Executive Summary

- DINAMIA'CET (DC) consolidated a set of research subjects that represent societal challenges and have long been explored by its members. The research has centred around six major subjects and varying specific topics.
- Those similar subjects are being examined through specific and complementary theoretical and methodological options. This strategy allows a more comprehensive view of outcomes, and involves different DC research groups, within the integrated thematic lines.
- The internationalisation process was reinforced with the ERC Starting and Advanced Grants in progress. Additionally, a considerable number of international networks (117) and the countries involved illustrates the ability of DC researchers to diversify their geography and engage with foreign partners (notably Spain, France, United Kingdom, Italy, and many other countries). The consolidation of the team internationalisation process and of DC as host institution complete this cross-border research endeavour (e.g., 17 visiting researchers).
- Research at DC demonstrated strategic focus in 2024, with our portfolio carefully curated to address compelling economic, social, and territorial priorities. Our dynamic research ecosystem encompassed 46 active projects, including 17 newly launched initiatives bringing fresh perspectives to critical challenges. We successfully completed 29 projects, whose valuable insights continue to be shared with stakeholders and the broader community, extending their impact throughout the current year.
- 57 research project proposals were submitted to a variety of funding opportunities. The diversification of funding sources remains a strategic option and the data show that over 33% of project funding comes from FCT programmes, but 17% result from European Commission initiatives, 20% are contracted with municipalities and other national public sources, while the remaining 30% have different or self-funding sources.
- 69 scientific events and activities were planned under the six Research Pillars, organized and co-organized by DC.
- 278 publications were produced in 2024 by DC researchers, 60 of them indexed in WoS and/or Scopus. 10 Books and 69 book chapters are also included in these figures targeting wide audiences, especially in Portuguese language.



- The DC online journal, CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios (Q3 Scimago Journal Ranking for Urban Studies), has consolidated its submissions with a slight decrease in published articles due to its triennial timeline. The submissions covered diverse subjects, with special issues focusing on topical themes such as housing and a tribute to Vítor Matias Ferreira.
- The 2024 issue of *PASSAGENS* examined youth employment through spatial and social lenses. Featuring academic articles and portraits of young workers in Lisbon, it linked research and lived experience.
- The *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* continues to be supported by DC and also serving as source of outputs dissemination.
- The year of 2024 was marked by a greater proximity to society, albeit traditional research activities remained very active. 238 papers were presented in scientific events along the six research pillars, with special emphasis on international events (162).
- DC has consolidated two research structures which systematize information on relevant themes in Portuguese society. One structure is the Youth Employment Observatory (YEO), which has created a data repository on the youth labor market, notably youth unemployment, quality of youth employment, and youth employment policies. In 2024, the YEO re-launched its website, with an English version of every page and other new features. The YEO also continued to implement its protocol with the Portuguese public employment services (IEFP), publishing a second study that offers recommendations for priority measures to address the different situations of young people seeking employment, with particular emphasis on the most vulnerable groups. The launch of the study received significant media attention.
- A second research structure is the LXHabidata Platform, a database that continuously collects updated housing data for municipalities and parishes in the Lisbon Metropolitan Area. In 2024, in collaboration with six international partners, LXHabidata organized a Blended Intensive Program on Housing Solutions in 21st Century Cities, which included seven Open Lectures. This platform has also supported various initiatives, discussions, and media contributions related to housing issues.



1. Introduction

DINAMIA'CET is a research unit aiming for national distinctiveness through an inter and transdisciplinary approaches, developing expertise, and producing groundbreaking research with researchers from varying fields of education. The strategic goal is to advance knowledge and understanding of contemporary society in a context of digital transition and climate change. This goal involves exploring specific geographical features and relationships, gather and explore historical data, examine cultural contexts to raise innovative research questions and generate impactful findings that are relevant to the academic and non-academic context.

The year of 2024 was dedicated to prepare for the research unit (RU) international assessment (2018-2024), which involved gathering data on publications, grants, collaborations, and infrastructure to highlight its strengths and address potential concerns raised in previous assessments by the committee. The goal was not only to demonstrate the specificity, quality and the impact of the research developed so far but also articulate it with future vision. Therefore, the assessment process involved the definition key challenges and the major topics of research for the next period (2025-2029).

This activity called for the engagement of a task force with the board members, research group coordinators, and scientific committee members. This collaborative approach provided a comprehensive understanding of the inter and transdisciplinary research of the unit, facilitated the definition of innovative topics, and promoted discussion on complex issues that require diverse perspectives and expertise. Ultimately, the task force led to more effective and sustainable research agenda, which were translated into **six pillars**: ecological and digital transition; territorial cohesion; labour, regulation and inequalities; housing and urban dynamics; historical and postcolonial perspectives; and creativity and social change. These pillars comprise specific subjects that have been explored and will shape the research in the next years. Furthermore, the research pillars helped accommodating the integrated thematic lines that were until now useful to articulate different lines of research and research groups.

The organisational structure combines research groups and research pillars. While the former are stable and comprise members with strong scientific identity, the pillars intend to respond to societal challenges in different economic, social,



historical, cultural context. They are stable for a certain period, are flexible to accommodate new subjects, and might change after some time. Members of research group tend to work around the main pillars, interacting with each other and developing multidimensional research.

This 2024 report is structured around those pillars and illustrates significant outputs – projects, publications and others, serving as tangible evidence on the expertise of RU members on those broad societal challenges. We notice that the RU has past and ongoing work around the pillars, which provide a strong foundation for additional research, leading to a more comprehensive and profound grasp of the surrounding subjects.

2. Research

2.1. DINÂMIA'CET and its Scientific Identity and Research Agenda

DC – Centre for the Study of Socioeconomic Change and the Territory at Iscte – is a research unit that conducts both fundamental and applied research on emerging societal challenges, addressing the interrelated socioeconomic, cultural, and political dimensions that shape the issues under study.

Using interdisciplinary and transdisciplinary methodologies, DC adopts a problem-oriented approach to knowledge production that contributes to a deeper understanding of the complexities inherent in contemporary challenges and to the development of sustainable solutions. It considers the interplay between public and private actors across various domains and within public policy; operates at both analytical and normative levels; employs qualitative and quantitative methods; and draws on primary and secondary data to study

processes, drivers, patterns, impacts, and actions.

DC actively promotes the co-construction of knowledge and its transfer, fosters dialogue with policymakers, public administration, the private sector, and civil society, and formulates evidence-based policy recommendations to enhance well-being and ensure a just transition.

Research at DC is structured around six major pillars, each addressing critical contemporary societal challenges, as summarised on the following page.

DC is funded and evaluated by the Portuguese national science agency, Fundação para a Ciência e a Tecnologia (FCT), and was rated “Very Good” in its most recent evaluation.



1. Pillar 1: Ecological and digital transition

Focusing on socioeconomic and ecological impacts of climate change and the digital transition. These systemic and multidimensional transformations underpin contrasting effects upon the achievement of the objectives outlined by the Agenda 2030.

1. Pillar 2: Territorial Cohesion

Analysing regulation and governance in a situation of polycrises. The production of important and longlasting socioeconomic impacts combined with the expansion of financial markets, digitalisation, and war scenarios continue to challenge European welfare state regimes.

1. Pillar 3: Labour, Regulation and Inequalities

Addressing job quality, labour market solidarity and employment policies in times of spreading inequalities. Globalisation, digitalisation and flexibilisation policies implemented recently require study of the labour market risks facing young people, migrants, and women.

1. Pillar 4: Housing and Urban Dynamics

Considering housing dynamics and their socioeconomic and urban effects. The political response to the recent crisis in this area requires a comprehensive debate on new territorialities, habitat quality and forms of organising and producing public and domestic spaces.

1. Pillar 5: Historical and Postcolonial Perspectives

Looking into historical and post-colonial perspectives as cultural foundations for decoding the social production of space. Material and immaterial heritage underlies the debate on the ideological construction of the past.

