and the preparation of new research proposals and seminars on sustainability thematic, as well as the development of several individual projects that are ongoing under this TL. Several publications are being prepared, as well as the presentation of seminars. Two post-doc and three young researchers will be integrated in this line, which will contribute to reinforce the number of researchers and publications. Current PhD works are being developed within this Thematic Line, related to issues of urban food landscape, sustainability, changes of living and urban form. The discussion is also expected to expand and increase contributions of this TL among DINÂMIA'CET-IUL researchers. Two summer schools are programmed to be developed (in collaboration with other entities) in 2019 under this TL' thematic: "Technopolitics in Urban Regeneration: Co-creating Public Spaces" (international conference + summer school)

3.3. GOVERNANCE, ECONOMY AND CITIZENRY (GEC)

DESCRIPTION

This Group centres its research on the modes of regulation and governance, encompassing state's intervention, markets and forms of collective action, in the context of Europeanization and globalization trends. It is assumed that, in addition to the means used by governments to guarantee the rule of law and to promote public policies, new forms of public and private regulation are becoming increasingly relevant, based on co-operation, self-regulation and mobilization of social actors. Both formal modes and processes of regulation, including the legislative procedure, as well as "soft" law-making, and informal modes of social and economic (market) regulation, are studied, with special attention to their impact on the citizens' individual rights and capacity of action, which they can promote or hinder. Among the domains under scrutiny are environmental and public health risks, ICT, financial markets, social policies.

This Group also provides a framework for research on science communication and public engagement, as well as on the role and social responsibility of science and its actors, including researchers and research institutions, all of them actually increasingly asked to participate in regulatory processes. This is in line with the Centre's strategic objective to promote the self-reflexivity of its researchers in order to better serve society. Economics has been especially concerned by this endeavour, but other scientific disciplines of relevance to the Centre – namely architecture and law – started similar lines of work.

Taking advantage of inputs from economics, jurisprudence, sociology, political science, architecture, and computer science, this Research Group's thematic lines follow up from this backdrop, sustained by work developed in recent years at the Centre under projects BECOM, Value Isobars, Protect, Risks of S&T in the era of social networks, FESSUD, MORE-PE, OPEN-EC and RECON.

THEMATIC LINES

3.3.1. Human Rights, Markets and Governance Challenges (Direitos Humanos, Mercados e Desafios da Governação) (Coord: Ana Costa)

Research has focused on the role and impact of the financial system in contemporary societies, specifically on economic performance, income distribution, environmental sustainability, and on regulation of financial systems. Research has also been devoted to the analysis of the crisis narratives which have prevailed during the Portuguese "adjustment programme" both in the design of austerity policies and in their public discussion in the media.

Ongoing research, to be pursued in 2019, addresses the questions about the relationship between two domains of creation of economic knowledge - the academia and the public sphere engaging

economists as experts from organizations, such as the Bank of Portugal, and about the dominance of certain economic ideas and the underlying mechanisms justifying such dominance. The research will be developed in the context of the role of the Bank of Portugal in the process of financialization of the Portuguese economy under EU membership.

An additional research stream centres on regulatory challenges raised by technological developments with a focus on Information and Communications Technologies. Seemingly, big data technologies, the Internet of Things and related developments are bringing up new instances of the so-called "law-technology lag". Ongoing research, to be pursued in 2019, discusses the extent to which the reform of the data protection regimes in the EU (entered into force in 2018) is up to the challenges brought about by technological progresses and their implications on the protection of fundamental human rights, namely the right to personal data protection and privacy, and freedoms generally.

The main scientific objectives of this Thematic Line are:

- A) To participate in the production of knowledge about the impacts of financialization to the Portuguese economy and society;
- B) To critically analyze how European citizens have been exercising their political and social rights in the wake of the economic crisis;
- C) To shape concepts for debating the impact of economic discourses, in particular, in relation to crisis and its relationship to the support of certain economic policies;
- D) To provide researchers and political actors with tools appropriate to analyze the impacts of public policies and the changes of the institutional architecture;
- E) To critically analyze how European law and regulation is addressing the risks to human rights arising from digital technologies' applications.

3.3.2. Reflexivity, Communication, and Social Responsibility of Science (Reflexividade, Comunicação e Responsabilidade Social da Ciência) (Coord: Pierre Guibentif)

In these times, priority will be given to the following topic: the renewal of economic thought, underpinned by the study and updating of economic theory and dialogue with other disciplines, namely economic sociology and law. In addition, we intend to foster reflection on the relation between strands of economic thought and analysis and the social responsibility of university research: to what extent does it make sense to talk of the neutrality of economic science?

An output of the activities of the TL should be the development, on the one hand, of training methodologies and scientific practices that understand training itself and research as "democratic experiences" that include forms of integration and communication of innovative knowledge and, on the other hand, of spaces of external communication that can feed more open and broader debates and, in so doing, rescue the original purpose of Academia.

In more general terms, the aim of our work could be formulated as follows: **Development of citizenship capabilities.**

To participate in the operations of our complex societies requires a high level of knowledge and the capacity to mobilize that knowledge in actual intervention. Scientific research contributes to the production of knowledge. But it also should engage:

(1) in its dissemination, through its own activities, as well as in cooperation with all kind of media (scientific communication), and

(2) in the improvement of its mobilization in actual intervention, in particular taking advantage of experiences, collected in the domain of scientific research itself, of the relationship between the roles of scientist – responsible for the production of accurate knowledge – and of citizen – co-responsible for the proper use of that knowledge (reflexivity and social responsibility).

We would like to give priority, in the near future, to research in these two domains, which results could inspire measures likely to strengthen the citizens' capabilities, taking into account the diversity of the frameworks of action. Indeed, there seems to be an urgent need for such measures, considering the signs of crisis of our political systems, as well as of rising populism.

The main scientific objectives of this Thematic Line are:

- A) To participate in the production of knowledge about the scientific world and its relationship to its environment;
- B) To take advantage in this reflexive exercise of recent developments in social theory;
- C) To contribute to the development of tools for evaluating the impact of scientific research;
- D) To shape concepts for debating politics of science;
- E) To provide individual researchers and research organizations with tools appropriate to analyze the contexts in which they operate, and to define their own line of action;
- F) Cross-cutting these different objectives: to pay particular attention to the relationship between specialists and non-specialists, as intersecting with other major societal divides.