1. Pillar 6: Creativity and Social Change

Examining cultural and creative ecosystems as manifestations of hybrid and marginal structures involving different forms of participation and the appropriation of public spheres. Co-construction of knowledge with cultural agents to explore challenges brought about by socio-cultural and demographic transformations in European territories.

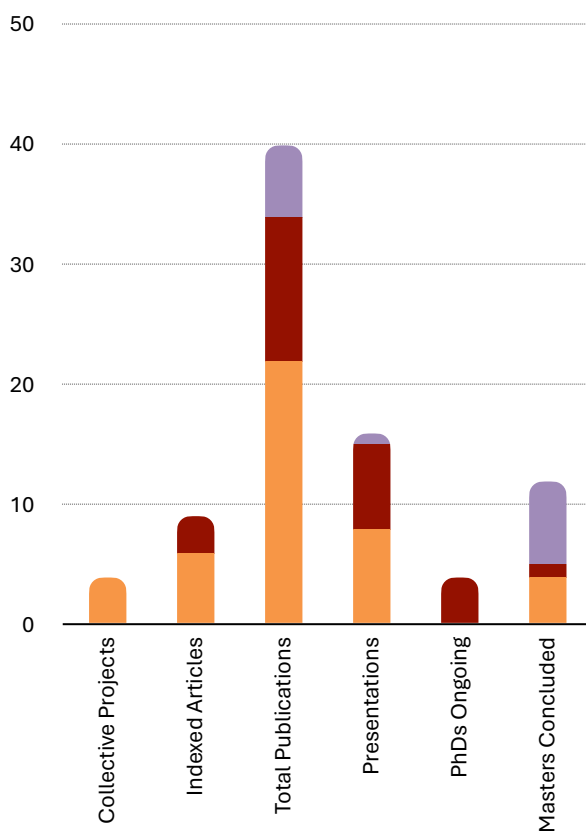

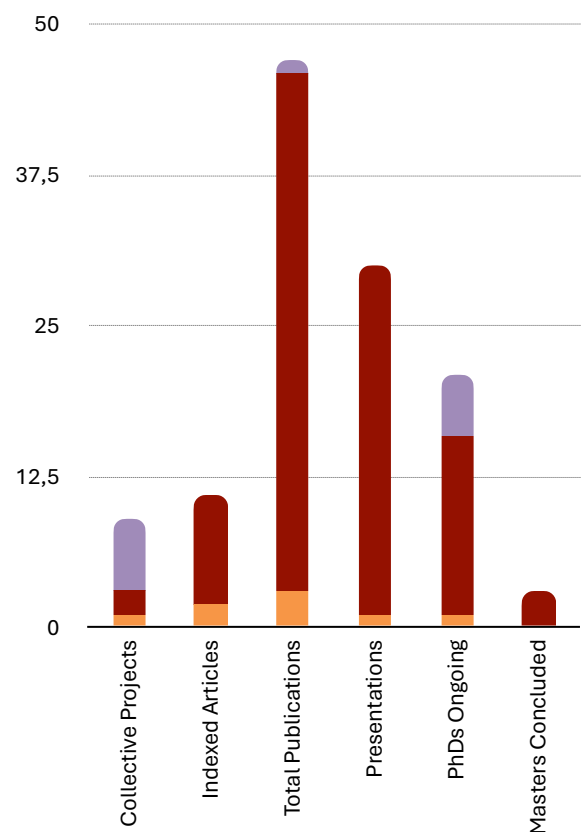

Chart 1. Main facts and outputs, by research pillar and research group (2024)

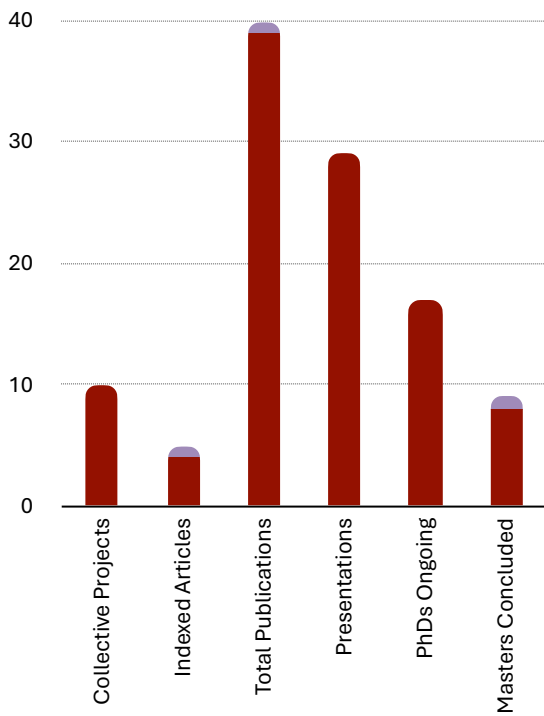

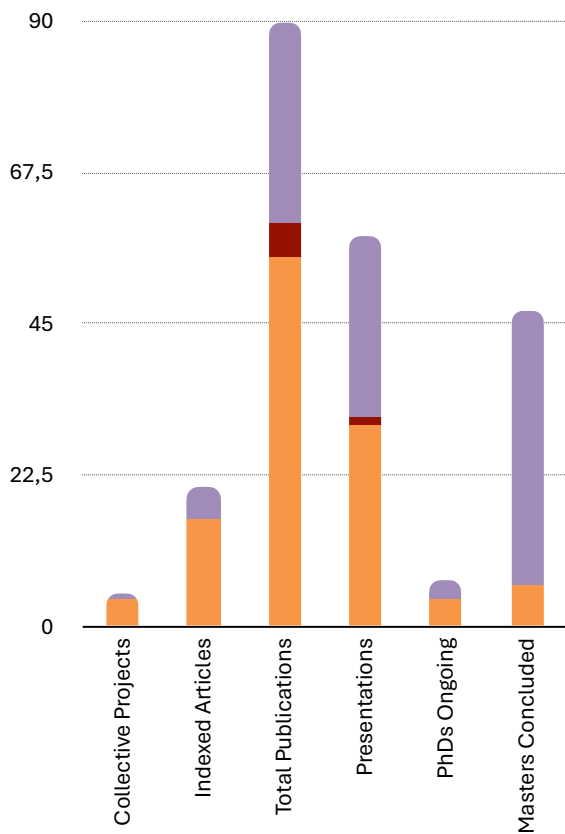

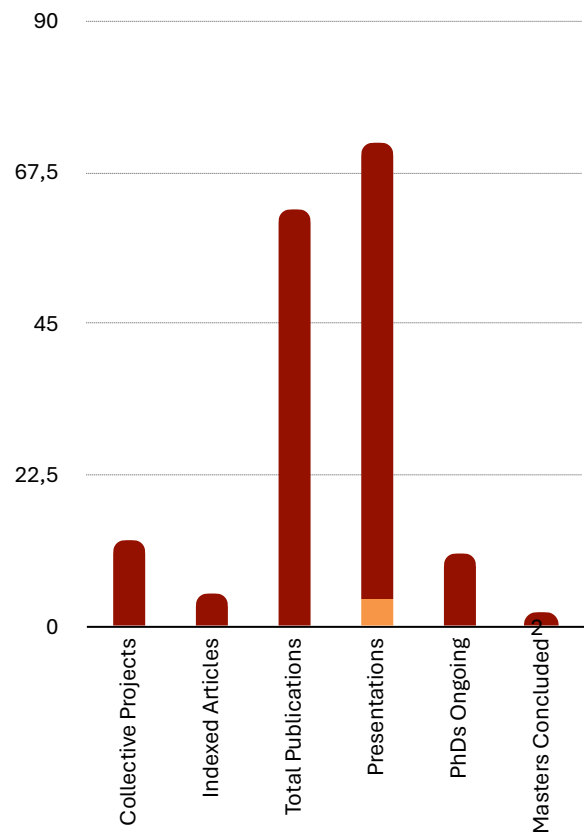

2.3. Research activities: applications, projects, funding, forfeited overheads

A total of 57 collective project applications were submitted during the year. Calls from the FCT accounted for 37% of all proposals. Together with successful applications from the previous year, this led to the launch of 17 new collective projects in 2024 (for further details, see Appendix 4).

Over the course of the year, 46 collective research projects—both funded and non-funded—were active, supported by a range of funding sources, and carried out under the coordination or active participation of DC researchers. Currently, 33% of collective research funding originates from

FCT programmes, 17% stems from European Commission initiatives, 20% is contracted with municipalities and other national public entities, and the remaining 30% derives from alternative or self-funding sources.

Chart 2 illustrates the thematic distribution of ongoing projects in 2024 across DC's six research pillars, with particular emphasis on Historical and Postcolonial Perspectives and Housing and Urban Dynamics.

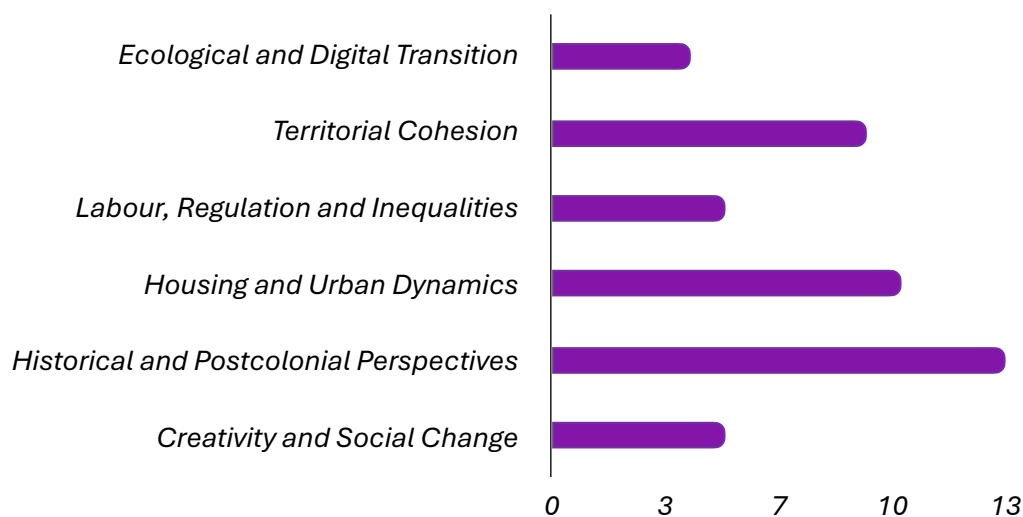


Chart 2. Collective projects major subjects (2024)

Funding sources' incentive to the professionalization of research unfolded in higher figures for individual project applications. The 7th edition of FCT's Stimulus of Scientific Employment resulted in 18 applications with DC as host institution. Along with the 4 successful applications to this programme and the 2 researchers supported by strategic and programmatic funding, DC reinforced a team of now 16 full-time PhD researchers (see appendix 5 for details). Indirect funding to junior researchers was also provided mainly by FCT, whose individual grant programme resulted in 7 successful applications stating DC as host institution. By the end of 2024, DC had 24 PhD students with FCT individual grants and an additional 3 with programmatic funding.

Chart 3 provides an overview of the submitted applications, with a significant increase in the funding requested in 2024.

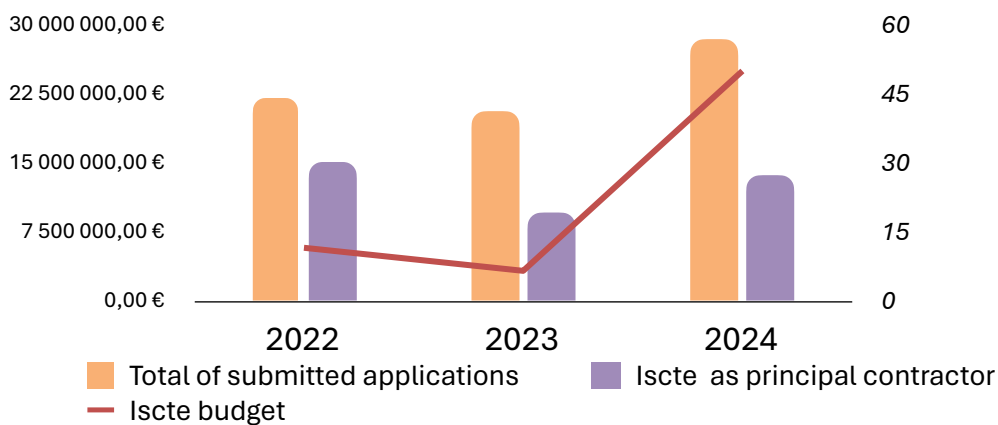


Chart 3. DC applications to collective projects

2.4. Research Results: Publication, Events, Networks, Articulation With Advanced Training

2.4.1. DC Publications

DC publishes two peer-reviewed academic series: the online journal *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios* and a Working Paper series. It is also actively involved in the editorial work of the *Portuguese Journal of Social Science* and the journal *Passagens*, in collaboration with the PhD programme in Architecture. These publishing activities are supported by a close network of partnerships with other national and international research units, public agencies, and civil society organisations.

CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios

The DC scientific journal *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios* (CCT) has broadened both the thematic and geographical scope of submissions to its general publication line. Recent special issues have focused on themes such as habitat design and housing as commons. In line with international and FCT open science policies, DC has progressively enhanced its visibility in open access platforms. *CIDADES, Comunidades e Territórios* was recently added to the Architecture category of Scopus, in addition to its previous indexing under Urban Studies, achieving a rising CiteScore of 0.5 in 2024. It is also indexed in Web of Science's SciELO Citation Index, SciELO and OpenEdition platforms, and the

Latindex Catalogue 2.0. The journal maintains its triannual publication schedule, while accepted articles are made available ahead of print, ensuring early dissemination of scientific findings. The average time from submission to publication decreased to 6 months in 2024, compared to nearly 9 months the previous year—a significant improvement and a positive indicator for prospective authors.

Chart 4 illustrates the consolidation of submissions to CCT, alongside a slight decrease in the number of published articles, attributable to the fixed triannual publishing schedule.

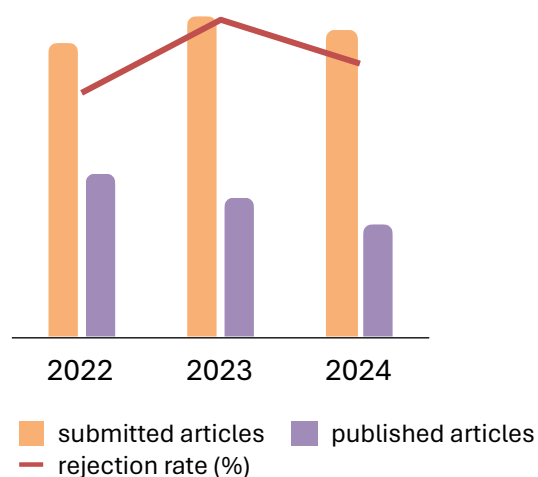


Chart 4. Submissions, publication and rejection rates at CCT (2022-2024)

PASSAGENS

The year 2024 was marked by the publication of the fourth issue of *PASSAGENS* journal. Directed by Paulo Tormenta Pinto, with Alexandra Saraiva and Patrícia Bento on the editorial board, the journal is published annually and aims to disseminate the transdisciplinary nature of research conducted at DC, engaging both academia and civil society in science communication. The fourth issue of *PASSAGENS*, entitled '*Observar o emprego jovem – espacialidades e contextos*' [*Observing Youth Employment – Spatialities and Contexts*'], was produced in collaboration with Paulo Marques, coordinator of the Iscte Youth Employment Observatory and a DC researcher. This edition brings together scholarly articles exploring youth unemployment, employment conditions, school-to-work transitions, and employment insecurity, authored by researchers from DC and other institutions. In addition, it also connects the theme of youth employment with urban dynamics through portraits of young professionals navigating diverse work environments across Lisbon.

In 2024, DC also contributed to the publication several books, like *As casas da revolução*, edited by Teresa Marat-Mendes, João Cunha Borges, Rui del Pino Fernandes, Sara Silva Lopes, and Jorge Afonso, and *Hestnes Ferreira Forma, Matéria, Luz* edited by Alexandra Saraiva, Patrícia Bento d'Almeida, and Paulo Tormenta Pinto.

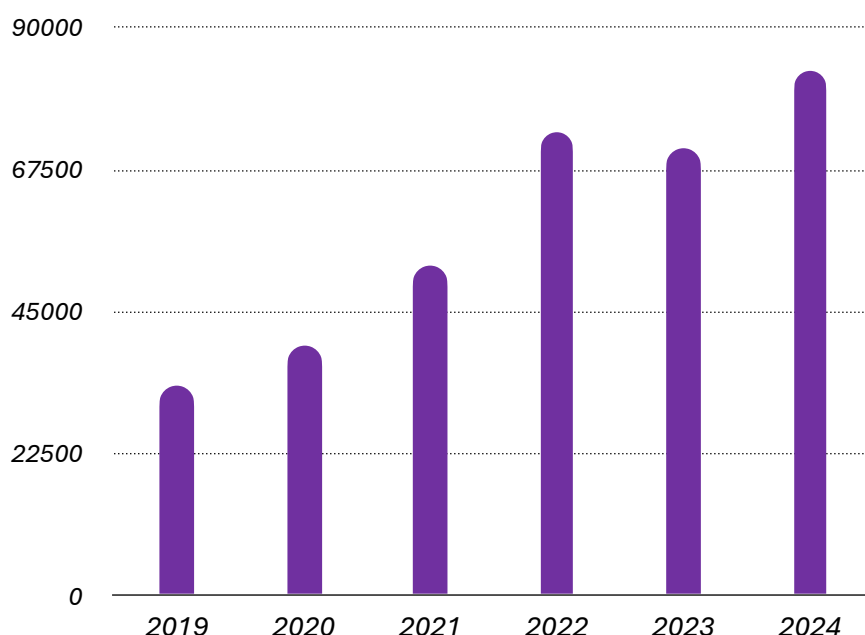


Chart 5. Iscte Repository: DC documents downloads per year

Advanced Training Programmes

The integration between advanced training and research continues to strengthen at DC, which currently coordinates two PhD programmes: *Political Economy, Urban Studies* (both jointly organised with other higher education institutions), In addition, DC is involved in the *Economics and Architecture of Contemporary Metropolitan Territories* PhD programme, offered at Iscte, and the recently approved programme in *Transitions to Sustainability*.

In 2024, a total of 66 PhD students were enrolled across these programmes, with 18 new admissions and 6 doctoral theses successfully defended. The supervision of doctoral research by DC's integrated researchers remained significant, with 22% of DC's PhD-holding members engaged in active supervision.

2.5. Main Social Impacts of DC Research in 2024

Social Impact and SDGs

The year 2024 marked a significant milestone in DC's evolving approach to social impact, as the Centre launched a collective and structured reflection on how research translates into tangible societal benefits. This critical process has led to the development of preliminary frameworks to systematically monitor and assess the Centre's social impact across multiple dimensions. While still in an early phase, this initiative reflects an important shift toward more deliberate and transparent impact evaluation, and reinforces DC's commitment to ensuring that research not only advances academic knowledge but also responds effectively to pressing societal challenges.

As part of this new framework, DC has initiated the mapping of its research activities against the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The following chart illustrate how our collective research projects and various types of scientific publications align with specific SDGs, thereby highlighting the Centre's contribution to global sustainability objectives.

This SDG mapping provides a structured lens through which to analyse DC's public engagement activities. As illustrated below through selected examples, our researchers actively translate their sustainability commitments into practical knowledge dissemination, including media appearances, public debates and exhibitions, participation in civic initiatives, and the creation of digital content.

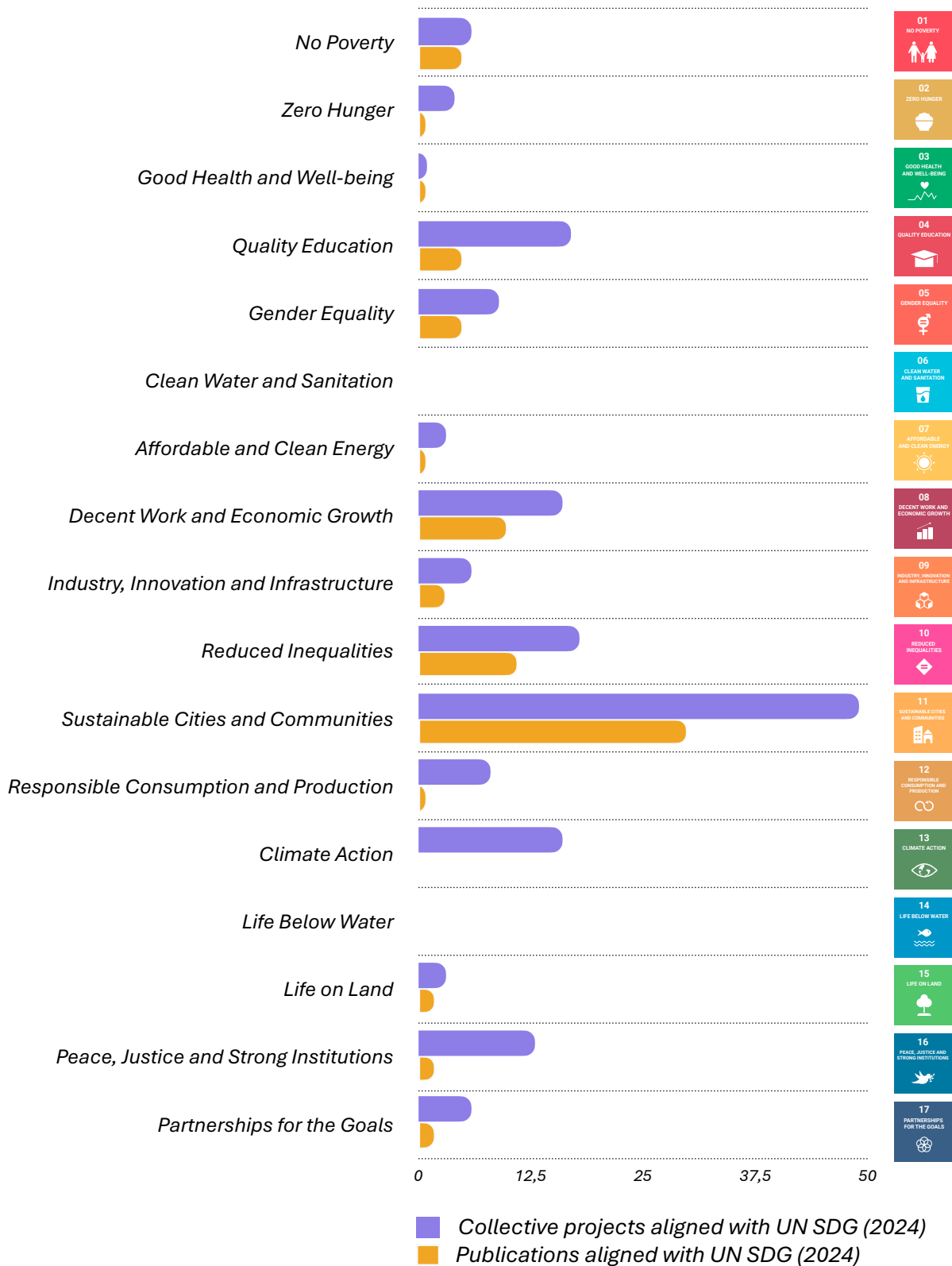


Chart 6. Alignment with SDGs (2024)

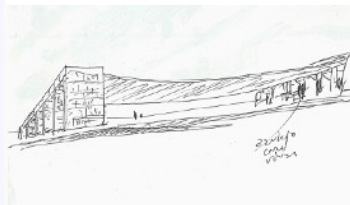

European Researchers' Night — Activity 'Arquitetura Aqui' at the School: Where did you go to Primary School?

In 2024, DC also participated in the European Researchers' Night with the activity *Architecture Here at the School: Where did you go to Primary School?*. The activity was coordinated by the researcher Ana Pascoal, as part of the project *ReARQ.IB – Built Environment Knowledge for Resilient, Sustainable Communities: Understanding Everyday Modern Architecture and Urban Design in the Iberian Peninsula (1939-1985)*.

The challenge to the public was to share their memories of an emblematic equipment, the primary school. The main aim was to encourage a conversation around the role of collective facilities built in the 20th century in the life of communities and to demonstrate the importance of citizen participation in academic research.



2.6. Internationalization

The strengthening of the internationalisation process was a key achievement in 2024. This process includes the continued development of two major European Research Council (ERC) projects coordinated by DC researchers:

- *ReARQ.IB – Built Environment Knowledge for Resilient, Sustainable Communities: Understanding Everyday Modern Architecture and Urban Design in the Iberian Peninsula (1939–1985)* – ERC Starting Grant (GA949686), coordinated by Ricardo Agarez;
- *ArchLabour – Architecture, Colonialism and Labour: The Role and Legacy of Mass Labour in the Design, Planning and Construction of Public Works in Former African Territories under Portuguese Colonial Rule* – ERC Grant (GA101096606), coordinated by Ana Vaz Milheiro.

DC's commitment to international research collaboration is also evident in the composition of its project teams and funding sources. Not only does 17% of DC's collective project funding originate from international sources (see Table 2), but 58% of all project partners are based in 24 different countries, as illustrated in the following chart.

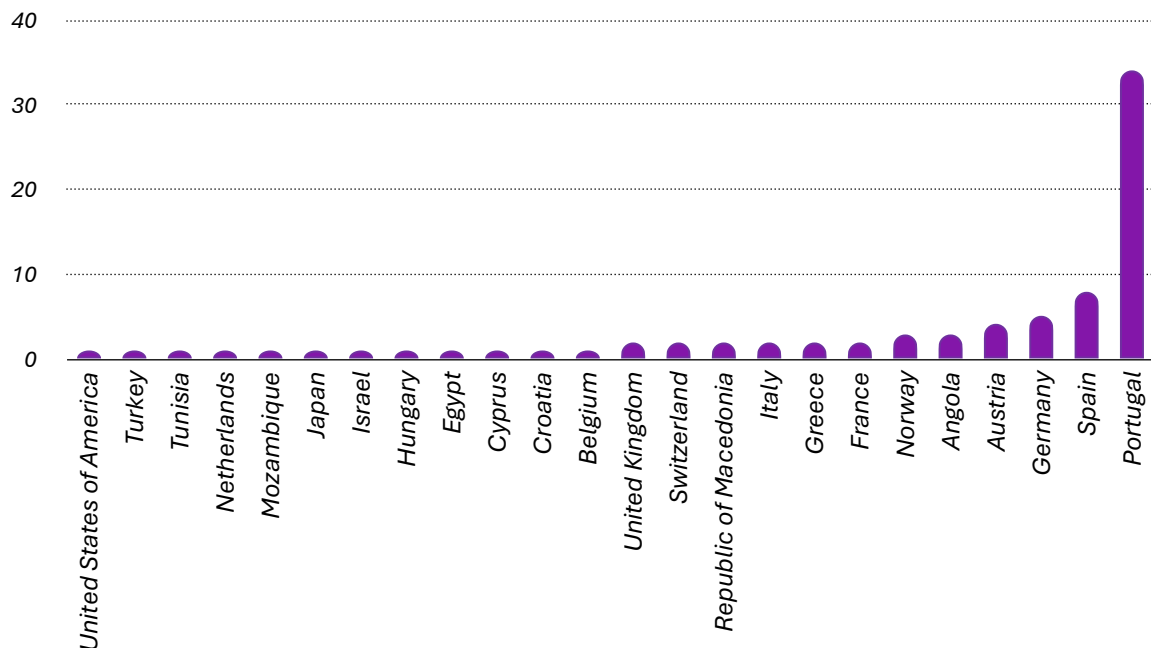


Chart 7. Collective research projects partners (countries) in 2024

The international impact of our research centre is further evidenced by the global reach of its publications in 2024. Download metrics show a geographically diverse readership, with users spanning 11 countries across four continents. The United States accounts for nearly two-thirds of all downloads (64%), indicating strong engagement with DC's research in North America.

While Portugal represents 11% of total downloads, it is particularly noteworthy that our publications also generated significant interest in Latvia (8%), the Philippines (4%), and Brazil (4%). The remaining downloads were distributed across the Russian Federation, China, Germany, Ireland, Singapore, and France.

This pattern of international readership reflects the global relevance of DC's research output and the centre's growing international visibility.

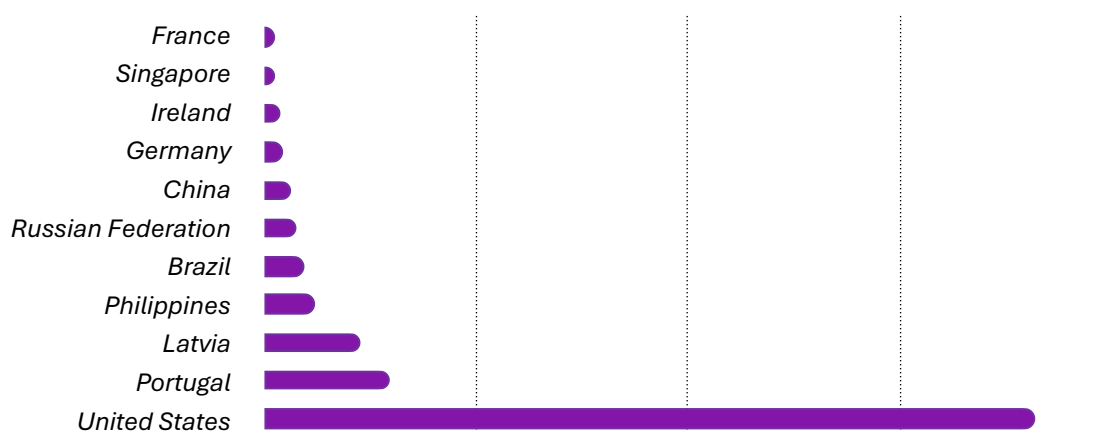


Chart 8 . Iscte Repository: Major countries where DC documents were downloaded in 2024 (%)

The internationalisation of research is also reflected in the geographic scope of publication venues. In 2024, 51% of DC researchers' publications appeared in international journals, conference proceedings, and other foreign platforms (see Chart 9).

Following the restrictions of recent years due to the Covid-19 pandemic, international conferences and academic events have once again become vital spaces for scientific exchange. In 2024, DC researchers presented 238 papers across 28 different countries (see Chart 10), underscoring the renewed vitality of international academic engagement.

Scientific debate is also actively fostered on-site at Iscte, through a diverse programme of national and international events hosted throughout the year. In total, 118 academic events were held at the institution, including seven international conferences (see *Highlights of the Year* for further details).

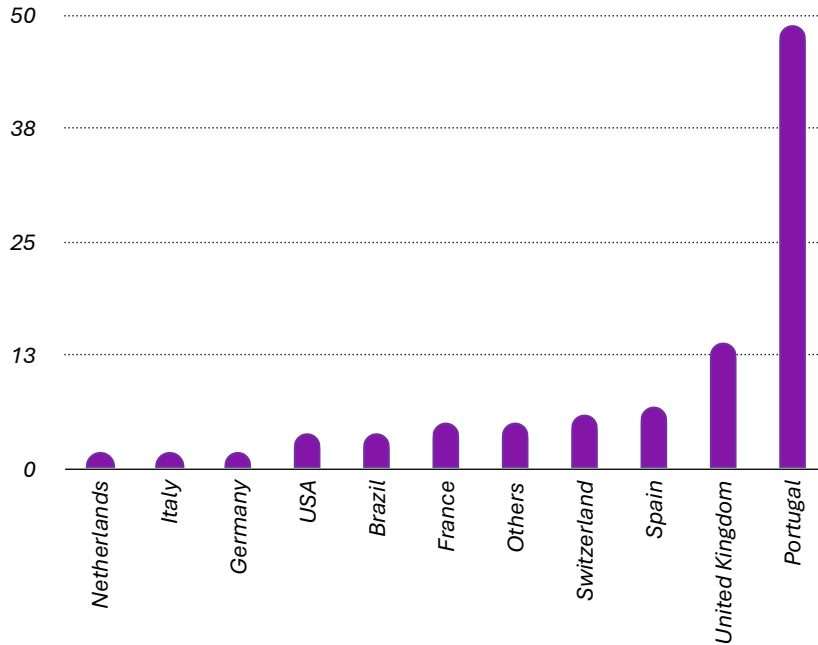


Chart 9. Countries where DC researchers published in 2024 (%)

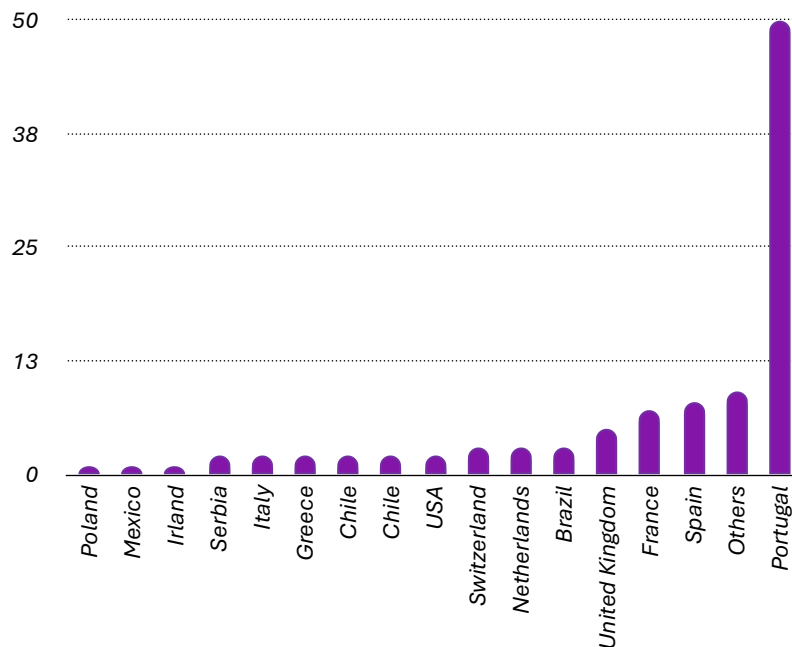


Chart 10. Countries where DC researchers presented papers in 2024 (%)

Another dimension of DC's internationalisation is reflected in the global reach of its journal, *Cidades, Comunidades e Territórios* (CCT). The articles published in 2024 reveal a notable diversity of authorship, with Portuguese researchers accounting for 48% of publications, followed by Brazil (25%), Colombia (10%), and further contributions from South Africa, Argentina, and several European countries.

Submission patterns indicate an even broader geographic engagement, with Brazilian scholars submitting the highest proportion of articles (44%), followed by Portuguese researchers (20%). This creates an interesting dynamic in which Brazilian submissions dominate the pipeline, while Portuguese authors represent the largest share of accepted publications—highlighting CCT's strong visibility and resonance in Brazil, while retaining its academic grounding in Portugal. Submissions and contributions from across Europe, Latin

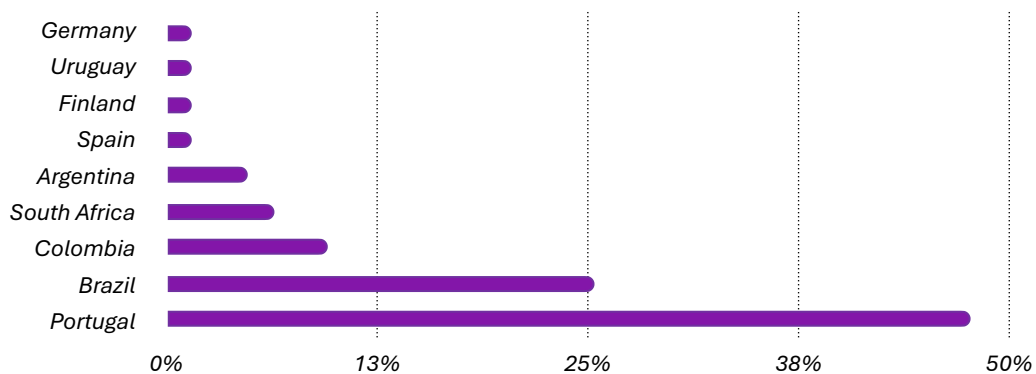


Chart 11. Countries of Origin for Authors Published in CTT in 2024 (%)

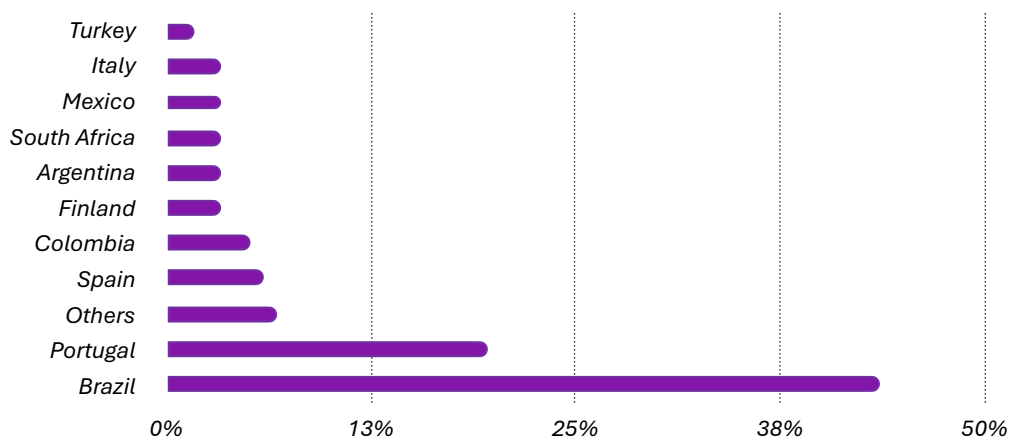


Chart 12. Countries of Origin for Authors Who Submitted Articles to CTT in 2024 (%)



America, Africa, and Turkey further illustrate the journal's growing global influence in the fields of urban and territorial studies, as shown below.

These figures are both the result and drivers of the numerous international networks sustained by DC researchers, as illustrated below.



In 2024, DC significantly expanded its international collaborations through a strengthened visiting researcher programme. A total of 17 international scholars were welcomed, actively contributing to ongoing research and fostering academic exchange. The majority of these visiting researchers came from Brazil (10), reflecting DC's longstanding and robust partnerships with Brazilian academic institutions. Southern Europe was also well represented, with three visiting researchers from Italy and three from Spain, while Central European collaboration was extended through the visit of a researcher from Slovakia.

This incoming mobility was complemented by a dynamic programme of outgoing research stays. In 2024, 12 DC researchers conducted part of their work abroad, with most engaging in short-term scientific missions. Notably, five researchers undertook extended mobility periods of 5 to 12 months, enabling more profound collaborations and substantive knowledge exchange.

The geographic scope of these international engagements spanned eight countries across three continents:

- *Europe*: Spain, France, Germany, Greece, Denmark, and Norway
- *Africa*: Cape Verde
- *Asia*: China

These bidirectional collaborations—welcoming international scholars and supporting DC researchers abroad—have significantly enriched the Centre's research capacity, stimulated mutual learning, and contributed to the formation of global research networks that are expected to result in new joint projects, co-authored publications, and long-term partnerships.

2.7. Youth Employment Observatory and LXHabidata

Youth Employment Observatory

The Youth Employment Observatory (YEO) was established in 2021 and is coordinated by Professor Fátima Suleman and Professor Paulo Marques. It operates within DC and is funded by the Portuguese Foundation for Science and Technology (FCT). YEO aims to develop a dedicated repository of research and resources focused exclusively on the youth labour market, drawing on the synergies and collaborative potential among DC's projects related to labour studies.

The Observatory concentrates on three key areas of analysis: youth unemployment, the quality of youth employment, and labour market policies targeting young people. Its core objective is to produce socially impactful publications, such as research reports and policy briefs, and to provide regularly updated key data for policymakers and the broader public.

In 2024, this objective was pursued through the following key initiative:

IEFP Second Report

In July, the second study developed in partnership between YEO and IEFP (the Portuguese Institute for Employment and Vocational Training) was published under the title *Who Are the Young People Looking for a Job Through IEFP?*.

The report analyses both employed and unemployed young people who used IEFP's public employment services between March and June 2023. It provides policy recommendations to address the diverse needs of young job seekers, with particular attention to the most vulnerable groups. The report attracted wide media coverage, reinforcing YEO's visibility and the public relevance of its research.

Mass Higher Education and the Changing Labour Market for Graduates

Edited by Fátima Suleman (co-coordinator of YEO) and Pedro Videira (YEO researcher), this book explores the implications of expanded higher education on graduate employment trajectories, contributing to a broader understanding of youth transitions in the labour market.

Articles in the 4th Issue of PASSAGENS

The fourth issue of the journal *PASSAGENS* was dedicated to the theme “Observing Youth Employment: Spatialities and Contexts”, developed in close collaboration with Paulo Marques (co-coordinator of YEO).

Young People and the Labour Market in Portugal

- “*Multiple Jobs Among Young Workers in Portugal*” – both authored by Fátima Suleman and Ricardo Barradas

Policy Brief on Collective Bargaining

Authored by André Pinto, the policy brief “*Collective Bargaining and the Debate Around Precarity of Contractual Relations*” was published on the YEO website, offering critical reflections and recommendations regarding the regulation of work contracts affecting youth.

Regulation of Fixed-Term Contracts

An academic article titled “*The Politics of Pro-Outsider Labour Market Reforms: A Configurational Study*” was published in *Comparative European Politics*. The paper, authored by Paulo Marques, Rui Branco, and Rita Guimarães, examines the policy conditions that allow for greater protection of fixed-term contract workers, a group that includes a large share of young employees in Portugal.

Re-launch of the YEO Website

The updated YEO website now includes a full English-language version, a dedicated section showcasing academic research conducted by the team on youth labour market issues, and several new features aimed at improving public access and usability.

LxHabidata

LXHabidata is a DC-led project and platform developed in the aftermath of the conference “*Lisbon, Which Future?*”, held at Iscte in April 2017, which addressed the sharp rise in housing prices, the tourism boom, and the expansion of short-term rentals. Coordinated by researchers Sandra Marques Pereira and Madalena Matos, LXHabidata provides a continuously updated housing data platform covering all municipalities and parishes of the Lisbon Metropolitan Area. It is designed to serve citizens, public policymakers, researchers, practitioners, housing promoters, and all those engaged in housing-related matters.



Main Activities in 2024

Maintenance and Update of the LXHabidata Platform – Data Collection and Processing

Throughout 2024, LXHabidata undertook extensive data monitoring, processing, and visualisation activities. The research team regularly monitored official sources, including daily tracking of updates from national entities and extraction of datasets from authoritative sources such as RNAL and INE. The collected data was subjected to rigorous processing procedures, including cleaning, preparation, and structuring using Excel and dynamic pivot tables. The LXHabidata database was continuously updated, ensuring temporal consistency across key indicators. A significant methodological improvement in 2024 included the planned transition from the NUTS 2013 to the NUTS 2024 classification. Visualisation tools were enhanced via interactive dashboards published on Tableau Public, providing users with intuitive access to real-time data. Technical maintenance efforts included troubleshooting data connections, collaborating with IT support to resolve complex integration issues, maintaining robust database architecture, and managing the platform's back-office to ensure full functionality of interactive features.

Comparative Analysis Using Census Data (2011 vs. 2021)

LXHabidata conducted a comparative analysis of Census microdata and sociodemographic indicators, focusing on three distinct groups: Private tenants, Tenants of public housing entities, and Homeowners.

LXHabidata’s main outputs in 2024 included the completion of the Tenant Survey Report, which provided critical insights into residential experiences and challenges in the current housing market.

Additionally, LXHabidata reinforced its contribution to international academic discourse through key scholarly outputs, notably the peer-reviewed article: Pereira, S. M. (2024). *“Portuguese Reactions to the Housing Crisis: Is It Possible to Move from the Residualisation to Post-Neoliberalisation of Housing Policies?”* in *Critical Housing Analysis*. This publication examines Portugal’s policy responses to the housing crisis and explores prospects for more equitable and transformative housing frameworks. Together, these deliverables reflect the culmination of LXHabidata’s research and knowledge dissemination efforts over the course of the year.

3. The team

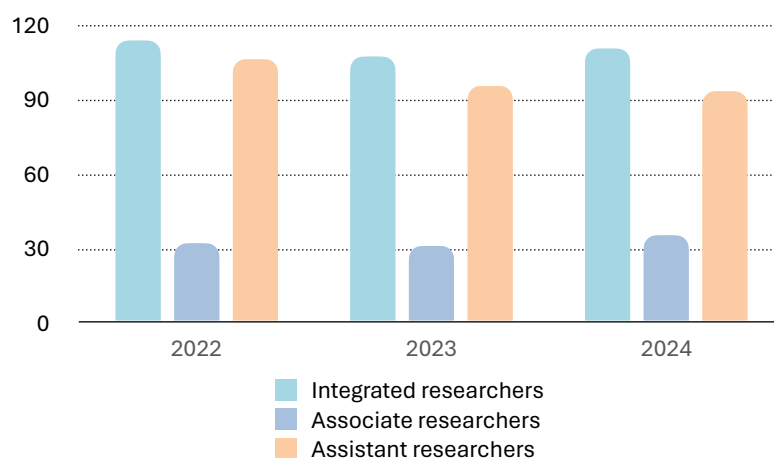


Chart 13. Researchers per category (2022-2024)

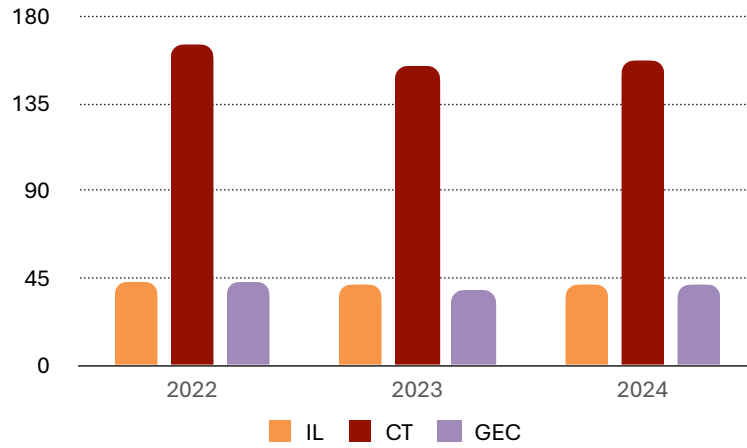


Chart 14. Researchers per RG (2022-2024)

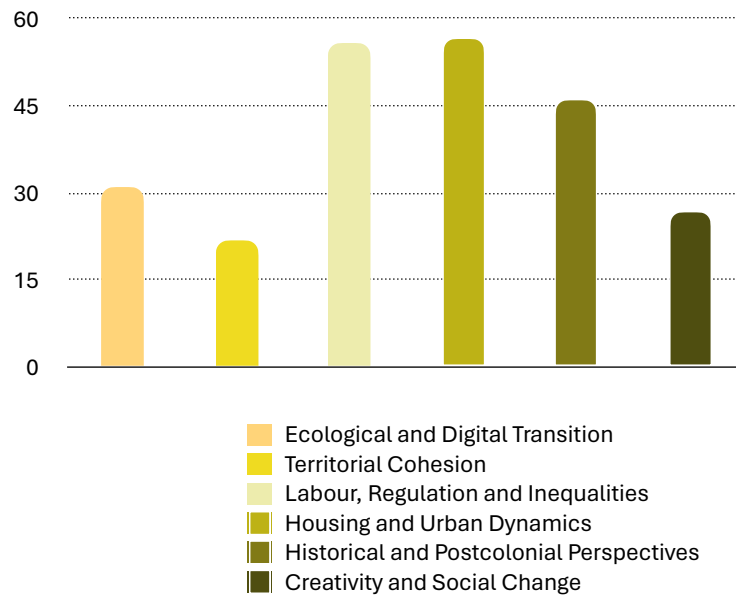


Chart 15. Researchers per main research pillar (2024)

A heterogenous team

Gender distribution within the team remains balanced, with women representing 54% and men 46% in 2024. DC benefits from a professionally diverse research team, bringing together varied academic and practical expertise.

Among our researchers, 25% also hold faculty positions at Iscte, contributing valuable academic perspectives and teaching experience to the Centre's activities. One-third (33%) of the team comprises full-time researchers fully dedicated to DC's projects and initiatives. The remaining 42% maintain additional professional affiliations, including industry collaborations, consultancy roles, and partnerships with other institutions, enriching DC's work through multidisciplinary knowledge and real-world applicability.

In terms of disciplinary background, architecture, economics/management, and sociology account for over two-thirds of our PhD researchers, based on their most recent academic degree. Architecture is particularly prominent among integrated researchers without a PhD, reflecting their initial academic training and the high proportion of PhD students in architectural programmes within our team (see Appendix 6).

Chart 17. Integrated researchers by employment link (2024)

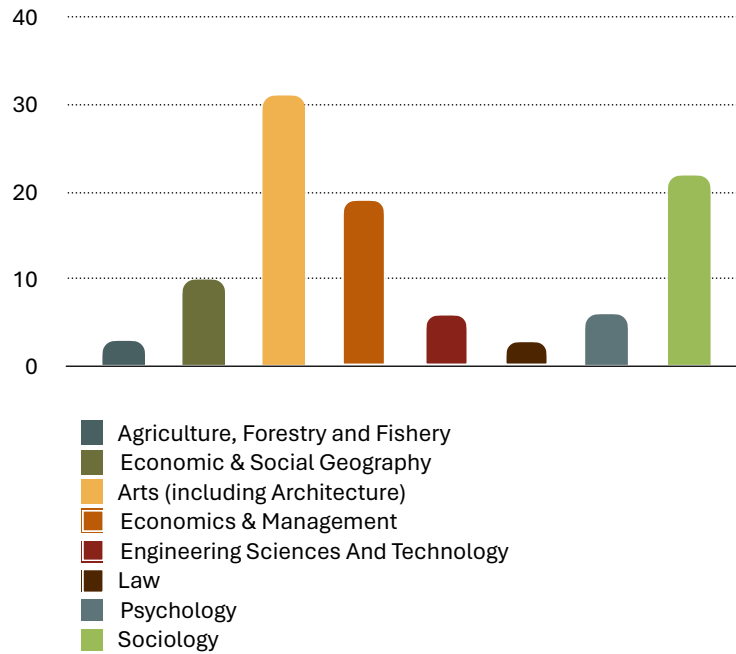


Chart 18. Integrated researchers' scientific domain (2024)

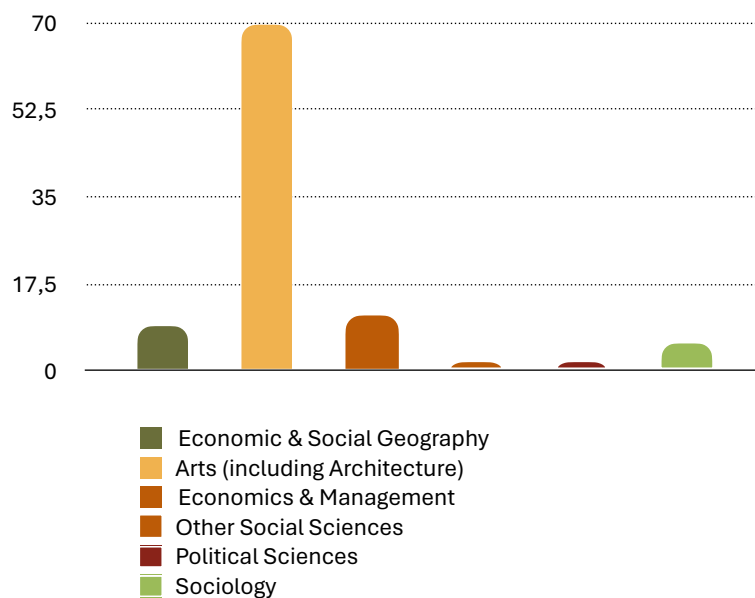


Chart 19. Assistant researchers' scientific domain (2024)

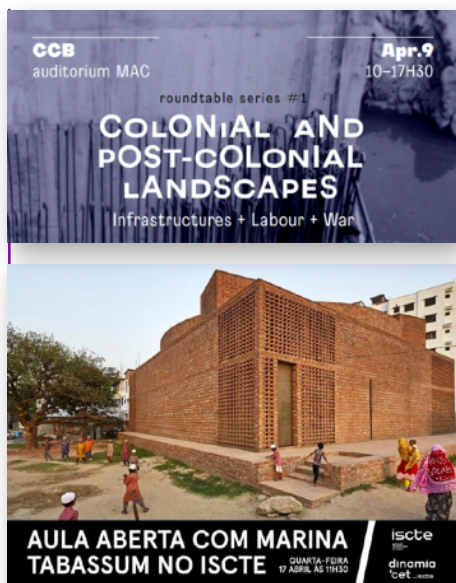

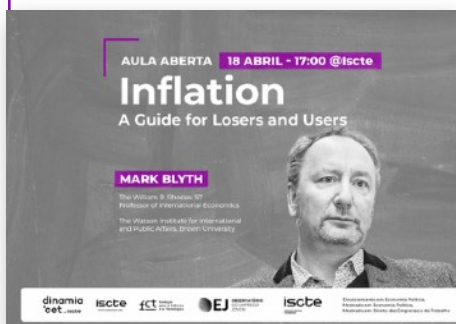

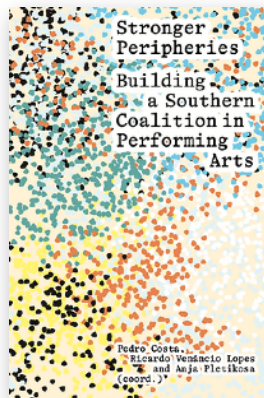
